ello All,

There will be 3 openings for Board of Director positions coming up in February. Please consider running. It is imperative that we have a full Board to conduct the business of the Association.

Nomination information will be sent to each homeowner in December at the address currently on file with the Association.

A reminder - if you are returning from up north for the season, please ensure you have put a change of address in the box at the clubhouse.

This is the time of year when we have the most visitors. Our by-laws are very specific about how long a visitor can stay - no more than 30 days in a calendar year. If you are planning to lease out your unit, it must be for at least 3 months and a lease application is required to be submitted to the Association for approval at least 10 business days in advance of the start date.

Background checks are required before a lease is approved. It is the homeowner's responsibility as well to make sure visitors or renters are aware of and follow the rules and regulations of the Association. Your cooperation is appreciated.

The clubhouse can be booked for private use. There are request forms in the slot above the box in the clubhouse. Requests should be put in the box to be reviewed and approved by the Social Club and the Board.

It has been a busy fall in Blue Jay. The hurricane certainly made for an "interesting" time, and at the time of this writing we are still working through issues with Duke Energy so that we can begin to get things back to normal. Plans are underway to begin next year's projects, as we like to be finished before Board members begin heading up north for the summer.

We are lucky to have wonderful volunteers in our community. Thank you all for doing your part to keep our costs down and our park looking great!!!

On being a board member -

Have you ever considered becoming a member of the Board of Directors?? There are 5 positions that are elected in two year terms. One year there are 2 openings and the next, there are 3 openings. This is to ensure continuity and that the board is not fully brand new in a given year.

The positions are interesting and challenging and allow volunteers to use their skills for the good of the community. It is said that once you serve on the board, "there will be a special place in heaven for you" – If that is the case our current Board is looking forward to sainthood.

Board positions require substantial work, but it is entirely voluntary, no salary.

The job is not without challenges. You need to be able to work as a team, deal with contractors, respect and advocate for residents and make decisions for the good of the Association and not your personal viewpoint. Bottom line, you would be part of the team running the business of Blue Jay with a budget of about \$600,000 annually. It is a difficult job.

Nominations are requested in December and elections are held at the annual meeting in February. Once elected, the Directors choose the President and Vice President. Treasurer and Secretary are appointed positions and those members do not have to be on the board to serve.

So, just what does a board member do???

There are 5 scheduled board meetings in the year and the annual meeting. However, lots of work goes on outside of those meetings – with the help of the Management Company, there is an operations meeting every Monday morning with as many directors as are available and any resident that wants to attend. Projects are reviewed and status is given along with handling complaints and suggestions from homeowners. The Board is responsible to get and review quotes, select contractors and execute the projects in the budget, and supervise the contractors that are hired. The Board relies on volunteers to help with various projects and activities that need to be done to keep the community in good repair.

Board members are governed by the by-laws of the Association and the Florida Statutes.

Each Board Member must complete a Board Training session and be certified.



Tello Neighborhood Watch chairpersons,

Please remind your neighbors that scammers will pretend to be anyone for a payout. Please tell neighbors, friends and family that any business or agency requesting payments in gift cards or crypto currency that its' a SCAM.

Here's how the scam often works: You get a phone call, recorded message, or text with an offer to lower your monthly payments. The caller — or the person who picks up when you call the number they give you — says you need to "prepay" part of your bill to qualify. They tell you to pay using gift cards because they're partnering with a company for a promotion, and to call them back with the gift card number. Once you do, they collect that and other personal information over the phone.

If you get a call like this, here are a few things to know:

- □ Never give out your personal, account, or payment information to someone who contacts you out of the blue and demands it. Hang up. It's a scam.
- Don't trust caller ID. Scammers can fake caller ID so it shows a company's name or phone number. And never call back a number from a recorded message or listed in an unexpected email or text.
- □ Don't pay for anything with a gift card. Gift cards are for gifts. If anyone tells you to pay with a gift card, or to buy gift cards for anything other than a gift, it's a scam. You'll lose your money, and you won't be able to get it back.


