

When she graduated from high school, she moved to the big city of Toronto, Canada. When she flew into Toronto at night and saw all the beautiful lights, she was amazed. She landed a job with an Insurance company, typing fire sprinkler reports. Her life had changed.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

She got married at the age of eighteen and was married for nine years. The best part of her marriage was giving birth to he two beautiful children. Her son was named Chad and her daughter was named Kimberly. They both were raised the right way, and grew up to be well educated and ready for the adult world. They both were at the top of the Dean's list and they both have great careers. Chad is a professor at Duksung University in Seoul, Korea and Kimberly is a supervisor at the Purolator Company that is similar to UPS. They both are married, and their spouses also have good careers. She has two grandchildren. Both are boys, one is named Han, who is eight years old, and the other is Wayne, who is six years old. The marriage itself did not turn out to be a dream come true. Her husband was abusive and after nine years, she decided that she had enough and escaped with her two children. She never went back.

HER AMAZING STORY AFTER DIVORCE

It is an amazing story and well worth reading. I will put some of her book in this story, because it is to good to leave out. After the abusive marriage, she decided at the age of twenty-seven, to focus on making her children, her health and being happy, the most important thing in her life.

She joined Toastmaster Company as a very shy person. When she gave her first speech, she was so nervous, she struggled to get it done. She had to read it all, including her name. She continued to educate herself and practice. With the encouragement of coworkers and friends, they helped her become a confident speaker. It was not all clear sailing, so she turned it over to God, and he told her to care for others, herself, and her children. It took a while, but she persevered and succeeded.

She worked and returned to College and University. She got her Business Administration Diploma, with a major in Accountancy. It was not easy for a single mom, but she made it work. Then she opened her own business, an accounting firm and soon had over two hundred clients. God continued to guide her and led her into a career in writing, speaking and leadership. She led District #86 with four thousand five hundred members to a distinguished status. Then she joined the Speaker Association and Public Speaker Guild. She received her Pastor's license in 2017, closed her accounting firm and changed it to TGF (Transformation for Growth) She has written several books, including the one that I mentioned earlier, Unstoppable. She is a Pastor/ Chaplin, Businesswoman, Author, Speaker, Award winner, BA, BCC, and DTM.

HER TIME IN SUNSET PALMS

She purchased her place in Sunset Palms in 2013 because it was so clean and organized compared to the other parks nearby. She liked the friendliness of everyone. - Cover your toilet bowls with plastic wrap and place something heavy on top.
- Close your sink drains to keep critters from entering your home.
- Leave air conditioner on (between 80F and 85F) to minimize potential mold issues.
- Place either cat litter, charcoal, or Damp Rid around inside your home to absorb moisture.
- Unplug electrical items, for example computers, TV, coffee makers etc.
- Golf cart check what is recommended for your cart.




