 	 Directions 1. Thaw spinach and squeeze out water. Soften cream cheese. 2. In a mixing bowl, combine spinach, cream cheese, and seasoning salt. Mix well and spoon into 2-quart casserole dish. 3. Sprinkle with breadcrumbs and bake at 350 degrees F (175 degree C) for 20 minutes.

- 2. Sprinkle 1/4 cup Cheddar cheese into pastry shell. Mix together chicken, spinach, remaining 3/4 cup Cheddar cheese, and onion in a medium bowl; transfer mixture to pastry shell.
- 3. Whisk together eggs, half-and-half, mayonnaise, salt, black pepper, seasoning in a second medium bowl until well combined; pour over chicken mixture.

Texas HoldEm Poker

Join Phil Tursi and the rest of the poker gang. You will have some fun with this group. It's easy to play, and the group will teach you how to play. They are very patient, and you will learn from some of the best in town. You will learn the art of betting, folding, holding, and winning!

Poker is played on Wednesdays \$30.00 (High-stake night), Fridays \$10.00 and Sundays \$10.00. You wont lose anymore than these amounts. Come check it out and watch a few hands. See if it's something you like. Men and women alike play the game.

Object of the Game

Before and after each card(s) is revealed, players take turns to bet. To stay in the hand and see the next card, all players must have put the same amount of chips in the pot as each other. The best poker hand wins the pot.

Poker Hands

Five of a Kind - This is the highest possible hand and can occur only where at least one card is wild, such as a joker. Examples of five of a kind would be four 10s and a wild card or two queens and three wild cards.

Straight Flush - This is the highest possible hand when only the standard pack is used, and there are no wild cards. A straight flush consists of five cards of the same suit in sequence, such as 10, 9, 8, 7, 6 of hearts.

Four of a Kind - This is the next highest hand. An example is four aces or four 3s.

Full House - This colorful hand is made up of three cards of one rank and two cards of another rank, such as three 8s and two 4s.

Flush - Five cards all of the same suit, but not all in sequence, is a flush. An example is Q, 10, 7, 6, and 2 of clubs.

Straight - Five cards in sequence, but not all of the same suit is a straight. An example is 9Ψ , $8 \bigstar$, $7 \bigstar$, $6 \bigstar$, 5Ψ .

Three of a Kind - This combination contains three cards of the same rank, and the other two cards each of a different rank, such as three jacks, a seven, and a four.

Two Pairs - This hand contains a pair of one rank and another pair of a different rank, plus any fifth card of a different rank, such as Q, Q, 7, 7, 4.

One Pair - This frequent combination contains just one pair with the other three cards being of different rank. An example is 10, 10, K, 4, 3.

No Pair - This very common hand contains "nothing." None of the five cards pair up, nor are all five cards of the same suit or consecutive in rank. When more than one player has no pair, the hands are rated by the highest card each hand contains, so that an ace-high hand beats a king-high hand, and so on. *ISLAND IN THE SUN SENTINEL MAY, 2023 E*

Tappy Mother's Day to all!

The official Mother's Day holiday arose in the 1900s as a result of the efforts of Anna Jarvis, daughter of Ann Reeves Jarvis. Following her mother's 1905 death, Anna Jarvis conceived of Mother's Day as a way of honoring the sacrifices mothers made for their children.

After gaining financial backing from a Philadelphia department store owner named John Wanamaker, in May 1908 she organized the first official Mother's Day celebration at a Methodist church in Grafton, West Virginia. That same day also saw thousands of people attend a Mother's Day event at one of Wanamaker's retail stores in Philadelphia.

Following the success of her first Mother's Day, Jarvis—who remained unmarried and childless her whole life—resolved to see her holiday added to the national calendar. Arguing that American holidays were biased toward male achievements, she started a massive letter writing campaign to newspapers and prominent politicians urging the adoption of a special day honoring motherhood.

By 1912 many states, towns and churches had adopted Mother's Day as an annual holiday, and Jarvis had established the Mother's Day International Association to help promote her cause. Her persistence paid off in 1914 when President Woodrow Wilson signed a measure officially establishing the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.

UPERIOR

• Lake Superior is actually not a lake at all, but an inland sea.


- All of the four other Great Lakes, plus three more the size of Lake Erie, would fit inside of Lake Superior.
 - Isle Royale is a massive island surrounded by Lake Superior. Within this island are several smaller lakes. Yes, that's a lake on a lake.
 - Despite its massive size, Lake Superior is an extremely young formation by Earth's standards (only 10,000 years old).
 - There is enough water in Lake Superior to submerge all of North and South America in 1 foot of water.

ERIE

- Lake Erie is the fourth-largest Great Lake in surface area, and the smallest in depth. It's the 11th largest lake on the planet.
- There is alleged to be a 30- to 40-foot-long "monster" in Lake Erie named Bessie. The earliest recorded sighting goes back as early as 1793.
- Water in Lake Erie replaces itself in only 2.6 years, which is notable considering the water in Lake Superior takes two centuries.
- The original publication of Dr. Seuss's The Lorax contained the line, "I hear things are just as bad up in Lake Erie." Fourteen years later, the Ohio Sea Grant Program wrote to Seuss to make the case that conditions had improved. He removed the line.
- Not only is Erie the smallest Great Lake when it comes to volume, but it's surrounded by the most industry. Seventeen metropolitan areas, each with populations of more than 50,000, border the Lake Erie basin.

HURON

- If not for the Straits of Mackinac, Lake Michigan and Lake Huron might be considered one lake. Hydrologically speaking, they have the same mean water level and are considered one lake.
- The Keystone State was one of the largest and most luxurious wooden steamships running during the Civil War. In 1861, it disappeared. In 2013, it was found 30 miles northeast of Harrisville under 175 feet of water.
- Goderich Mine is the largest salt mine in the world. Part of it runs underneath Lake Huron, more than 500 meters underground.
- Below Lake Huron, there are 9,000-year-old animal-herding structures used by prehistoric people from when the water levels were significantly lower.
- Massive sinkholes in Lake Huron have high amounts of sulfur and low amounts of oxygen, almost replicating the conditions of Earth's ancient oceans 3 million years ago. Unique ecosystems are contained within them.

MICHIGAN

- In size, Lake Michigan ranks third among the Great Lakes and sixth among all freshwater lakes in the world.
- Lake Michigan is the only Great Lake that is entirely within the borders of the United States.
- The largest freshwater sand dunes in the world line the shores of Lake Michigan.
- Because water enters and exits Lake Michigan through the same path, it takes 77 years longer for the water to replace itself than in Huron, despite their similarity in size and depth. (Lake Michigan: 99 years, Lake Huron: 22 years.)
- Within Lake Michigan there's a "triangle" with a similar reputation to the Bermuda Triangle, where a large amount of "strange disappearances" have occurred. There have also been alleged UFO sightings.

ONTARIO

- Lake Ontario is the smallest of the Great Lakes in surface area, and second smallest in depth. It's the 14th largest lake on the planet.
- The province Ontario was named after the lake, and not vice versa.
- In 1804, a Canadian warship, His Majesty's Ship Speedy, sank in Lake Ontario. In 1990, wreck hunter Ed Burtt manage to find it...but he isn't allowed to recover any artifacts until a government-approved site to exhibit them is found. He's still waiting!
- Babe Ruth hit his first major league home run at Hanlan's Point Stadium in Toronto. It landed in Lake Ontario and is believed to still be there.
- A lake on Saturn's moon Titan is named after Lake Ontario. It's called "Ontario Lacus."


