While there is a primary person assigned this responsibility, that person may not always be on site to handle such issues, therefore we have the cell phone with someone who is on site and ready to handle these types of issues. Sending an e-mail or calling someone else will nor ensure your issue is handled promptly.

Parking on the Grass

have mentioned this more than once but it obviously has not taken effect. One it is prohibited by our by-laws. Two on some streets the water lines

are only one or two feet below the surface and some run parallel to the street one or two feet away from the asphalt. The weight of a vehicle in some conditions can leave an indent in the lawn. This may lead to telephone complaint from the owner; requesting the sod be replaced. **Three** it can rupture a joint or underground shutoff value or break the line completely. This results in water shut offs and expenses for a plumber to repair the line.

Plus, it just doesn't look nice in a community that prides itself on being a step above the average mobile home park. **PLEASE DO NOT PARK YOUR VEHICLE ON OUR GRASS.** Hopefully we won't need to have a tow truck remove your vehicle at your expense. This message is intended for the few repeat vehicle owners that park on our grass. There is plenty of asphalt for you to park on. Common sense is free please use it.



t's hard to believe that 2022 is in the past and we are already into February. Where is the time going and what's in store for 2023?

In the late Fall of 2021, the updated Condo Charter, Bylaws and Restrictions were approved and we have been distributing them personally to our residents. The updates were completed to align with changing Federal, State and Local laws as well as to include language that helps clarify owner requirements and expectations. While the property owner is responsible for the documents, they are a part of and remain with the property when it is sold or a deed transfer occurs. But just because we have documents in place, it's the owners that make them work.

Please take the time to become familiar with the documents and how they impact you and your neighbors.


January was a busy month as we moved forward quickly to begin making plans for 2023. On 1/4, we met with a representative of the Felten Property Assessment Team to complete the first phase of our Reserve Study. Results will be shared as they become available. One thing that we did learn is that in November 2022, the State of Florida finalized the requirement that all condo chartered communities must fully fund their reserves beginning in 2025. The rep stated that proactively increasing our reserves beginning in 2023 will be very helpful in minimizing the impact of funding to meet the 2025 requirement.

On 1/5, an extensive orientation was conducted with our new board members to help them understand how our board works, the impact of the laws that govern us and our expectations for the coming year regarding their assignments. This orientation along with the help of retiring board members helps to maintain a smooth transition and help the board, as a team, hit the ground running moving forward.

Finally, we have begun the process of facility planning and completing a needs assessment and prioritizing what will require funding in 2023. There are a few areas of the Clubhouse that we are looking at under the microscope of the Reserve Study including replacement of the doors, windows, bringing the bathrooms up to code and security cameras. We can't eat the elephant in one bite so will be addressing these areas thoughtfully and discussing plans with residents to get input as they evolve.




