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

Resident will then get a reply asking them to respond with their name and lot number, and once done, the registration is complete.

Parking Rules

- <u>he Following rules apply to parking at ALL times</u> <u>All Residents Must Register their Vehicles</u>
- \bullet Do not park on the grass ever
- ✤ Do not park on the sidewalk
- Each home is issued a visitor parking pass.

That pass must be kept at the home and not be given out. If you lose it, you may be charged \$3.00 to replace it.

- No overnight street parking
- Attention, Beginning June 15th, we will be focusing on illegal parking and proper parking tags. The tow company will be increasing their presence and will be towing anyone parked on the street, grass, or sidewalk at night, parked overnight at the clubhouses or office without a parking sticker or the NEW yellow guest passes with the expiration date, any commercial truck or van parked anywhere on the property, expired tags, flat tires or inoperable vehicles. Reminder on Trash Policies

- 1. The trash area is open Tues, Weds and Fri 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM (Unless a it is full or the City has picked up the compactor)
- 2. You can only throw basic household garbage in the compactor, bundled yard waste, or small furniture items in the roll-off and recyclables in the recycle bin-please do not leave anything on the ground or sitting outside the dumpster area, and anything else will need to be hauled off of the property. NO CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS EVER.
- 3. Trash pick up is Tuesdays and Fridays in front of your house, must be out be out by 8 AM.
- 4. All trash must be bagged, they will not take loose trash, boxes that are not broken down, any bags with kitty litter, dog feces, etc. Yard waste must be bundled or bagged.
- 5. They will not take furniture.

Let's Get to Know Florida Statute 723

thought it would be a great education and learning tool to help us all find out about Florida Statute 723 and how it impacts us here at our Park if each month I include in the media a brief tidbit of information from Statute 723 (2022) and some Q&A's from the Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of Florida aka FMO.



What is Florida Statute 723? Chapter 723 of the Florida Statutes, also known as the Florida Mobile Home Act, is a chapter of law that **governs the rental or leasing of mobile home lots in the State of Florida**. In conjunction with our HOA by-laws, it is what governs our Home Owner's Association. Chapter 723.078 covers by-laws of homeowners' associations and says that "The bylaws shall provide and, if they do not, shall be deemed to include" provisions of chapter 723.078 such as:

723.078 2 (a) Unless otherwise provided in the bylaws, the board of directors shall be composed of five members. The board of directors shall elect a president, secretary, and treasurer who shall perform the duties of those offices customarily performed by officers of corporations, and these officers shall serve without compensation and at the pleasure of the board of directors. (note that our by-laws include a Vice President and seven members)

723.078 2 (c) 1. Meetings of the board of directors and meetings of its committees at which a quorum is present shall be open to all members. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the requirement that board meetings and committee meetings be open to the members does not apply to meetings between the park owner and the board of directors or any of the board's committees, board or committee meetings held for the purpose of discussing personnel matters, or meetings between the board or a committee and the association's attorney, with respect to potential or pending litigation, when the meeting is held for the purpose of seeking or rendering legal advice, and when the contents of the discussion would otherwise be governed by the attorney-client privilege.




