

ind out more about the natural setting of Briar Creek on our monthly bird walks on the first Friday of each month. Please join me on **Friday, December 2nd at 8:00 a.m.** for a 60-to-90-minute walk up and down our streets and out to the canal. We meet at the Phase 1 Clubhouse, wear sturdy walking shoes, and bring binoculars, if you have them.

On November 4th we had 10 participants and found 35 bird species including Limpkin, Eastern Bluebird, and great looks at an immature Red-shouldered Hawk.

Pool Renovations –

Gene Arend

ur pool renovation has begun. The plan calls for our pool to be out of service for 6 – 8 weeks. Pool Works has started the work on November 1st by removing all of the existing equipment. The pool area is a construction site so access had been restricted during the renovation. The pool was originally installed in the 1970's and the equipment has been maintained with Duct Tape, remanufactured parts, paper clips, and altered parts to keep the system running.

The heating and pumping system will be completely replaced with state-of-the-art equipment. Moving from the switching and manual maintenance to circuit boards and computer boards. This removes the need to manually manage the systems. The new system will monitor itself and make immediate adjustment as needed. The heaters are all being replaced. These include some Titanium parts so the life expectancy will likely last longer than us. There will be a heater for the Spa and now 3 units for the pool instead of the 2 previous heater / chiller units. There were a few times during the year when it required the two heaters to maintain the 84-degree pool temperature year-round and at times placed a strain both power and temperature on the pool requirements. Water cutoff values have also put in place, removing the need to disconnect the main water lines.

I will provide updates on the progress from a layman point of view every week or two. As of November 9th, all of the pumping and heating equipment has been removed. There is now a new power supply upgrade located behind the pool shed. The system will no longer share the power supply from the clubhouse which placed the equipment on the edge of overload and required occasional resetting of the circuit brakers. The heater/chiller units will all be place behind the pool shed as they use air to maintain the systems, moving us away from the geothermal system used previously. I have seen the equipment in action at another site and it is very quiet. The Pool Shed will add even another sound buffer. Therefore, the noise from the old system will make the noise from the new system almost undetectable.

he job is underway! The PoolWorks crew arrived on November 2 – almost two weeks ahead of the long-anticipated rescheduled date.

Be aware that the entire pool/patio area is off limits until the project is completed. The

door from the clubhouse to the pool area will be secured during construction.

Big round of applause to Gene Arend for managing the pool project. Read his update above.

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Phase 2 has extended their warm welcome to those of us who enjoy daily dips in the water. Water aerobics classes will be held; days and time may vary as we work together on an amicable schedule to accommodate all pool users in Briar Creek.

Keep in mind, their children's hours are specific to Phase 2 rules. Under 18 hours are 11:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. and between 5 and 8 p.m. Children under 15 must be accompanied by a resident adult. These are different from Phase 1.

The pool in Phase 2 has a smaller capacity. If you notice that your presence is exceeding the approved capacity, please be respectful to their kindness and leave so they can enjoy the pool.







THE HISTORY OF THE HONOR FLIGHT NETWORK

The Honor Flight Network was formed in 2005 by Jeff Miller and Earl Morse with a mission of honoring our nation's veterans by bringing them to Washington, DC to visit the memorials and monuments dedicated to their service and sacrifice. While originally focused on honoring our nation's World War II veterans, the Honor Flight Network now also honors those who served in the Korean War, Vietnam War, intermediary operations, and in special cases of terminal illness or injury, veterans from more recent service eras. Since its formation in 2005, the Honor Flight Network has taken more than 245,000 veterans to Washington D.C. Today, the Honor Flight Network is currently comprised of over 128 hubs throughout the country dedicated to carrying out the Honor Flight mission and the Network, as a whole, serves over 22,000 veterans each year.

Emotional Support Animal Reminder

Priar Creek II has a process where emotional support animals are allowed in the non-pet section, only after approval by the Board. The support animal must conform to the same restrictions as the Pet Section of the community.

We will need paperwork from a medical professional that states the following:

Verifies that you have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities.

Describes your need for a reasonable accommodation to keep a support animal in your home.

Shows the relationship between your disability and the need for the support animal.

An Emotional Support Animal certificate does not meet the above requirements.

After the accommodation is approved, the resident must provide a photo of the animal, proof of current immunizations and proper licensing by Pinellas County and again at each renewal/revaccination.

Please remember, the animal should be leashed and under your control at all times and not be allowed on private property of your neighbors. The animal should be walked in the Pet Section of Briar Creek II.

Common areas in the non-pet section are not to be used to walk your dogs. Remember to clean up after your pet and dispose of it properly. The animal should not create a nuisance or unreasonably disturb the peaceful enjoyment of the community.

If for some reason, you no longer have your support animal and wish to have another one, you must repeat the approval process from the Condo Board.

Please remember approval for an Emotional Support Animal needs to be completed prior to obtaining your animal.

REMINDERS:

Overnight Parking in the street is NOT allowed.

<u>Daytime Parking</u> – please **Park on ONE SIDE of the street** in your area. This will keep our streets open for Emergency Vehicles.

<u>Visitor Parking</u> is at the clubhouse on the side of the shuffleboard courts, (grassy area). Please put the VISITORS PASS in the front windshield. Residents who do not have the pass can contact a board member. Parking in an empty carport is NOT allowed without permission.

STOP at ALL STOP SIGNS, and our SPEED LIMIT is **15MPH**. Your help is greatly appreciated.

"FOR SALE" & "FOR RENT" Signs are restricted to "14" X 12" and may be posted inside a STREET SIDE window only of the mobile home unit. No other signs of any kind shall be displayed."



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

- Anyone who resides here must undergo a background check. This includes owners, renters, and anyone else who is living here, such as adult children helping out their parents.

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

So, in summary, I have golf balls available for those who need them at \$3 per dozen. This




The humane society and the Haven also don't accept sheets.

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




