A GENTLE REMINDER

If you are having an event or participating in an activity in the Rec Hall or the Card Room, please clean up when you are through. All trash and recycling should be taken to their proper place and the room tidied. In other words – leave the room as you found it.

Also, please check your mail on a regular basis as the mailboxes fill up fast. If mail is not picked up for awhile, we will assume you are not here, and the mail will be sent back.

RECYCLING

Please be mindful of what and where you are putting your recycling items. It only takes a minute to break down a box and put bottles and cans in the proper place. *All items must be clean and dry.*

BIG BLUE DUMPSTER-

You may put the following into this dumpster:

- Cardboard Broken down
- Mixed Paper (Newspaper, Junk Mail, etc.)
- Recyclable plastic containers # 1 7 or anything with the recycling symbol on it
- Aluminum, Tin, or Steel Cans
- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Paper, Milk, or Juice Cartons

You cannot put Styrofoam or Plastic Bags in this dumpster.

If you take your recyclables to the dumpster in a plastic bag, <u>please</u> remove them from the bag and put the bag into the regular green trash dumpster. Plastic bags jam up the sorting machines at the recycling center.

CAN CRUSHER

We now have a new can crusher. You can find it in the main dumpster area behind the Blue Recycling Bin. You must clean/ rinse your cans before crushing them, so we do not get a swarm of Bees. We would like you to crush your own cans but if you cannot, just leave them by the crusher and someone will take care of them. Aluminum is selling for fifty to fifty-five cents per pound, so this is a great source of revenue for the Association. Thank you in advance for your support.

WHITE CHOCOLATE MACADAMIA NUT BROWNIES

- ¹/₂ cup (1 stick) butter
- 8 ounces white chocolate, cut into chunks
- 4 eggs, room temperature
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 2 cups flour
- 1 ¹/₂ cups macadamia nuts (three 2-ounce packages)

Preheat the oven to 325F. Grease an 8 X 10 X 2 baking pan. Melt the butter in a double boiler, add the white chocolate and melt completely.

In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and salt until frothy. Add the sugar and beat until thick and pale, about 90 seconds. Scrape down the sides. Add the chocolate mixture and the vanilla to the egg mixture and beat for five seconds. Add the flour and mix until just moist. Fold in the nuts with a spatula and pour into the prepared pan. Place in the oven and bake for 40 minutes. Let cool for 1 hour. To serve, drizzle the top with the sauce.


THE SAUCE

- 3 ounces white chocolate, cut into chunks
- ¹/₂ cup heavy cream
- 1 tablespoon butter

In a double boiler, gently melt the white chocolate. Add the cream and butter and cook briefly until smooth. Let cool a little. Either spoon over brownies or use a squeeze bottle to sauce the brownies.


So, the interpreter immediately signs, "Where's the money? He says he won't ask again, and I think he's serious. "
