National Calendar Day for June

June 14 National Flag Day -

On May 30, 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation deeming June 14th as Flag Day. President Wilson stated, "It is the anniversary of the day upon which the flag of the United States was adopted by the Congress as the emblem of the Union." He also wrote, "On that day rededicate ourselves to the nation, 'one and inseparable' from which every thought that is not worthy of our fathers' first vows in independence, liberty, and right shall be excluded and in which we shall stand with united hearts."

June 18 Father's Day

FATHER'S DAY | THIRD SUNDAY IN JUNE

On the third Sunday in June, Father's Day honors the role fathers play in the family structure and society. The day recognizes not just fathers, but the father figures in our lives. These are the men we look up to who set solid examples for us and guide us throughout our lives.

The first recorded celebration of Father's Day happened after the Monograph Mining Disaster in West Virginia. The disaster killed 361 men and left around 1,000 children fatherless in December of 1907. Grace Golden Clayton suggested a day honoring all those fathers to her pastor, Robert Thomas Webb. On July 5th, 1908, the community gathered in honor of the men lost in the mining accident. They assembled at Williams Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church South, now known as Central United Methodist Church, in Fairmont, West Virginia.

Information submitted by Tina Deveno, HOA Board Member:

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

Section 1. **PURPOSE**. The purpose of this Association shall be to promote unity, coordinate owners, encourage individual participation in the activities of the association, promote cooperation between groups and clubs, act as liaison between members and Management, and to further the purposes as listed in the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE III. POWERS

The Directors of this Association and the operation of the Association itself shall be governed by the By-Laws. Pursuant to Section 723.075(1), Florida Statutes, (The Florida Mobile Home Act), the Association shall be the representative of all of the Mobile Home Owners in the Park in all matters relating to Chapter 723, Florida Statutes.

HOW TO SAVE MONEY ON AIR CONDITIONING COSTS By Terri Campbell

orrection to last month's article: Neighbor Tina Deveno did not purchase a new A/C system from Mobile Home Depot last year – she was checking out pricing only and shared this info - should you need a new unit, a 2.0 Ton AC Unit was \$2,995.99 with tax and Standard Installation is \$700. Total cost was less than \$3,700. The cost may have increased in 2023, but it is still worth checking into if you can save money on a new unit. There are 2 locations close to our area, in Largo & New Port Richey. They sell mobile home parts and supplies, vinyl siding and skirting, carport and patio covers, doors and windows, tubs and showers, steps and rails, etc. to interior repairs such as plumbing and electrical. <u>www. mobilehomedepot.net</u>


Inside the Duke Energy bill for April, there was a small ad that read "Leaky ducts can drain your budget". It stated that finding and fixing air leaks in your ductwork is an easy, cost-effective home improvement that could lower your bills. It offered a duct test and repair with a rebate on the cost of the test and the repair. However, this rebate program DOES NOT INCLUDE MOBILE HOMES.

My electric bill doubled this past month, and my a/c was not working well. I set the thermostat at one temperature but it read a higher temp than the setting, so I contacted an A/C repair company to come and check it out. What was discovered was that the ductwork under my home was "shredded" by critters (bunnies that burrowed underneath and damaged the duct flex run). This is what was causing all the trouble. To have the ductwork replaced was very expensive!

Picture of the damaged ductwork alongside the new ductwork I had to have installed are attached. While that was done, they also checked out my vapor barrier but it was in good shape, thankfully. There was a noticeable difference, after the duct work was replaced, in my A/C performance on the same day.

If your A/C (electric) bills are getting inexplicably and substantially higher, beyond just a Duke Energy rate increase, you could benefit from an evaluation of your ductwork system.

Don't put it off, the sooner it's fixed the better for your electric bill budget and the more money you can save now!
