



fficer Bowling regarding Ranch Mobile's Break-ins and calls to the Largo police.



Statistics:

- Forty-seven calls have been made to the police this year.
- There have been five break-ins over the past month. Three of the break-ins have been in close proximity to each other. One was discovered that night and the other two the following morning. A K-9 was brought in to try to track the burglar but was unable to pick up a trail. In addition, a helicopter was dispatched to assist in the search.
- Part of the issue is that the break-ins are not being reported as they are occurring. However, if the home has cameras or a neighbor has cameras, the footage is being checked to see if the perpetrator is being recorded.
- One call received was to assist a resident.
- Eleven security checks were made.
- Two calls were received calling for officers to patrol the park.
- Twelve patrols came through the park on their own and logged in that they were driving around to patrol.
- There were ten calls made for suspicious activity within the park.

Prevention Measures:

- Neighbors Get to know your neighbors and let them know when you will be gone so that they are aware and can call if they see something that looks unusual.
- Outside lighting Have good lighting. LED lights give better directional lighting and is very inexpensive to have on even for extended periods of time. Focus lighting toward doors, windows, sheds and patios. You do not need an electrician to wire up a security light. They now have LED security lights that are run by solar power with motion detections capabilities for about \$35.
- Deadbolts If you have a window in the door, consider double tumbler so the window cannot be broken out to allow the deadbolt to be unlocked. If you use a double tumbler, be sure to keep a key in the inside lock while you are home in case of a fire. Remove the key when you will be away from home. Change the striker plate screws to be 3 inch aluminum so it goes further into the wood frame so the door cannot be kicked in.
- Slider doors Use any of these methods to lock out the door: Broomstick in bottom frame, commercial door locks or a hole that you can place a pin (long nail) through to lock the two panels together.
- Jalousie doors or windows Replace them with solid doors or slider/double hung windows with locks. Jalousie windows or doors are the easiest to break into because they only need to pry up the glass panel.
- Don't advertise you are gone to those passing through your park. No ropes across your driveway. Do not tie up your mailbox or put a note in it reminding mailperson not to deliver to your home.



- Ask your neighbors or friends to park in your driveway once in a while to make it look like someone is living there.
- Start an evening routine Pick a time after you know you will not be going out such as 9:00 P.M. to do a double check:
 - » if the shed and car doors are locked. Actually pull the handles or turn the door knob.
 - » if the security lights are working properly and lighting the area that should be lit.
 - » go back inside and lock all exterior doors.

» if you don't have a motion detecting security light, turn on outside lights and leave on all night. Use an LED bulb in your outside lights to have a brighter light and the cost to leave on will be minor.

• Car security – If you have a Kia or Hyundai where the key does not have a chip get something to lock out the steering wheel. These vehicles are currently being targeted by thieves. <u>Never</u> leave the following in your car: guns, keys to the car or home, valuables, purses, wallets, or personal information. I recommend disengaging the automatic trunk lid pop so thieves cannot easily access the trunk if they break into the vehicle.

Finally, the police are willing to come out to your home to give you a security audit and give you advice on how to better secure your home. Call the non-emergency number (727-587-6730) and ask for Officer Bowling.







Would you like that on the side?

The next time you sit down to enjoy a salad or you pick up a bottle of your favorite sauce, you might want to remember that salad dressings and sauces have a long history dating back to ancient times. According to the Association for Dressings & Sauces, the Chinese have been using soy sauce for 5,000 years, the Babylonians began using oil and vinegar on their salads nearly 2,000 years ago, and Worcestershire sauce is derived from a sauce that was used during Ceasar's life¬time. Early Romans, however, liked to dress their salads with salt.



Egyptians used oil, vinegar and a combina¬tion of oriental spices. Mayonnaise didn't come into use until about 200 years ago at a French nobleman's table, who incidentally liked to dine in the nude.

Many European monarchs enjoyed salads—some with as many as 35 ingredients including rose petals, marigolds and violets.

It wasn't until the 20th century that store-bought dressing made its debut. It evolved from restaurants packaging and selling their popular salad dressings. That combined with American ingenuity and the wide variety of sauces and dressings we have today was born. Joe Marzetti was just such an entrepreneur. In 1896, Marzetti opened a restaurant in Columbus, Ohio. He began to serve customers dressings based on old-world recipes. The popularity of his dressings led to his line of salad dressings being bottled and sold in 1919.

Richard Hellmann, a deli owner in New York, first started selling his mayonnaise in wooden containers. In one year, it become so popular that he began to market his mayonnaise in glass jars to meet demand.

Here are some popular salads and how they got their names according to Ladyfingers & Nun's Tummies—A Lighthearted Look at How Foods Got Their Names, by Martha Barnette.

- Coleslaw. The Dutch word for cabbage is "kool." This led to the English "coleslaw."
- Ceasar Salad. The name is in honor of restaurateur Caesar Cardini, who invented it in Tijuana, Mexico, in 1924. He was, by the way, against the use of anchovies in his dressing, and said the fishy taste came from the use of Worcestershire.
- Cobb Salad. Named after its inventor, restaurateur Bob Cobb. He invented the salad in his restaurant in Los Angeles in 1926 as an attempt to use leftovers.
- Horseradish (prepared sauce). Since the sauce doesn't have radishes or horses in it, its name may have been derived from the German word "meerrettich," or "sea radish." The German word "meer" sounds like the English word "mare," and that may have been how the term was coined.
- Green Goddess Dressing. Was created for actor George Arliss by the Palace Hotel in San Francisco while he was performing in a play called The Green Goddess, hence the name.
- Salad. The word "salad" itself is derived from the Latin words "herba salta," meaning "salted herbs," because greens were often dressed with salt in ancient Roman times.


