

We're usually back home by 2:00 pm to get ready for dinner. People start lining up for the early bird about 3:00 pm, but we get there by 3:45 because we're late eaters. The dinners are very popular because of the large portions they serve. We can take home enough food for the next day's lunch and dinner, including extra bread, crackers, packets of mustard, relish, ketchup, and Splenda, along with mints. At 5:30 pm we're home, ready to watch the 6 o'clock news. By 6:30 pm we're fast asleep. Then we get up and make five or six trips to the bathroom during the night and it's time to get up and start a new day all over again.









Doctor-related activities eat up most of our retirement time. I enjoy reading old magazines in sub-zero temperatures in the waiting room, so I don't mind. Calling for test results also helps the days fly by. It takes at least a half hour just getting through the doctor's phone menu. Then there's the hold time until we're connected to the right party. Sometimes they forget we're holding, and the whole office goes off to lunch.

Should we find we still have time on our hands, volunteering provides a rewarding opportunity to help the less fortunate. Florida has the largest concentration of seniors under five feet, and they need our help. I am a volunteer for The Vertically Challenged Over 80. I coach their basketball team, The Arthritic Avengers. The hoop is only 4-1/2 feet from the floor. You should see the look of confidence on their faces when they make a slam dunk. Food shopping is a problem for short seniors, or "bottom feeders," as we call them since they can't reach the food on the upper shelves. There are many foods they've never tasted. After shopping, most seniors can't remember where they parked their cars and wander the parking lot for hours while their food defrosts. I'm tall enough to locate vehicles and save the food before it thaws.



The Ambulance Fund is open to all residents for \$2.50 per person per year. Payment qualifies members for 1 emergency transport per person per year. The fund pays the balance of the bill, up to \$75, after Medicare and insurance. Membership period is stated on your card. There are no grace days.

CRUNCHY PEPPERMINT PATTY COOKIE BITES

INGREDIENTS

72 MINI Nilla Wafer cookies (can use regular sized as well)

- 1 7-ounce bag of mini peppermint patties unwrapped.
- 8 ounces chocolate chips or melting chocolate wafers.
- 1 teaspoon coconut oil (optional to add with chocolate chips when melting)

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat your oven to 300 degrees.
- 2. Place 36 mini Nilla wafer cookies onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- 3. Place a mini peppermint patty in the center of each one.
- 4. Heat in oven for 90 seconds.

DO NOT heat for longer than 90 seconds.

- 5. Remove from the oven and place another cookie on top of each pep-permint patty. We're NOT squishing or flattening the mint, just adding a cookie on top and slightly pressing down.
- 6. Immediately chill the tray of cookies in the refrigerator for 15-20 minutes, or until chocolate has set.
- 7. Melt chocolate in a double boiler or in the microwave. You can use melting chocolate wafers or chocolate chips.
- Note: if using chocolate chips, you can add a teaspoon of coco-nut oil if you'd like to thin them out a little.
- 8. Dip cookie sandwiches into chocolate using a chocolate dipper tool or fork. Tap the tool or fork against the side of the bowl to allow the excess chocolate to drip off before transferring the cookie back to the baking sheet.
- 9. Refrigerate cookies until the chocolate has hardened.

NOTES

Store peppermint cookie bites in an airtight container for up to 2 weeks. Note: if using regular-sized Nilla wafers you may need a little more chocolate.


