

# TO YOUR HEALTH

## **Current information about Covid**

ccording to <u>health.harvard.edu</u>, here are some answers to frequently asked questions:

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

<u>I recently spent time with someone who tested positive for COVID-19.</u> <u>I'm fully vaccinated and boosted. Do I need to get tested?</u>

According to the latest CDC guidelines, you should wear a mask around others for 10 days and take a COVID test about five days after you were exposed to the virus. If you develop symptoms, get tested sooner and isolate at home. These recommendations apply regardless of your vaccination status. You do not need to quarantine unless you personally have symptoms of COVID or have a positive COVID test.

## How do I know if I have COVID-19, the flu, or just a cold?

Now that the Omicron variant of COVID-19 is the dominant strain, telling the difference is more challenging than ever. Even if you have been vaccinated and boosted, you can still get symptoms, but they are likely to be mild to moderate in severity. For those not vaccinated, the risk of severe symptoms that can be life-threatening is still substantial.

At the current time, people with "flulike" symptoms should assume they have COVID. If possible, arrange to get tested or do a home test. If the test is positive, you should isolate at home for five days. If you had a negative test when symptoms started, it's still best to isolate at home for two to three more days, to monitor your symptoms and prevent spreading infection. (That's because there is a chance of false negatives with antigen tests, which means you can still have COVID with a negative test.) Consider testing again before going out. Once you are ready to leave home, continue to consistently wear a mask for at least five more days.

I'm vaccinated but got a breakthrough COVID infection. Can I still spread the infection to others?

Yes, you can. That's why the CDC recommends that everyone who tests positive for COVID-19 should isolate from others for at least five days, regardless of their vaccination status.

# The "Second War of Independence"


ometimes referred to as the "Second War of Independence," the War of 1812 was U the first large scale test of the American republic on the world stage. With the British Navy impressing American sailors, and the British government aiding Native American tribes in their attacks on American citizens on the frontier, Congress, for the first time in our nation's history, declared war on a foreign nation: Great Britain. Battles raged on the high seas.

British soldiers invaded American soil, captured Washington D.C., and even burned the White House. In the end the Star-Spangled Banner waved "O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave." Known as the Battle of Baltimore, this clash inspired the words of the 'Star Spangled Banner'. Key's song would become the American National Anthem.

Fort McHenry in Baltimore, Maryland, is a five pointed star shaped brick building originally constructed as a defensive structure between 1799 and 1802. Named after James McHenry, the Secretary of War from 1796 to 1800, Fort McHenry served its most famous role during the War of 1812. From 13 to 14 September 1814, the British attacked Fort McHenry. Over 1,000 American soldiers defended Fort McHenry, managing to repel the British.

Fort McHenry is a historical American coastal pentagonal bastion fort on Locust Point, now a neighborhood of Baltimore, Maryland. It was first built in 1798 and was used continuously by the U.S. armed forces through World War I and by the Coast Guard in World War II. It was designated a national park in 1925, and in 1939 was redesignated a "National Monument and Historic Shrine". - Wikipedia
