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From the Board of Directors

Roland Doucette, President

Tello all, and welcome to Summer,

I begin today with a concern that has come to the attention of the Board of Directors. It is one that is easily preventable, yet no one at Blue Jay seems to be too concerned about it, so I thought this would be a good time to bring it to everyone's attention.

We continue to receive multiple complaints, and Board Members continue to notice the number of people who enter our pool without showering. Even worse, many people who use the pool cover themselves with gobs of tanning lotion and then "dive in." Board Members tell me they are tired of "reminding people," some of whom push back quite aggressively, that they need to shower before entering the pool, especially if they have tanning oils on. So hopefully hitting you all with some basic facts will bring the eventual consequences to your attention.

The pool was last resurfaced in the summer of 2018. The cost was \$14,262. The pool was closed for 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ weeks in late June and early July. People literally blew up the phones of Board Members because they could not use the pool. In the fall of 2021 the filter well was replaced, along with the large filters that are required to "filter out" things such as tanning oils. The cost was \$30,953 and replacement filters cost about \$5,000.

We are now in 2023, but remember, our pool was completely shut down for an entire summer during that time because of Covid. Yet if you look at the pool surface it already has brown stains appearing in the shallow end, and the filters, after just 2 years, are starting to show evidence that they will need to be replaced.

Both of these issues are entirely preventable by simply taking a shower. Our pool surface should last 20 years. We have a reserve to take care of it, but at this rate we will be lucky to get 10 years, and the cost will need to come out of a capital expense, which means straight out of your monthly fee, and will be about \$8 per month, \$96 per year. So this is where I usually say "ball in your court." This is entirely up to you. Are you OK with a needless increase of that amount? If you are, just keep doing what you are doing. But if you would like to save yourself some money, it may be time to start taking a shower before you enter the pool. And ask your guests to do the same, as they are our worst offenders.

Next, and I guess this is just going to be one of those months, it has come to the attention of the Board that there are a few (just a few) houses in Blue Jay that have more than one pet residing inside. We know they are in there, whether you believe it or not. And once we have proof we have no choice but to do what is necessary to adhere to our Documents and get them removed. That includes going out to our attorneys if necessary, which will become very expensive for you the homeowner, as you will be required to pay any fees we incur while enforcing our Documents. So if you are one of these folks save us the time, and save yourself some money, by getting yourself in accordance with the documents you agreed to obey when



you interviewed to become a Blue Jay resident.

I guess that will be all for this month (probably way more than you wanted to hear!) Sometimes you just need to rip off the band aid. I promise to be more positive next month. But it needed to be said.

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
