am flipping through my notes looking for a topic for May. OK, found something, are you ready?

What is our carport for? What is allowed in the carport? Well let's take a quick look at the Rules and Regulations. Carports are for the parking of vehicles. A vehicle includes, but not limited to: cars, trucks, motorcycles/scooters, golf carts, bicycles, etc. The Rules and Regulations also say that there is no storage allowed outside or under homes. Only furniture ... continued on page 5

specifically designed for outside use is allowed outside the home. If you have a refrigerator or freezer on your carport, this is NOT ALLOWED, not only is this against Teakwood's Rules and Regulations but also a violation of Florida statutes. Also not allowed is equipment such as lawn care equipment, tools, ladders, etc.

Recap: Carports are for the parking of vehicles. You may have patio seating on your carport as long as you have space to park your vehicle(s) in your carport with the seating. No storage in carport (that is what the shed is for) including, but not limited to, fridges and freezers (see above). **A reminder of where lot rents should be paid. Lot rent may be paid by ACH (this is where you complete a form and Teakwood Village will submit to your bank for the rent each month), or by using your bank's bill payer system (you will need to set up the payment with your bank to Teakwood Village MHP as payee and your Teakwood address as account number, or you may mail to Teakwood Village MHP, P O Box 838, Largo, FL 33779-0838, or using the drop box at the Main Office on Commerce Drive or at the Aloha Clubhouse (Teakwood Village East the 1st 15 days of each month).

DINING OUT

ara's Mediterranean Market Café (Kabob-House);

Authentic Turkish Cuisine.

I have long been a proponent of Mediterranean style cooking

); style cooking hasizes lean meats, chicken & seafe

as a way to eat healthier. The Mediterranean Diet emphasizes lean meats, chicken & seafood, fresh vegetables and rich (not necessarily hot) spices. There are 22 countries that border the Mediterranean Sea and in the market you will probably find foods from almost all of them. The ones we associate most with the area are Turkey, Greece, Italy, Lebanon, Israel, Egypt, Algeria, Morocco & Italy. You will find a touch of these in many of the dishes on the menu which ranges from appetizers, soups, salads, sandwiches, entrees and desserts.

Recently a friend and I had dinner at Sara's. I made a reservation as there are always a lot of cars in the parking area from lunch time on. When we arrived a little after 6:30 on a Thursday evening there were a half dozen or so open tables. By 7:00 there was not an open table to be had until about 8:30. Needless to say I highly recommend that you make a reservation!

The cafe serves both hot and cold appetizers called "Mezes" We started with Baby Lachmacun (\$16) which we shared. Lachmacun is a thin dough, similar but not quite the same as pizza, topped with minced beef, tomatoes, onion, parsley & spices and baked. You get 5 and on the side are baby salad greens and very light sauce to drizzle on top. It was wonderful. The flavors just popped in your mouth. We ate it all!

Then we moved on to the entrée. My dinner companion had the Whole Grilled Dorado which is served with steamed vegetables (\$29). The fish was beautifully seasoned and grilled and made a great presentation. Dorado has a bit of a "fishy" taste so if this is not for you, they also have whole Branzino & Red Snapper that give you a less fishy taste. Other seafood choices are Salmon Steak, and Shrimp Shish Kebab.







I had Sara's Special Kofte (\$22) which is fresh made Turkish meatballs (had a texture similar to sausage), onions, tomatoes and mozzarella cheese baked in a clay pot. It is served with rice and a small salad. To say it was delicious is an understatement.

While waiting for our entrees to be served I felt like a New York tourist or one of those "Bobble Head" dolls you used to see in cars. Our heads were constantly swiveling as waiters brought out platters of steaming food to other tables. A lady at the table behind us got the Iskender Kebab (\$20), which I had considered ordering. It is a lamb doner (think of the way gyro meat is sliced) kebab cooked in a special tomato sauce over fried pita bread and served with yogurt on the side. My "table" neighbor declared it was one of the best things she had ever eaten. Another table ordered what looked like the Meat Cube Pide (\$22). Think of a cross between a pizza and a calzone. It is fresh-made dough, beef cubes, tomatoes & green peppers. It was brought out on a wooden board and could easily have fed 2-3 people. Then there was the show stopper... the Mixed Grill (\$38) serves 4-6 people and it consists of Beef Shish, Adana Kebabs, Beef Doner, Chicken Adana, Grilled Chicken and is baked in fresh-made dough like a pie. When served, the waiter cut a circle about a ½ inch from the edge of this piled high pie and with a practiced dexterous hand, rolled the dough back to reveal the steaming grilled meat inside. That was a WOW moment.

We indulged and ordered dessert. One choice was the Caramel Custard (\$8) a light egg custard with a slight hint of rose, topped with a thin caramel sauce. The other was a Chocolate Cake served with homemade vanilla ice-cream (\$9). But this wasn't just any old cake. First it was a large square that looked more like a brownie with just a hint of crispiness at the edges. The surprise was the dark chocolate center that oozed out when you cut into it similar to a Molten Lava Cake. My custard was so big I did have some to take home along with some of my entrée. Only soft drinks, water and tea are available for beverages so if you like a cocktail at dinner time you might want to have it before or after you dine. You can request a complimentary glass

of hot Turkish tea or you can order a pot. We had the tea with d https:// pixabay.com/vectors/silhouette-butler-waiter-tray-3187737/inner and it was not overly strong but it did have a different taste than Lipton or Tetley teas we may be used to on a daily basis. They also have strong Turkish coffee.

Our waiter seemed fairly new but he did a creditable job. All of the waiters carry an IPad or something like that and if you really need something and can't find your waiter just flag one down. All of the tables are numbered so they can just look up your table and add-on anything you might want. They also have a dessert and meat deli at the front of the café where you can get items to take home and have your own Mediterranean night.

Ouiche Supreme Deep dish, pie crust, frozen 2 tablespoons of butter 1/2 cup onions, chopped 1 cup of fresh, sliced mushrooms 2 cups cheddar cheese, shredded 3 Eggs 1/2 cup milk Bake crust for 10 minutes at 400°. Sauté onion and mushroom in butter until soft. Spoon into crust. Place cheese over vegetables, lightly- Don't pack. Beat eggs until frothy. Stir in milk and pour all over. Bake at 400° for 15 minutes and then 350° for 20 minutes. Let's stand 5 minutes before serving.

One package of dried lima beans A quarter of a pound of bacon or salt pork 1 teaspoon of salt One can of condensed tomato soup A quarter of a cup of molasses 1 teaspoon of dry mustard Two small onions, chopped



Soak Limas for one hour in salt water. Bring to a boil and cook for about 5 minutes. Drain and reserve 2 cups of liquid. In a small saucepan, combine tomato soup and molasses. Sauté bacon or salt pork and onions, in dry mustard. Cook for about 10 minutes. Combine with drained Limas in casserole dish. Top with bacon strips and bake at 350° for 1 hour.


