President's Report

hange is difficult. Change is challenging. But change can be good. We have a new board with new officers. We have a new,

very experienced manager representing a professional management company, both of which are dedicated to Cooperative and HOA communities. We also have an attorney licensed to deal with properties like ours. There are very few attorneys in the area that are certified in condominium and property law, and he has over 40 years of experience. Our manager, management company and attorney are all trustworthy, knowledgeable, and well versed in Federal and State laws, Florida statutes and our own master occupancy agreement and association documents. When we ask questions or ask for options, we may not always get the answers we want to hear; but we get truthful, honest answers and we get the guidance moving forward.

We have been informed of a situation we need to act on as a board and a community. We have discovered that the statutes do not allow for a material change to our common areas without a 2/3 or majority vote. (Reference Florida Statute 719.1055). As was explained to us by the attorney, a material change could be anything from putting in a new plant bedding area, placing a memorial, or a statue, or a fountain in a designated common area, changing the paint or color scheme in or on a building, replacing awnings with a different material or color, or changing a common use area from one use to another; such as a building a wall in the laundry room to add additional storage or putting in a bocce ball court. It doesn't matter if the changes are through community funding or donations, or if it's a beautification or access project; a community vote is required.

There is a list of changes that have been done in the past that, without any malice or intent to defraud, previous boards had voted on and approved without a community vote. These actions were done simply as a misinterpretation of the statutes and our governing documents; but could incur fines from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation of \$500 to \$5,000 per infraction.

How do we rectify this and how can we move forward as a community? First, the Board of Directors, with your assistance, will compile a list of ALL past changes since 2017 to common areas that were not based on a community vote and create a master ballot list of these changes. Any item on the list that does not get a 2/3 passing vote will have to be removed, dismantled, and the area of concern returned to its original configuration. These actions will come at a high cost so this is to be considered by you as you vote.

I am asking that we come together as a community, as an association, as friends, as owners of Americana Cove. It will be a process that may require your patience and understanding. As soon as we have the list, we will be sending out a proxy vote to legally approve past changes and get a fresh start!

In February we read It Ends With Us, by Colleen Hoover. We had an excellent discussion about this book which dealt with the issue of Domestic Violence. We would like to remind everyone that if you or someone you know is dealing with a Domestic Violence matter help is available and there are several hotlines you can reach out to.



This month we are reading a psychological thriller, **Win** by Harlan Coben, hosted by Judy Hall.

Over twenty years ago, the heiress Patricia Lockwood was abducted during a robbery of her family's estate, then locked inside an isolate cabin for months. Patricia escaped, but so did her captors — and the items stolen from her family were never recovered.

Until now. On the Upper West Side, a recluse is found murdered in his penthouse apartment, alongside two objects of note: a stolen Vermeer painting and a leather suitcase bearing the initials WHL3. For the first time in years, the authorities have a lead — not only on Patricia's kidnapping, but also on another FBI cold case — with the suitcase and painting both pointing them toward one man.

Windsor Horne Lockwood III — or Win, as his few friends call him — doesn't know how his suitcase and his family's stolen painting ended up with a dead man. But his interest is piqued, especially when the FBI tells him that the man who kidnapped his cousin was also behind an act of domestic terrorism — and that the conspirators may still be at large. The two cases have baffled the FBI for decades, but Win has three things the FBI doesn't: a personal connection to the case; an ungodly fortune; and his own unique brand of justice.

The books we have selected for the next few months are (April) All The Light We Cannot See by Anthony Doerr; (May) Ordinary Grace by William Kent Krueger; (June) Daisy Jones & The Six by Taylor Jenkins Reid; (July) The Seven Husbands of Evelyn Hugo by Taylor Jenkins Reid.



Buyer's Market in Florida

The past two years have been a seller's market for real estate, meaning that home prices had increased and inventory had been low so homes were selling very quickly. In 2023, the market has turned and inventory has risen and home prices are steady but not increasing.



For the over age 55 market, home pricing is flat or fallen a little since homes are not sold to the general population. At Americana Cove, buyers have to meet the age requirement and a credit score requirement of 700 or above. In addition, there have been a number of residents who have passed or who are moving into assisted living, so more homes are for sale than has been in the past two years when inventory was very low.

The 55⁺ market is different from the general population in that we generally see the trends first in a 55⁺ community as seniors react to the market more quickly than the general population, explains Broker Marty Pozgay. "Retirees are on a fixed income so they watch more closely what is happening with the stock market and economy, whereas the general population may overcome economic issues by working more hours or obtaining a new job with a higher salary."

According to the Florida Realtors Association, an average of 800 people net per day move to Florida and for the first time in 2023, Florida has the fastest growing population in the U.S. Within Florida, four in 10 residents are 50 years of age or older. The state has the second largest senior population in the U.S. behind California, according to SeniorLiving.org.

A so retirement community such as Americana Cove still have a lot of people looking for homes and is why home pricing is not falling rapidly. "The only time a listing may see a rapidly reducing price is because the home needs to be sold quickly due to the situation of the owner," said Pozgay.
