Then you join the FMO you become a part of the strength of the organization. The members are informed when bills are being formed or are at the level to be placed on the ballot in our legislative session.



Nancy Black-Stewart, our legislative counsel in Tallahassee, is constantly alerting the FMO when committees are considering bills/legislation that do not benefit Florida mobile or manufactured homeowners.

The members are contacted by e-mail and given the details, the pros and cons and the opinion of the FMO on the legislation. Members are asked to contact the elected state officials for their district and give a vote of support or denial on what is being considered.

The following are examples of what this membership help has accomplished for the Florida homeowners.

- 1. 2007---Members contacted legislators during the debate on increasing the property tax exemption level. It has raised to \$25,000.00 and was passed.
- 2. 2009---Florida's revenues were lower than projected and a proposal to eliminate the sales tax emption on rent payments (for residents who lived 12 months a year) as a way to increase revenue for the state. IT FAILED.
- 3. 2012--- Bill was defeated that would have prevented homeowners from passing the original prospectus attached to a home to a new owner.
- 4. 2013---Citizens (state funded insurance agency) wanted to include coverage for carports, sheds, A/C units and screen rooms in their policies. The other insurance providers lobbied against it for fear that they would lose customers or be forced to extend coverage of the same. The bill passed, and it was written so that the coverage became mandatory across the state of Florida from all insurance providers.

The FMO led the initiative for the upgraded tie down program through multiple legislative sessions. It is still in progress and budgeted for the next 10 years.

Volunteers

This is a Four Seasons Estates community-wide fundraising effort, so we are always in need of new volunteers. If you are not on someone's team and you wish to be a volunteer at the Flea Market, please sign up on the volunteer list on the bulletin board. If you can't volunteer, please consider donations to the shed, silent auction, raffle baskets or liquor baskets!! Cash will also be accepted to purchase any items needed.

Team Chairpersons

We will have our first general meeting on Wednesday, February 1 following Koffee Klatch. The supply team will be passing out your information lists so that you can let us know who will be on your team or if you are in need of volunteers. It will also let us know what supplies you need to be ready for the big day! We will be requiring a worker's badge again this year, so it is important for us to know who will be working with you. Then, there will be brief meetings each Wednesday following Koffee Klatch until the flea market.

- 2/1 Team Chairpersons will receive volunteer/supply lists to fill out.
- 2/8 Team Chairpersons deadline to return supply lists to the supply committee.
- 2/15 Team Chairpersons will receive their supply boxes and badges.

FLEA MARKET SCHEDULE for the week of February 20 – 25th:

Monday-Wednesday 2/20-2/22 — The shed crew will be working on boxing up and organizing all the items for the sale. If you have empty boxes and/or plastic bags, please drop them off at the shed or inside the back door of the clubhouse. Donated items will continue to be accepted! If you have furniture to donate, please bring items up to the parking lot on Friday 2/24 or call Tom starting Monday 2-20 or Tuesday 2-21 @ 585-737-3589 to schedule a pickup for Thursday 2-23 or Friday 2-24.

Wednesday 2/22 - Final brief chairpersons meeting on Wednesday following Koffee Klatch. Also, the setup team will be moving the tables and chairs into place.

Thursday 2/23 - The clubhouse will be closed, and the shed team will be moving all of the merchandise in beginning at 9:00am. Team Chairpersons and volunteers are encouraged to assist in the moving and begin setting up displays and pricing items.

Friday 2/24 - The clubhouse will be open only to workers so that they may finish setting











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up their displays and complete the pricing of their items. Pick-ups for furniture and other large donations that residents have been holding on to will be scheduled for today. Workers with work badges may shop during booth setup, 10am to noon only. Residents wearing their park name badge may shop from 10am to noon only also. The dumpster will be staged by shed for all trash from the Flea Market on Saturday.

SATURDAY - 7:30am – Early Bird entrance to Flea Market is free for Four Seasons Estates residents with park badges and \$1 for the general public.

SATURDAY - 8:00am - General entrance to Flea Market.

SATURDAY - 1:00pm - Closing time. Each table will be responsible for packing up remaining goods in boxes and putting them at the shed. Items will be sorted before any donations to the area agencies the following week. Clean-up will be done by all workers: sweeping, mopping the floors and returning tables and chairs to their normal format in the clubhouse.

Sunday 2/26 - 5:00pm – Celebration Dinner and preliminary Flea Market results. One complimentary dinner ticket will be given to each worker. Other residents and guests may purchase dinner tickets from Mary Wuest for \$5.

NOTICE: The Clubhouse will be closed on that Thursday, Friday, and Saturday (2/23-2/25). The key card reader will not be working, so if you need someone in the office, please come during business hours. There will be no parking in the parking lot starting on Thursday at noon, all day Friday and Saturday.

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

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




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ANNUAL MEMORIAL PROGRAM IN FEBRUARY




