### From September/October 2022 City Scape the Safety Harbor bimonthly publication

**Tousehold Electronic Disposal Updates by:** Renee Cooper, Public Works Director Starting on October 1, 2022, there will be changes to Pinellas County's Department of Solid Waste (DSW)'s Household Electronics and Chemical Collection (HEC3) program. Household electronics will no longer be sent to a private recycler to be recycled but instead sent to the Pinellas County Solid Waste Disposal Complex (which includes the WTE Facility). Why the change? The majority of household electronics consist of hard plastic casings, which are more likely to be sent from a private recycler to a landfill. The primary recyclable material in household electronics are metals, which can be recovered at the Waste-toEnergy (WTE) Facility and then recycled as well as reducing the amount of plastics to the landfill. As of October 1, 2022, residential household electronics can be placed in the garbage on the scheduled garbage day. Large bulky electronics will count toward the 10 bulk item limit. DO NOT place any household electronics that have rechargeable (lithium) batteries in the garbage. These batteries can cause fires in garbage trucks and at the disposal facility. Batteries will still need to be disposed of at the HEC3 Facility or during the HEC3 Mobile collection events. For more information: pinellascounty.org/solidwaste/hec3/ changes.htm

## MAILBOXES Gene Arend

t the most recent Board of Directors meeting one item presented on the agenda was ownership, care & maintenance of the mailboxes. It was agreed on by the majority of directors in order to maintain uniformity, consistency of maintenance and presentation, the board will retain ownership for repair and maintenance of the mailboxes.

HOWEVER this does not mean if you or your neighbor knocks down, runs into, damages the mailbox we will replace it free of charge. We may provide the labor to maintain the box however we will assess you or the offending person for the cost of material and if necessary, a new mail box. Also, we need some volunteers, 2 or 3 able bodied individuals, to help when the need arises, to help install these mailboxes. The board has the tools but we don't always have the capability. 

In these times of international turmoil and political divisiveness, I am humbled how an act of God causing massive devastation can bring people together to help deal with their individual tragedy. The simple acts of kindness and giving demonstrate all that is good with humanity. We have seen how that has played out recently with hurricane Ian. While hurricane Ian was forecasted to strike the Tampa area, we avoided a bullet as the hurricane struck Southwest Florida. We have all seen the impact and like so many others from throughout the country, BC residents generously responded by volunteering and sending money and needed supplies to Southwest Florida. We have all heard "it could have been us" but even though it wasn't, our neighbors and friends have worked and will continue to make a difference to those who have lost so much.

As a result of quickly responding and contractor availability, water was restored in 24 hours. We will be working with insurance carriers to hopefully recoup costs. But restoration of the water is only part of the true story. While the Board made the Clubhouse available for water, bathroom and shower use, it was our community neighbors who really made the difference. Individuals across the street laid out hoses to draw water, others filled and distributed gallon jugs with water for drinking and offered bathroom use, one offered her home to anyone who wanted a hot shower. It was neighbor helping neighbor in a spirit of community that is so vital to our individual need to connect with others. It was inspiring to see.

Volunteering to help is what makes BC such a great place to live. Whether it is when a tragedy occurs like Ian, cleaning gutters for someone who can't, or sharing a pot luck at a Mingle, it is the single and often random acts of kindness and caring that help contribute to the quality of life we live. # Keeping you and our pool safe

Any people don't realize that a community association pool and spa like ours in Briar Creek is considered a 'public pool' subject to regulation by Chapter 514 of Florida Statutes. Chapter 64E-9 of the Florida Health Department (DOH)sets forth guidelines addressing the prevention of disease, sanitary nuisances, and accidents by which the health or safety of an individual(s) may be threatened or impaired. When we enter our pool area, many of the Statute's requirements are listed on our pool and spa signs. So while some of the requirements on our signs may seem silly or unneeded, not posting or addressing violations can lead to a DOH citation.

As a 55+ community with an aging population, safety of our residents is our primary. The safety aspect is not just limited to prohibiting diving, jumping, the potential for glass breaking and more. Equally important is the requirement to maintain proper chemical balances as well as provide and environment that minimizes the risk of infection by all of using proper sanitation procedures. For example, should fecal matter show up in our testing, we must follow Center for Disease Control procedures to protect our residents.





ARE YOUR GUTTERS DIRTY OR CLOGGED?

Rain Gutters & Downspouts Cleaned Roof Debris Blown Off Patios & Windows Rescreened



Here are some of the important sanitary measures that are posted on our signs and that we as well as our guests must take to help ensure our pool area is clean, sanitized and free of the potential for infection:

- 1. If you have an open wound such as a cut, bandage, skin rashes, athlete's foot, etc., don't go in the pool and expect the chlorine to protect you and others.
- 2. If you are experiencing an intestinal issue that may include an infectious disease, don't use the pool or spa.
- 3. Respiratory diseases such as colds, sinusitis, and septic sore throat can spread more readily in swimming areas as a result of close contact. Don't spread an infection and don't get infected by others.
- 4. Eye, ear, nose throat and skin infections, can spread more easily in water. Mucas from a cough may flow into ear and nasal passages.

The purpose of this reminder is not to scare us or discourage us from using the pool. The purpose is simply to help remind each of us of our vulnerability to disease and the responsibility each of us has to protect ourselves and our community.



People get nervous about trees after every hurricane. The answer to anxiety is NOT to cut down healthy trees. In many cases, a tree canopy can protect homes by breaking up strong winds.

The sad fact is, if a storm is strong enough to take down our mature trees, as happened farther south with Hurricane Ian, then homes will be damaged and destroyed as well. Removing trees will not prevent this!

The City of Safety Harbor protects trees, and this protection includes Briar Creek. Trees sometimes have to be removed for safety concerns or if a tree is unhealthy, but a permit is needed for native trees above a certain size. The web page above also includes a downloadable Tree Pruning Brochure about proper tree pruning, including how to trim palms. Most palms are trimmed incorrectly, even by "professional" companies.
