Be On the Look Out (BOLO) for Dog Walkers

R riar Creek sometimes feels more like a quaint lake-side village or resort.

The foliage and topography which surround us is welcoming, homey, and unlike most other 55+ modular home communities.

The disadvantage to the beauty we appreciate is sometimes, a clear view around the corner is obstructed. Especially at dawn and dusk or the darkness of a moonless night. The walkers may carry a flash light, wear reflective clothing or put reflective tape on their dog's leash. Sometimes, it is still hard to see them around a bend in the road or beside big bushes.

Recently, on one of those nights, a dog-walking resident felt threatened by a driver's 'night blindness.'

Take a minute to remember the speed limit is 15mph or 20mph depending where you are. Pay close attention as you drive around a bend in the road or a corner. If there is not a stop sign, be certain to slow your roll; look both ways and straight ahead. Especially if you are driving through designated dog areas, be alert, courteous and cautious. The very last thing we want is to injure a resident or their dog out for a walk.





am frequently asked what the most challenging thing is that I have experienced as a board member. With four generational age groups ranging from the 50s to the 90s, we all have different expectations and



desires about how we will live our lives over our remaining years. Our wishes, to a great extent, are based on how we grew up and remembering how things were years ago through rose colored glasses versus how we see things today. For example, 40, 50, 60 years ago, was life simpler, safer and easier than today? When I was younger, did I worry about road rage like today? We had a rotary dial phone with a party line, were enamored with a black and white test screen on a 12" TV. Today, it's four TV remotes - I don't have Netflix, I have Amazon Prime, what is live streaming and paying for 600 channels but only watching six and social media? I can't figure it all out - heck I can't even figure out that darn new smart thermostat that was installed with my new AC system - what my new AC system costs more than my first house and my car insurance for one year costs more than my first new car? In the 1960s, a loaf of bread was 20 cents, a gallon of gas 23 cents, and now eggs a buck a piece? What is bird flu? What about crime? People are getting away with murder, identity theft (what's that, I know who I am), stealing Amazon delivered gifts from my front porch - oh, forgot Amazon didn't get delivered to my house years ago (because it didn't exist) but the milk man made his weekly delivery of three bottles of whole and one bottle of chocolate milk and they were never stolen. Dominos or pickle ball. Computers? And the music, don't even go there. Federal, state and local laws, condo documents, bylaws, deed restrictions - I want structure but I don't want anyone telling me what I can or can't do. My neighbor did this - why? So our docs say it's ok but I don't like it, can we change the docs? The list goes on. One truth we find in society today, right or wrong, is that when one group of people gains a new right, another group tends to lose that right. And when we get that right, we like it and when we lose that right, we don't like it. When did things change or, conceptually, did they ever really? Darn social media and the internet. So as we look back on those years, we often wish "why can't life now be like it was back then." The problem is, we know we can't go back and our wishes are not going to change the realities we face today. We are aging and things can only go in one direction. Down deep we know that but that doesn't change how we feel. Oh, and speaking of change? Most of us don't deal with change well anyways, except now, I can use a remote instead of getting Continued on page 22

up every time to turn the TV on/off, adjust the volume or change channels. Of course, there are a few other advancements like no telephone party lines and microwave ovens. For every board, the challenge frequently faced is the not so easy job of trying to balance how individual residents would like things to be with the reality of how things are. Board members are residents and volunteers like you who often don't agree with the laws, rules, restrictions and financial realities they ultimately must address. Board members cannot have the individual need to BE right but collectively must have the honorable and value based need to DO right. Like you, when we moved to BCII, we agreed to abide by those documents and as board members we must do our best to enforce them and lead by example. Taking that a step further, boards past, present, and future have the responsibility to do what is required of them and while they may not like or agree with that task, they must play the game with the hand they are dealt. Managing resident expectations against realities in an ever-changing legal and social environment is what volunteer boards get paid the big bucks for. Please don't make the mistake to think that I am whining or complaining. No one forces any individual to run for the board - no one forces any resident to live here. If we don't like it, we don't have to run for the board and every resident has the freedom to move somewhere else if they don't like it here. But the bottom line is, no board is perfect but every member loves it here and only wants what's best for our residents for that period of time they serve. Service to our community is not just what board members do, it is who board members are as individuals and that service, in and of itself, is our reward. So like you, let's enjoy the memories of times past and rather than fight the things we may not be able to control, help each other create new memories that down the road, we will cherish. Let's be able to look back at our time at BCII saying "those were some of the greatest years of my life and I did my part to help make our community a better place to live.
