

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays December, 2022



<u>Message Part I</u>

B oard of Director Elections are coming. We have scheduled "Meet the Candidates Night" for Friday, December 16th. This year we will be electing three (3) directors for a full three-year term and one (1) director for a two-year term.

I wanted to share some wisdom, not from me but from experts who tell us the qualities that make a great HOA Board Member. Here is a list of what I found.

- Enjoy volunteering.
- Are positive and optimistic.
- Exercise fairness.
- Have no special agenda and no axes to grind.
- Act and vote in the best interest of the entire park.
- Communicate openly with the rest of your board and the residents as a whole.
- Know that the rules apply to them, too.
- Take their role seriously and be a smart decision maker.
- Have a mind for business and budgeting.
- Understand that their authority comes as a board, not a board member.

The three primary functions of a community association board of director include maintaining common areas, managing budgets/fiscal responsibilities, and enforcing/ complying with governing documents.

Keep this in mind as you consider your vote.

<u>Message Part II</u>

Along with voting for new directors, you will also be voting on a number of proxy issues that I would like to briefly discuss. Two of these proxy issues have been submitted to you as the residents of Clearwater Cascade to protect us from outsiders interested in any attempt to buy our park.

Limit the Number of Membership Certificates that can be Owned: This proxy item if approved will limit the number of shares that an individual shareholder can attain going forward to two (2) shares. (Currently we have a few residents in our community with more than two and that person or persons will be grandfathered with his/her current number of shares.)

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Limit who can purchase an additional Membership Certificate going forward: The intent of this is that a person must first be a resident shareholder of Clearwater Cascade in order to purchase more than one share. If the one shown above passes, it would mean that going forward, a maximum of two (2) shares per shareholder could be owned.

These two proxy items go together and are on your ballot in order to safeguard any outside corporation from coming in to purchase houses with shares and turning the entire community into a leaseholder community where you will not have the importance of voting to determine our future together. Fellow residents, these are very important in these times. We know of other Mobile Home Parks (MHP) being bought out throughout Florida. Most recently, there was an attempt to do this with Ranchero Village, just a little north of us on Ulmerton. So please consider an affirmative response to these two proxy items.

Increase the share price from \$45,000 to \$55,000 effective March 1, 2023: A third proxy item that your Board has placed upon the ballot this year is to raise the share price from \$45,000 to \$55,000. The value of our community is continuing to go up. The resident owned MHP communities in the area are at least \$50,000 today. We raised the share price a few years ago, and new residents have continued to come and be a part of our community. The number of new homes within Clearwater Cascade is a testament to this. I want you to know that increasing the share price does not impact your personal property taxes. Those taxes only apply to your home; nor would the increased share price affect your ability to price your home if you wish to sell it in the future, except to possibly increase it.

In addition, there are also two regular/standard proxy items that you will be asked to vote upon:

<u>Use of Reserve Funds in a Disaster/Catastrophic Event</u>: In the event of a disaster/ catastrophic event, the Board of Directors would like to ensure sufficient funds to mitigate damage in an emergency situation. If approved by the membership and deemed appropriate by the Board, the use of all available funds, including reserves, will be utilized at the time of a loss. Use for the funds could include, but not be limited to, funding the insurance deductible, securing common property, etc.

<u>2023/2024 Budget Adoption</u>: Included the mailing you will receive later in December is the approved 2023/2024 budget. According to the governing documents, membership must adopt the budget.
