MANAGER'S CORNER

URRICANE SEASON:

Hurricane season starts June 30th and ends November 30. Now is the time to plan what you will do in the event an Evacuation Order is issued. All Mobile Home Communities are <u>Mandatory Evacuation Zones</u>. Residents who will be leaving Sunset Palms and heading north are reminded to store items that could become airborne during a storm in your shed or inside the mobile. Staff will be securing the buildings and common areas. You may pick up a copy of the Emergency Preparedness Disaster Plan from the office. **REAL ESTATE TRANSACTIONS:**

All transactions involving the Sale of the mobile and the transfer of the Share, Purchase of a Share, Installation of a new Home on a vacant lot, For Sale by Owner transactions or the addition/ removal of an individual from the Share, require approval by the New Unit/Share Approval Board. A background check and two-member board interview is required, followed by completion of documents for review and approval by the Approval Committee. Real Estate transactions cannot process to a close without first going through our internal approval process. <u>THE FIRST STEP IS</u> TO CONTACT THE OFFICE.

SUBLETTING UNITS:

Subletting is allowed on a seasonal basis only, for a maximum of six (6) consecutive months in any twelve (12) month year period. The lease period must be a minimum period of three (3) months or a maximum period of six (6) months. It is the responsibility of the Unit Owners to notify Sunset Palms Office of their intent to lease their Unit and to provide information on the Subtenant. The Subtenant must sign in at the Office upon arrival and sign out at the time of expiration of the lease and departure from the park. Subtenants will be subjected to a background check. All Subtenants must receive Management approval prior to occupancy. Subtenants are bound by the same rules and regulations as the Unit Owner and Unit Owner is responsible for the actions of the Subtenant. **TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX:**

00If you rent your home, you are required to register with the Pinellas County Tax Collector to collect and remit a 6% Tourist Development Tax, and 7% Florida Sales Tax. VERY IMPORTANT: This 13% tax is a mandatory requirement for EVERY rental. If the rental is not reported to the Pinellas County Tax Collector there will be a fine issued to the owner renting the home. 



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
