Three years ago when my sister, Tina Keiser, bought # 136, I was supposed to come for a month to help her remodel it. My husband passed away right before so I ended up retiring and spending the winter with her. Before winter ended, # 158 came up for sale and I bought it.

I summer in TN with my horse, "Ocho," and winter here where I ride a recumbent trike. My sister in Nashville takes care of Ocho when I'm in Fl. I love riding bikes, dancing, listening to music and riding horses. I love just hanging out with friends and playing games or just chatting. I like going to local pubs that have live music and dancing. I also enjoy traveling. I have taken several cruises and flown to Mexico with friends from the park. I enjoyed trips to Cancun and Cabo San Lucas.

I grew up in Mansfield, Ohio and graduated from Madison High School. I earned an associates degree in Accounting at North Central Technical College. I went on to earn a B.S. Degree in Management/Human

Services from Trevecca Nazarene University in Nashville, Tn. I worked for 15 years with ADT Security Services. I retired as an auditor with the State of Tennessee.

I have 8 children (4 mine, 4 step kids), "his, mine, and ours." I had my hand in at least 40 teenage foster boys, ranging from a few days in our home to 3 years... more grandchildren than I can keep track of and 4 great grandchildren. A couple of my kids also do foster care - foster kids and adopted.

We took in teenage boys who were "kicked-out" of other homes as a last stop before boys camp. We hoped that we could teach them enough to stay in a home instead of a place for troubled boys. It worked for some, not others. And some actually went back to their parents which was always the ultimate goal. Our first 2 boys stayed with us until they aged-out of the system as adults. I still have contact with them through Facebook and they are doing well.

My husband, Jody Thompson, and I were married 17 years. He died from cancer in 2020. Jody and I belonged to a horse club. We had a large horse trailer with living quarters. We enjoyed "horse camping" throughout the state of Tn.

The unit I bought needed almost a full "gut job" and I opened up the whole front end for the kitchen, living room, and dining room. I have done a lot of the work on my own with some help from my sister and my oldest son and family. I do have construction skills and am on the "Will Work for Beer" list. I added my name to the list because I am almost done with mine and love to meet new people and help with anything.

The first of this NEW series was in the APRIL magazine. I KNOW there are a LOT of people who have done MANY projects to improve their units in the parks. However, no one chose to share one for this May Magazine edition. So here's another one of mine to the new magazine feature clive:

keep this new magazine feature alive:

We own a "triple." We have an extra room that we use as a den. It has a sleeper sofa that we use to make this room into another guest room. The room has no closet. We decided to buy a wardrobe unit so guests would have a closet. We looked at a lot of new ones. They were either too big or too expensive or both. We gave up the search and then one day we found an oak entertainment center that was about to be

donated to the Windfall Sale. We bought the unit and used the 2 separate side pieces to make a wardrobe. We painted the inside and outside with primer and white semi-gloss finish paint. I then used a small roller to paint the glass windows on the back of the glass with the same turquoise paint we used on the walls of the den. I drilled holes and put in metal rods to use as closet rods to hold clothes hangars. Once the 2 halves were finished, they were carried into the den and leveled. They were fastened together with screws. The entertainment center had adjustable glass shelves which were used to hold my cycling clothes. This was a fairly simple project. It actually turned out better than expected....Tim Burgner

Then we bought our unit - the FIRST unit built on 4th Street - we had several large mirrors that were just glued to the walls. We visited a hotel that "dressed-up" their plain wall mirrors with a frame. We took pictures.

Home Depot sells the corners and trim boards in different styles. It's a VERY simple "Do It Yourself Project." I used clear calk as an adhesive. I "glued" in the 4 wooden corners. I then cut the trim boards to size and "glued them in.

It's best to paint/stain the pieces BEFORE you glue them. You can buy the trim already painted white and then just paint the wooden corners to match the trim.

It really does make a BIG difference in the appearance of the mirrors. It dresses-up the room nicely.



Flood Insurance Requirement Meeting Summary

n March 28th a meeting was conducted for Westwind residents that were interested in learning about the new Florida law. The law mandates that individuals insured through Citizens Insurance Company must now purchase a separate flood insurance policy in order to maintain their eligibility to keep Citizens insurance coverage for their homes and contents. A standing-room-only crowd packed the Westwind 2 clubhouse to learn about this law including how and when it might impact their policies.

Tricia MacGregor and Ross Keller, both of Ross Insurance Group, presented pertinent information and responded to many questions from attendees throughout the evening. They began by explaining Senate Bill 2-A as passed by the Florida legislature during the December 2022 Special Session. This law requires new business and renewal Citizens Insurance policyholders to purchase a separate flood insurance policy if they carry hurricane coverage (wind and rain) on the Citizens policy in order to be able to keep their current Citizens Insurance policy covering their home and contents.

Some highlights of their comments follow:

- This law only pertains to Citizens Insurance policyholders if you are not insured through Citizens, then there is no requirement to purchase flood insurance.
- Flood policies are a separate policy from your Citizens policy and written through FEMA (the Federal Emergency Management Agency). There is a 30-day waiting period from the date you purchase flood insurance before a flood policy becomes active.
- Flood policies must carry dwelling/building and contents coverage equal to or higher than their Citizens policy limits.
- If Citizens policyholders don't comply with the flood insurance requirement, they can't maintain their Citizens policy.
- A flood zone map is attached indicating the flood zones present in Westwind (Zone AE & Zone X). This is not an official issued map from FEMA we've added Westwind unit numbers for homes that are bordering the two flood zones to make it simpler to determine your zone.

 $\check{N}OTE$: for those units in the TAN area on the map (labeled as Zone AE), it's important for you to contact your insurance agent directly so they can specify if you're in Zone AE or X. We understand that some homeowners in the TAN area have contacted their agent and learned that they are actually in Zone X.

- For those in Zone AE: a flood insurance policy is required for new business as of April 1, 2023 and for those renewing their policies after July 1, 2023.
- For those in Zone X: a flood insurance policy will be required beginning in 2027.
- Citizens Insurance Company will write a mobile home policy that excludes hurricane (wind & rain) coverages. If you choose to exclude these coverages, then you are not required to purchase flood insurance. NOTE: Ross Insurance Group will not write policies excluding wind & rain coverages.
- Citizens Insurance is the only company offering new business for mobile homes in Westwind, as far as Ross Insurance Group is aware.
- Flood insurance policies must be paid in full at the time of purchase...there are no payment

plan options.

• Flood insurance policies cannot be canceled mid-term. Flood policies are paid in full for the year. If you sell your home after you purchase flood insurance, the flood policy can be transferred to the new owner for the remainder of the original policy term.

• If you obtain an elevation certificate for your home you can submit it to your insurance agent, who can forward it to FEMA which may impact your flood insurance costs. They suggested that surveyors would need to be hired to provide elevation certificates.

• View and download flood maps at: www. msc.fema.gov

• these are generic examples and your specific costs will vary based on your specific situation (size of home, year manufactured, coverage limits you select, whether you're a primary or seasonal resident, and a few other factors).

• this is a separate charge for flood insurance only...you will still have your normal Citizens Insurance policy premium to pay annually.

PREPARING COACH FOR EXTENDED ABSENCES

B efore leaving your mobile home for the summer, there are some precautions you should consider taking to prevent mold and bug damage.

Turn off your water to avoid any leaks, which could damage your unit and create a

large water bill.

Turn off all breakers except your air conditioning or refrigerator, if leaving it on. Humidity is a big problem in Florida in the summer. If you leave your thermostat set at 82 or 85 degrees, your air conditioner should keep the humidity out of your home and not raise your electric bill significantly. You may wish to purchase foil bags to hang in your closets. Other moisture absorbing material is available to use. These bags absorb moisture. Leave all closet doors open. Some folks like to put charcoal in a pan on the floor. This also absorbs moisture and odors.

Be sure the breaker to your hot water tank is turned off.

Put duct tape over all the drains.

Put plastic wrap over the toilets.

Put boric acid powder in your registers on the floor. Bay leaves in the cupboards help to keep roaches out.

Remove all items outside that are not fastened to the house.

Empty fountains and move inside or tip over so that water does not stand and make an area for mosquitoes to breed. Rain water barrels or other water collecting devices must be covered

with screen to keep out mosquitoes.

If you turn off your refrigerator, put newspaper inside to absorb moisture and put a towel over the doors so that they will not close.

Leave a key with someone in the area who can go inside in the event of an emergency.

Arrange for someone to care for your plants and weed your lot in your absence.

Notify the Management office that you are leaving and give them a forwarding address and phone number. This is especially important in the event of a pending hurricane. We need to know where everyone is located.

Even if the hurricane season is calm, we do have strong winds occasionally, so it is important that nothing be left outdoors that can become a missile and damage a coach. You should have liability insurance in the event damage occurs.
