Here is an important message from Dorisanne Gibson: Dear Homeowner: Eldorado Village Homeowners', Inc., is a duly formed Florida Corporation, registered with the State and governed by Florida Statute 723, "The Florida Mobile Home Act" aka FS 723. As such, FS 723.079 (3) states in part "An association has the power to make, levy, and collect assessments".

723.079 (h) 2. Goes on to state that the financial records must include: "a current account for each homeowner, designating the name, addresses, the due date and amount of each assessment and date paid". We find it very difficult to collect those assessments or get that information as required by law. \$10.00 a year is a small amount for all the work done on your behalf by volunteers.

Many of our residents are unaware of the things we do. The By-laws have been revised as per the requirements in the newly amended Florida Statute 723, we have at least three (3) meetings a year, two for information, and our annual general membership meeting in February. We negotiate with ELS on the amount of the rent increases. The HOA is active all year attending meetings of the ELS Networking Association throughout the state (on a voluntary basis) and dealing with problems as they arise in the park that affect us all. We have a supplementary fund called Neighbors Helping Neighbors, funded by donations from our members and used when necessary to help our neighbors in need as determined by Management and Largo Police. Please consider donating any amount to this fund.

We carry liability insurance which has just gone up to \$1200 a year (at \$10 per home, we need at least 120 paid homeowners and we currently have approximately 55), and have an attorney, Ms. Karen Maller, of St. Petersburg. Over the years we have had occasions to contact Ms. Maller for advice. The cost of those consultations is reasonable given the current fee schedule of attorneys, however, we must be monetarily prepared to consult with our attorney in the future when necessary. Additionally, we have an expense to be registered with the State each year, \$61.25 is required.

The work that we are doing benefits every homeowner in Eldorado Village but is funded by only a few. Our goal is to have at least 75% of our park homeowners as bona fide members of the Corporation. That figure would be approximately 170 homes. As of this date we have 55 homes paid for 2023. Bona fide members are defined in our By-laws as those homeowners who have paid their assessment. Only bona fide members may vote on subjects brought up at meetings, or to run for or vote for Director positions. Therefore, we respectfully request that you contact Terri Diana, Treasurer, Lot # 158 or Dorisanne Gibson, President,

Lot #187 to pay your \$10.00 per home assessment.

huge thank you to the residents that have been out sprucing up the exterior of their homes.



What a big impact it makes on the entire appearance of the park. We have pressure washers out there, freshly painted driveways, cleaned out garden beds, etc. Taking pride in the community is a collaborative effort and we thank you for your hard work. It has not gone unnoticed.

The next phase of our inspections will address parking at the clubhouse. The amenities are reserved for our residents and their guests during the hours of 9am-10pm which is why overflow parking at the clubhouse during that timeframe is prohibited. Be aware that inoperable vehicles, vehicles with expired plates, commercial vehicles, boats, and trailers may be towed. It's important to note that all homes were constructed to accommodate two vehicles. Details regarding the use of a special permit are forthcoming.

It's that time of year when the flowers are in colorful bloom and need to be tended to. With that said, we would like to encourage everyone to review and adhere to the watering schedule that Pinellas County has in place. You can visit their website at https://pinellas.gov/watering-schedule-and-rules or phone them at 727-464-4000 to review the rules and watering restrictions. Please be aware that there are fines (starting at \$193.00) from Pinellas County for wasteful and unnecessary use of water to include:

- Leaving a hose on unattended;
- Hand-watering a lawn on a restricted day or more than once a day;
- Hosing down a driveway, solid surface or structure when another method could be used; and/or,
- Not fixing an irrigation or plumbing issue, like broken sprinkler heads or outdoor faucets, after receiving a verbal or written notice.

We have recently been informed that there are children living on the property. This is a direct violation of the Rules and Regulations of the Prospectus and is an evictable offense. The minimum age to live in the park is 40. Because we have many governing bodies that regulate how we enforce the rules (i.e., HUD, Fair Housing, etc.), our role is to ensure that the rules of the park are being adhered to in a fair and legal fashion. You may confidentially or anonymously inform the office of any minors living here and we will address it. Keep in mind that residents are entitled to have visitors and often things are not always what they appear.

Did you know that you can receive your bill via email? If you're interested in that option, please contact the office and we will get you set up. It's convenient, good for the environment and easy to access for future reference if needed.

PLUMBING EMERGENCIES

t has come to my attention that ELS no longer uses Jones and Sons as their go-to place for plumbing emergencies. The park now uses Dunedin Plumbing and their phone number is: 727-734-2879. If you have any questions or concerns about this change, please feel free to contact Lisa at the main office—727-531-9105.

WATERING:

e are under watering restrictions in Florida and Pinellas County and any watering of your yards or plants is STRICTLY prohibited during the day. In addition, the following restrictions apply and will be strictly enforced:

If your lot number ends in an odd number-Wednesday and Saturday between 12:01 AM and 10:00 OR 4:00 PM to 11:59 PM FOR NO MORE THAN 2 HOURS PER DAY. If your Lot number ends in an even number- Thursday and Sunday between 12:01 am and 10:00 OR 4:00 PM to 11:59 PM FOR NO MORE THAN 2 HOURS PER DAY.

Wasteful and Unnecessary Use of Water Is Prohibited! These are the basic rules from the Pinellas County website: Examples of wasteful water usage:

Allowing water to flow from an unattended hose.

Hand-watering a lawn on a restricted day or more than once a day.

Hosing down a driveway or solid surface or structure when a dry method could be used.

Allowing water to flow from a broken sprinkler head or outdoor faucet and having malfunctioning plumbing/-irrigation system after receiving verbal or written notice.

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




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Violations

The Year-Round Conservation Measures and Seasonal Reclaimed Water Restrictions allow the first violation of these restrictions to be issued as a "warning" Notice of Violation. In accordance with Sixth Judicial Circuit Administrative Order No. 2018-068 PI-CTY, Local Ordinance Violations, and Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Violations Uniform Fine Schedule, Attachment A, Miscellaneous Ordinance, Marine Patrol, Fish, and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and Natural Resources Violation fines start at \$193, and may be doubled for a second offense; and for each subsequent offense thereafter. Contested citations may result in the cost of a fine plus additional court costs. For more information after receiving a citation, please contact Business & Customer Services at (727)464-4000.

Ducks/Wildlife

Please do not feed or put out feeders accessible to ducks or other wildlife. It is illegal in the state of Florida and you could be charged a \$100 fine for each infraction, and it is a violation of the park. Not only that, but if you put out food for the ducks, anything will eat it--stray cats, rats, snakes, and opossums--to name a few. So please don't do it. Thank you!

Smoking and Drinking at the Pool

here is a designated smoking area at the pool and if you smoke, you will be required to smoke there and only there. Also, cigar smoking is offensive

L to most people and is strictly prohibited at the pool. Violators will lose their privileges to the pool, and if that doesn't work, we will make the pool completely non-smoking. Every week, the pool company finds butts in the filters. clogging them up and leading to downtime on the pumps which means the pool is closed until repairs are made.

Also, per the health department and code enforcement, drinking alcohol at a public pool is strictly prohibited. NO GLASS OR CANS OF ALCOHOL ARE PERMITTED. The health department will shut down the pool and if we find bottles in the trash we will be forced to shut down the pool as well.

The bottom line is that this is a community which means that the amenities are for everyone. Please be considerate of your neighbors and follow these simple rules so that everyone can enjoy a day by the pool. Thank you.





Do You Want To Be In the Know?

oving forward, all bulk communications, announcements, updates, etc from the Management Office to the Residents will be made via our bulk Texting system called Text-Em-All. We already have several people sign up, but we want everyone signed so that you never miss any important information about your community. If you have not already been receiving text updates from us, please contact the office right away so we can get you signed up. This only works with a cell phone, however, but I do believe that most people have those these days but if you do not, you could ask a neighbor to be your communications buddy and let you know anytime an update text comes through. If nothing else, let us know you do not have a cell phone here at the office and we will work with you on an alternative so that you stay informed.

Pet Policy

few things about pets I want to point out so there are no questions about your responsibility as a pet owner. Keeping a pet on the property is a privilege and not a right and as such, the following rules must be adhered to or we will have no choice but to ask you to remove the animal from the property. These rules apply whether the animal is a household pet, an Emotional Support Animal, or a Service Animal.

- 1. ALL animals must be registered with the office, and we will need all required documentation for any ESA's or Service Animals.
- 2. Dogs are to be on leashes AT ALL TIMES and the handler must maintain control of their animal at all times, not letting it run up or jump on people or other animals.
- 3. Pet cats are supposed to be indoor animals only.
- 4. You MUST pick up after your pet goes to the bathroom–we do have doggy pots at both properties that have the bags and a container just for that.
- 5. Excessive barking must be controlled so the pet is not bothering the neighbors. I seem to hear this a lot and it is against park rules.



Speeding

There are WAY too many people driving WAY TOO fast in our park. I consider this a SERIOUS NO-NO because we have a LOT of residents riding their bikes or strolling through the neighborhood and many of them use walkers or scooters/wheelchairs and can't move quick



enough to avoid an accident. We also have a LOT of beautiful wildlife roaming the park– ducks, turtles, all kinds of birds and the cute little cotton-tail rabbits we see everywhere–and we need to PROTECT them AND our ambulatory residents.. The speed limit is 10 MPH. I think most of our neighbors adhere to this and it is the visitors who are breaking the rules. If you see someone driving too fast, get their license plate number so we can report them to the office. If it is, indeed, a visitor, they can lose the privilege of coming into the park. I think this is VERY important and so should you. Let us all work together to get this problem fixed!

PS–If you think it may be any of your family members or friends (sorry, but it happens), PLEASE tell them to respect YOU by respecting the rules of the place you call home. Also, please let your company know to turn down their RADIOS when within the parameters of the park. Again, they should respect YOU enough to do this. Thank you!

The 2020/21 shuffle season was supposed to be remembered as the season that we were finally going to defeat the dreaded Embassy juggernaut. Information About Water Shutoffs:

s most residents know, there are times that the water in Eldorado must be turned off to make repairs. There is nothing we can do about that, but there are some things that we can do to avoid trouble.

We have adopted a new system to notify residents in the event water is turned off. This system will generate a phone call to the residents alerting them to the fact that the water is off or will be shortly. If you are not sure if your name is on the park's robocall list, I would suggest that you check with the office to make sure you are on the list or added.

We suggest that you turn off your hot water heater if you are concerned about it. Also, when you want to check if the water has come back on, use the cold water for this purpose to not let air into your hot water heater. You can also turn off the water coming into your home which will prevent water from draining out of it and into the sewer system. Some folks keep a few gallons of water on hand just for such emergencies.

PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE TO ASK ABOUT THE WATER SHUTOFFS! There is nothing they can do to help you.

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


