Managers Moment

Regarding lawn care, it is important to clarify what the responsibilities are for the lawn mowing company versus the residents. The prospectus states that we will cover mowing only. Although the mowers do a light trim in easily accessible areas, the resident is responsible for edging and maintaining a manicured appearance. (Picking up and disposing of fallen branches, removing dead or deceased plants)

Due to liability issues, the mower tea will blow off the open areas of driveways but are not required to blow out the entire carport.

An ongoing problem is the dumpsters. Tenants are throwing their garbage on top of full dumpsters or laying it on the ground beside or behind the dumpsters, also putting unflattened boxes in the smaller dumpster which is for household garbage only! I went through the garbage in August and got the names of residents that did so and sent them a violation, which will also happen in the future incidents. The second time will be a fine. The city of Largo takes this very seriously and so does management. The smaller dumpsters are emptied on Monday, Wednesday and Fridays, so please be patient and don't pack on top or on the ground. Remember to flatten your boxes and place in large dumpster.

Rehabbing:

If you have a contractor rehabbing your home they are responsible for taking the building material and dumping out of the park.

Smoking and Drinking at the Pool:

There is a designated smoking area outside the pool on the benches, if you smoke that is where you are required to smoke and there only.

Also, cigar smoking is offensive to most people and is strictly prohibited at the pool. Violators will lose their pool privileges to the pool. Every week the pool cleaning company was finding butts in the filters, clogging them up and leading to down time on the pumps which means the pool is closed until repairs are made.

Per the health department and code enforcement, drinking alcohol at a public pool is strictly prohibited. NO GLASS OR CANS OF ALCOHOL ARE PERMITTED. The health department will shut down the pool if we find bottles in the trash, we will be forced to shut down the pool as well.

Bottom line is this is a community which means that the amenities are for everyone. Please be considerate of your neighbors and follow these simple rules so that everyone can enjoy a day by the pool. Thank you.

Attention must go to the air hose at the back of the clubhouse. It gets run over because residents fail to reel it back on the bracket and we have to replace. If this keeps happening, we will not be able to provide this service anymore.

PETS:

A few things about pets. I want to point out there are no questions about your responsibility as a pet owner. Keeping a pet on the property is a privilege and not a right as such, the following rules must be adhered to or we will have no choice but to remove your pet from the property. These rules apply whether the animal is a household pet, Emotional Support Animal, or a Service Animal.

All animals must be reregistered with the office and will need all required documentation for any ESA'S or Service Animals.

Dogs are to be always on leashes and the handler must always maintain control of their animal, not letting up or jump on people or other animals.









You MUST pick up after your pet goes to the bathroom and must be walked in pet section which is the perimeter of the park. Please be courteous and pick up after your animal.

Please don't feed stray cats. This cause problems and we have someone in the park (Barbara Lehman) that will help trap the cats.

SPEEDING:

There are WAY too many people driving way too fast in our park.

'I consider this a serious NO-NO because we have a lot of residents riding their bikes or strolling through the neighborhood and may of them use walkers or scooters/wheelchairs and can't move quick enough to avoid an



accident. The speed limit is 15 MPH. Remind your guests of this also. If you see someone driving to fast, get their license plate number so they can be reported to the office. If it is a visitor, they can lose the privilege of coming into the park. I think this is very important and so should you Let us work together to get this problem fixed.

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

As anyone else noticed a lot of new words lately? Emoji, meme, click bait, catfishing, ghosted, cancel culture, glamping and many more. MANY more. Language does change. New words just appear when something in the world changes. So it's not surprising that some of the words in my list relate to computers. 



About the Smiley Face:



During the 18th century, single ladies devised Halloween traditions that were supposed to help them find their romantic match. According to <u>History.com</u>, women used to throw apple peels over their shoulder, hoping to see their future husband's initials in the pattern when they landed. When they bobbed for apples at parties, the winner would supposedly marry first. Most spookily, they even used to stand in a dark room, holding a candle in front of a mirror to look for their future husband's face to appear in the glass.

Sugar rationing during World War II halted trick-or-treating.

Because of the shortage of sweet stuff, trick-or-treating wasn't as big of a thing during WWII. After the rationing ended, it was all systems go on the candy-collecting front. <u>Candy companies</u> began launching advertising campaigns to cash in on the ritual and make sure kids were clamoring for their products to show up in their candy buckets and spare pillowcases.

Illinois produces up to five times more pumpkins than any other state.

Candy corn was originally called "chicken feed."

The Goelitz Confectionery Company originally sold the polarizing treat in boxes with a rooster on the front in order to appeal to America's agricultural roots, according to <u>National</u> <u>Geographic</u>. The sugary recipe has gone largely unchanged since the 1880s. Love 'em or hate 'em, you can't argue with that kind of consistency.

The Michael Myers mask in Halloween has a fascinating backstory.

The famous horror movie villain comes from surprisingly innocent roots. When shooting the original 1978 film, production designer Tommy Lee Wallace picked up two masks from a Hollywood Boulevard magic shop: a clown mask and William Shatner as Captain Kirk in Star Trek.

"Tommy came in with the clown mask on, and we went, 'Ooh, that's kind of scary.' Then he put on the Shatner mask, and we stopped dead and said, 'It's perfect,'" actor Nick Castle told the <u>New York Times</u>. They spray painted it white, made the eye holes bigger and the rest is spine-tingling history.

The city also has a curfew for everyone, so even those under 16 aren't allowed out after 8 p.m. on Halloween. The rules were instituted to curtail after-dark mischief, after a rash of pranks.

Harry Houdini died on Halloween in 1926.

The famous magician, illusionist and entertainer died from peritonitis caused by a ruptured appendix, according to <u>Biography.com</u>. However, as befits a man of mystery, multiple contradicting reports did surface at the time. Some say a band of angry Spiritualists poisoned him, others that it was a student punching him in the stomach (with his permission) that caused his appendix to burst.
