





THE VALUE OF TNVR FOR EVERYBODY

Trap: Neuter-Veccinate-Return [TNVR] is the most effective and humane way to reduce the number of community Citis and reported nuisance behaviors. In a TNVR program, cats are humanely trapped, apayed or residence, vaccinated against rables, and returned to their community to live out their lives. Because they can no longer breed, the number of Citis is reduced neturally over time. Nuisance behaviors are typically reduced immediately and eliminated completely only a month after surgery.

TIPS FOR CAREGIVERS

Help community cats be good neighboric

- Keep the feeding stations next and tide. Remove all trash and leftover food promotiv
- Feed the cuts at a regular place and time during daysight hours and only feed enough to last one feeding. This practice will help the cets get on a schedule and work arract other wildlife.
- Establish a little box or stand area you clean regularly to discourage the cats from eliminating in unwanted areas.
- Provide a shelter so the cats are not resting in places where they are not wanted.
- Know your local laws and ordinances. Protect yourself and the cats by knowing your legal rights.
- Share information with your neighbors and keep an ongoing closed with them. Make surs the deterrants or solutions are working for them.
- Keep accurate records nohow many cets you care for and when they were spayed/neutered and vaccinated.

HUMANE DETERRENTS

SMILLS THAT REPEL CATS to keep cats out of yands or gardens, plant the herb rue or sprinkle drive. The limits Spring toats to a bush or tree branch. Otrus of temon scents, gartic, atemonia, vinegar, coffeet grinds, pipe tobacca, othermeta, are acceledate detair cats as well. Scents dimensity over time, to ra-scolying is necessary.

NEVTRALIZE ODORS Clob Ban, Nature's Minacle, Fission and Simple Solutions are effective natural enzyme products that eliminate existing odors, such as unne. They are available at part supply stores or online.

PLOCK OFF ACCESS Cats seek out dry, warm shetters away from the elements. Bock off access to places, such as under the house or porch, in which you don't want cats. Make sure no cats are inside before doing so. Consider providing another low cost aftertar nearby to encourage the cat to stay away from those areas.

WRITER A motion-activated soringer, like ScareCrow, has an infrared sensor that releases a three-second blast of water when a cat or other large animal approaches. You can find this and similar sprinkler-type repetents online.

SOUND A motion-activated, solar-powered, ultrasonic pest repeller emits a high-pitched sound that repels cats and other animals, but can't be head by humans. Amazon and other online retailers sell such sonic repellents.

DIGGING DITERRINTS Push chopsticks into potted plants. Use pinecones, lava rocks, concrete paver or stones as mulch to prevent cats from digging. Place larger river rocks throughout the gardens or use poultry fencing or landscaping wrap around plants.

PIRDS if feeding birds, do not overfeed. Seed spilled onto the ground brings birds out of the safety of the trees and into a cat's predatory range. Consider planting bushes and trees that naturally attract birds.

July 4th Recipes

Graham Cracker Flags

To make graham cracker flags, you will need:

- 1 package red, white, and blue M&Ms
- 6 full sheets of graham crackers, broken into 12 squares.
- 1/4 cup white chocolate chip or candy melts
- White frosting
- 12 paper straws

Each 10.7 oz bag of red, white, and blue M&Ms will have enough candy to make 11-12 flags (you will have additional blue M&Ms left over). To make about 22 treats you'll want 2 packages of M&Ms, 12 full graham cracker sheets, and 1/2 cup white chocolate chips. One tub of frosting will easily make a double batch of flags.

How To Make Graham Cracker Flags

There are only 2 steps to making the graham cracker flags.

The first step is using melted white chocolate to "glue" the graham crackers to the pa-per straws. I recommend doing this part in advance because you need to let the melted white chocolate set up for 15-30 minutes and that can make kids impatient. It's easiest to just do this step on your own first, and then gather the kids when it's time to deco-rate.

To assemble the flags, start by trimming the paper straws to 4.5 or 5 inches long. Then place 1/4 cup of white chocolate chips in a small zip top bag and microwave it in 20 second intervals until the white chocolate is completely melted.

Then snip a corner off the zip top bag and pipe white chocolate along one shorter edge of the graham cracker square. Press a straw up against the white chocolate.

Place the graham cracker down on parchment or wax paper and allow it to set up for 15-30 minutes until solid. Once the chocolate has completely set, you'll be able to pick up the flag via the straw and it won't fall apart.

Once the flags are assembled, you can gather the kids and start decorating! Just spread an even layer of white frosting on top of the graham cracker:

And then place red, white, and blue M&Ms on the graham cracker to mimic the look of the US flag:

yield: 12 prep time: 15 minutes cook time: 45 minutes. total time: 1 hour Show your patriotism with this Firecracker Cake! The red, white, and blue runs inside and out!! Great for Memorial Day, the 4th of July or any occa-sion you want to share a little American pride!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 box (15.25 oz.) white cake mix.
- Water, vegetable oil and egg whites called for on cake mix
- Red food coloring (see note)
- Blue food coloring (see note)
- 1 container (12 oz.) white frosting
- Red, white and blue sprinkles, optional INSTRUCTIONS

- RECIPE L
- Preheat oven according to cake mix directions. Generously grease and flour a 12-cup Bundt pan; set aside.
- 12. Make cake batter as directed on box, using water, oil and egg whites. Pour 1 cup of the l batter into a small bowl; stir in red food coloring until well mixed. Pour another cup of the batter into a separate bowl; stir in blue food color until well mixed.
- 3. Pour red cake batter into bottom of pan. Carefully pour the white batter over the red batter in pan. Carefully pour blue batter over white batter. (The blue batter does not need to cover the white batter completely). When you add the batter to the pan, do not mix with a spoon. Just pour it in so the colors don't mix but rather, just rest on top of each other in the pan.
- 4. Bake as directed on box or until toothpick inserted near center comes out clean. Cool cake for 10 minutes. Meanwhile, place cooling rack over cook-ie sheet. Turn pan upside down onto cooling rack. Cool cake completely, about 30-45 minutes.
- 5. When cake is cool, divide the frosting evenly into 3 microwavable bowls. Microwave 1 bowl of frosting uncovered on HIGH a few seconds until smooth enough to drizzle over cake. With spoon, drizzle all of the 1st bowl of microwaved frosting all over the cake, back and forth around the cake in a striping pattern. Repeat microwaving second bowl of frosting until smooth. Stir in a few drops of the blue food coloring until well blended. Drizzle over cake, scattering back and forth. Repeat with re-maining frosting and red food coloring, making sure red, white and blue can be seen on the cake. Sprinkle with red, white and blue sprinkles, if de-sired. Let cake stand at room temperature until frosting is set before serv-ing.
- 6. Store loosely covered at room temperature.

Things Every American Should Know About the Fourth of July

The Declaration of Independence Wasn't Actually Signed in July

n July 4, 1776, Congress officially adopted the Declaration of Independence, but it actually wasn't signed until almost a month later. When the declaration was officially approved on July 4, John Hancock and Charles Thompson (president and secretary of the Continental Congress) signed the draft that day. But the official copy wasn't signed by all 56 signers until August 2, 1776.

Fireworks Were John Adams' Idea

When John Adams wrote that letter predicting an annual Fourth of July celebration, he specifically called out one iconic tradition: Fireworks. He wrote that the holiday would be celebrated "with illuminations from one end of this continent to the other from this time forward, forevermore." And judging by the number of fireworks purchased each year (more on that below), I'd say he was correct.

Americans Spend \$1 Billion on Fireworks Each July

According to the American Pyrotechnics Association, Americans spend \$1 billion on fireworks each July. That's a lot of bottle rockets and sparklers (\$15, Walmart)! The APA estimates that price adds up to about 268 million pounds of fireworks sold each year.

George Washington Celebrated the Holiday with Rum

While many of us enjoy a red, white, and blue cocktail on the Fourth of July, George Washington may have been the first to start the tradition. On the second anniversary of the first Fourth of July, America was still fighting for independence in the Revolutionary War. George Washington ordered a double ration of rum for his soldiers (along with an artillery salute) to celebrate the holiday on July 4, 1778.

Americans Eat 155 million Hot Dogs Each Fourth of July



One President was Born on July 4

Calvin Coolidge was the first (and so far, the only) president to have been born on the Fourth of July. He was born on July 4, 1872, in Plymouth, Vermont, and went on to become president in 1923.

Three Presidents Have Died on July 4

While only one president has been born on Independence Day, three have died on the holiday. Presidents John Adams and Thomas Jefferson actually died on the same day, on July 4, 1826, the fiftieth anniversary of the Fourth of July. Later, President James Monroe died on July 4, 1831.

The First Person to Sign the Declaration of Independence Was Never President

John Hancock famously was the first person to sign the Declaration of Independence (that's where the phrase 'put your John Hancock here' originates), so many people falsely assume he became president at some point. Although he was president of the Continental Congress, John Hancock never became president of the United States.

There Are Only 2.5 million Original United States Citizens

Today, the United States has a population of more than 335 million, but on July 4, 1776, there were only 2.5 million people living in the United States. That means the population has grown by 13,200% since the first Independence Day.
