with FOBS that increase the safety of all residents of Briar Creek. Remember to bring your FOB with you when you are going to the Clubhouse or Pool. Do not assume that someone will be there and open the door or gate – this defeats the purpose of issuing FOBS for security.

CLUBHOUSE/POOL AREA

After use of the Clubhouse or Pool Area remember to do the following:

- Relock any doors you dogged in the open position
- Turn off lights
- Turn off any fans you used also fans on back deck by the pool
- Return any items you used from the kitchen and, if needed, empty the trash

Tump In! The pool welcomed its first swimmers of 2023, on March 17th during the St. Patrick's Day event.

At this writing, the new breaker box connection is still scheduled for the twentieth of Who Knows? The water in the pool and spa is

treated three times weekly; the pool is brushed; etc. The ambient temperature is warming as expected this time of year. Aqua aerobics are available on most days at 10:30am.

The biggest change, once the breaker is finally hooked up, will be the temperature will be computer regulated at 84 degrees year-round. That is the recommended temperature to provide an ideal temperature, not too warm to invite algae growth and not too cold to shiver your timbers.

Phase 2 welcomed us to their pool for much longer than anticipated...we invite anyone to participate and continue exercising with the group of mermaids in Phase 1.

n the last couple of months, many of our residents have been flooded with cards, letters and calls from real estate investors interested in



Louying their Briar Creek home. Comments such as "Avoid listing it and letting it sit on the market just to lose value. You deserve a fast and fair cash offer on your terms, not ours" can be tempting. The purpose of this article is not to limit any owner considering selling opportunities going forward. Taking advantage of offers from potential buyers may be in our best personal interest. Currently, trending offers we are seeing are from real estate corporations and investors interested in flipping homes to make a profit or seeking rental properties.

To protect our investment from corporations purchasing homes and converting BCII into to a corporate owned rental community, our legal documents specifically prevent owners from selling to a corporation and/or a corporation from buying a home. If you decide to sell your home, it is important that you inform the realtor or buyer of this requirement. This year, we have had sales contracts broken due to this requirement not being communicated up front.

So, if you are considering selling your home, save yourself time, money and disappointment by making sure you and your potential buyer are both aware of what can and cannot happen in a sale according to our Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws and Restrictions.

We were able to circumvent the one unit and got the heater to work on the smaller unit, so we have had warm water in our pool for the last 3 weeks.

We are constantly monitoring the pool and hot tub (spa) to remain in compliance with the Health Department, and for the enjoyment of our residents. There are issues that arise from time to time, but understand that when this happens we know about them, and are actively working to rectify them.

Phil Chabot – Director - Lawns, Ponds and RV Lot

This month I would like to revisit the topic on our RV Lot. Recently, individuals both known and unknown have dumped brush, tree limbs, palm fronds and other waste and debris in the RV lot. That dumping took away two valuable and available storage spaces. The area has since been completely cleaned up and NO DUMPING signs have been posted. NO DUMPING of any kind is allowed in the RV lot area. The cutting of tree limbs and changes to lots must be approved by the board prior to taking action. The RV lot area is the property of the Association and is considered a common area. Should further dumping or unapproved changes occur, we will actively seek the violator(s) and the individual(s) will be assessed for the cost of clean-up and may be subject to removal from the RV Lot.

The RV Lot is an amenity that is available to owners of Phase II on a first come basis and currently we have one designated storage space. There is also a "waiting list" for those times when there are no open spaces. The RV Lot is meant for storage of an owner's RV, Camper, Boat & amp; Trailer and Utility Trailer. Any unit that occupies a space in the RV Lot must be registered and the registration must be kept valid with a copy of the current registration delivered to myself or to the board office. Any owner in violation is subject to removal from the RV Lot. It is the responsibility of the owner to "maintain" his / her assigned space where the mowing company does not mow. It is also the responsibility of the owner to maintain insurance on their unit in case of fire, theft, vandalism or any other acts of God. If you have any questions concerning the RV lot feel free to contact myself, Philip Chabot, or any director. I do hope this information is useful and informative to all of you and have a great month!

Drinking more water with lemon and weaning away from the artificial sweetened or sugary drinks. Think food first before just taking drugs and accepting certain problems as normal. Once I had a patient who drank 12 cokes a day at work. He suffered with many health problems. We started cutting back slowly. After a month he was drinking one coke a day and many of his health conditions disappeared. Like the tortoise take one step at a time keeping your focus. Slow and steady wins the race.


