Happy New Year, everybody. I got an e-mail last

Week. It read, "A device in your house wants to connect to Alexa." This concerns me a little. I am getting paranoid about it. The message is anonymous. I don't know which device or what lengths it may go to. How many devices know how to e-mail? Will my coffee pot start spitting at me in the morning or the tv start playing reruns of "Lost" until I find them? I'm making every effort to stay on Alexa's good side by telling her what a great job she does turning on my lights and finding my phone. I went outside so I could think this through, but I think my smart car was spying on me!

Went to the gym yesterday. They've got a new machine. I only used it for half an hour because I started to feel sick. It works great though, does everything...KitKats, Snickers, Hersheys, Reese's, the lot.





Read on for some useless, but interesting information. The US standard railroad gauge (distance between the rails) is 4 feet, 8.5 inches. That's a weird number, but there's a reason for it.

It's because that's the way they built them in England, and English engineers designed the first US railroads. The English built them like that because the first rail lines were built by the same people who built the wagon tramways, and that's the gauge they used. So, why did 'they' use that gauge then?

The people who built the tramways used the same jigs and tools that they had used for building wagons, which used that same wheel spacing. Why did the wagons have that particular odd wheel spacing?

If they tried to use any other spacing, the wagon wheels would break more often on some of the old, long-distance roads in England. That's the spacing of the wheel ruts. So, who built those old, rutted roads?

Imperial Rome built the first long distance roads in Europe (including England) for their legions. Those roads have been used ever since. And what about the ruts in the roads?

Roman war chariots formed the initial ruts, which everyone else had to match or run the risk of destroying their wagon wheels. Since the chariots were made for Imperial Rome, they were all alike in the matter of wheel spacing. Therefore, the United States standard railroad gauge of 4 feet, 8.5 inches is derived from the original specifications for an Imperial Roman war chariot. Bureaucracies live forever.

The next time you are handed a specification/procedure/process and wonder 'What horse's ass came up with this?', you may be exactly right. Imperial Roman army chariots were made just wide enough to accommodate the rear ends of two war horses. (Two horses' asses.)

Now, the twist to the story:

When you see a Space Shuttle sitting on its launch pad, there are two big booster rockets attached to the sides of the main fuel tank. These are solid rocket boosters, or SRBs. The SRBs are made by Thiokol at their factory in Utah. The engineers who designed the SRBs would have preferred to make them a bit fatter, but the SRBs had to be shipped by train from the factory to the launch site. The railroad line from the factory happens to run through a tunnel in the mountains, and the SRBs had to fit through that tunnel. The tunnel is slightly wider than the railroad track, as you now know, is about as wide as two horses' behinds.

So, a major Space Shuttle design feature, of what is arguably the world's most advanced transportation system, was determined over two thousand years ago by the width of a horse's ass.
