** Teakwood is doing lawn inspections. Front yards should be grass. If you were grandfathered a different surface, make sure that you are keeping it neat and weeded.

Teakwood will fine you \$100.00 if the yard is not properly maintained and you will pay an additional fee to have it taken care of by Teakwood.

July is here and it is time for TRASH TALK. This is a review of how to handle trash, lawn trimmings and disposal of renovation materials, etc.

1. Household trash is picked up Mondays and Thursdays. The pickup time is between

7AM and 7PM. Trash is limited to 7 bags per home. Trash will not be picked up on holidays that fall on our regularly scheduled days, and will resume on the next regularly scheduled pickup day unless you are otherwise notified.

- 2. Thursday pickups only: Furniture and <u>bagged/bundled</u> lawn trimmings will be picked up with the Thursday pickups. If the truck takes your trash and not the furniture, they will most likely send another truck thru the Park for that pick up. Please be patient.
- 3. You may call for a small dumpster to be delivered to your home if you have a lot of lawn trimming that cannot be bagged for trash pickup or if you have done renovations on your home and have construction material (wood/drywall/flooring/toilets) that won't be picked up by the trash service. If you have a small amount, you may bring it directly to our large dumpster at the main office on Commerce Drive. These dumpsters are for the usage of our residents only; if you hire a business to do renovations, they are responsible for the disposal of materials.

Teakwood will now be charging a fee of \$40.00 for the usage of the small dumpsters beginning immediately. The fee will be used to cover excess expenses incurred due to people putting unallowed items into the dumpsters, getting a dumpster for such a small amount that would fit in a trash can, and for contractors using the dumpster.

To request a dumpster, call the main office at 727-584-8684 the day before you need the dumpster. When it is delivered, you will have the use of the dumpster for 24 hours. To ensure you are using the dumpster properly a list of unallowed items can be furnished upon request.



uring the height of the Covid pandemic, area restaurants discontinued offering buffet meals. I am glad to say they are back! Here are a few that you might like to try.



AROMA INDIAN – this is one of my favorite restaurants, though I have not yet tried their buffet. It is only available weekends. I have been told by friends that many items from the regular menu are on the buffet, so I know the food is great. Aroma is at 351 West Bay Dr. Weekend hours are 11:30 am - 3 pm & 5 - 10 pm.

Give them a call at 727-953-3887 for more information about the time & cost of the buffet.

COUNTRY PIZZA ITALIAN GRILL – this is not just a pizza place. They have a great standard Italian menu, many of the items are on the buffet in addition to several kinds of pizza and a salad and fruit bar. The cost is \$11.95. I recently dined there with friends and 10 out of 12 got the buffet. FYI – they make the most delicious marinara sauce that is served with everything from their homemade pizza, lasagna, and as dipping sauce for the calamari. Some claimed that the lasagna is the best they have ever had. DUFF'S BUFFET – I haven't been to this restaurant, but I wanted to include a more American style food buffet. From the pictures on the web site it looks like a well laid out, clean restaurant with a well stocked buffet table that includes a variety of chicken & fish items as well as ribs, roast beef, meatloaf, stuffed peppers, lots of vegetables, salads and dessert. The cost of the buffet was not listed but it looks like you can also get an individual meal; 1 entrée & 2 sides for \$9.49 or 1 entrée & 3 sides for \$10.99. LUBBER GRASSHOPPER WARNING

There has recently been a report of large numbers of Lubber Grasshoppers in some areas of Teakwood East. The information I obtained in this article is from the University of Florida,



The Florida Orchid Society and The Tampa Bay Times. The lubber grasshopper is one of a few species of grasshoppers in Florida that occurs in large enough numbers to cause serious damage to citrus, vegetable crops, and landscape ornamentals. They are voracious eaters. They can consume an entire plant's foliage in no time at all.

Eastern lubbers are flightless, although not wingless. They move from place to place primarily by walking but are capable of jumping short distances. Adults of this species are yellow, spotted black, with red coloration under their wings, and reach 2 to more than 3 inches in length. The females are usually larger than the males. Nymphs (immature grasshoppers) typically are almost completely black, but with a distinctive yellow, orange, or red stripe located dorsally (though occasionally they are reddish brown).

Lubbers ingest and assimilate substances in the plants they consume that, although harmless to humans and the lubbers themselves, are toxic to many predators. These chemicals may kill smaller creatures such as birds or leave larger animals, even cats and small dogs, quite ill after ingesting a lubber. The lubbers are capable of secreting a noxious foam while making a loud hissing sound when threatened. In addition, like most grasshoppers, they can also regurgitate a dark brown liquid (commonly called tobacco spit) as a defense. (FYI - They can bite, so if you have had a bad reaction to other insect bites or stings in the past it would be a wise precaution to wear gloves & protective clothing when dealing with these creatures.)

Adult lubbers are difficult to kill with chemicals, nymphs are more susceptible. The University of Florida suggests looking for products with one of these ingredients: carbaryl, bifenthrin, cyhalothrin, permethrin or esfenvalerate. You can also use your hand to sweep the whole cluster into a bucket of soapy water or do the smash-and-stomp — both of which are very "green" pesticides, I might add.





FROM DEE'S KITCHEN TO YOU

Salmon in Puff Pastry

1 17.3 ounce package of frozen puff pastry sheets, thawed

- Nonstick aluminum foil
- Four salmon fillets, 1 1/2 pounds
- 2 teaspoons of seafood seasoning
- 2 ounce of deli, aged white cheddar cheese, shredded and divided
- 8 tablespoons of deli, spinach, dip divided
- And 2 tablespoons of garlic herb butter



Pre-oven 400° line baking sheet with foil- cover work surface with flour. Roll out pastry sheets using a rolling pin into 20 x 24" sheets. Cut each sheet in half. Coat salmon with seafood seasoning and Shredded cheese. Spread 2 tablespoons spinach dip of each salmon fillet, then evenly sprinkle with Cheese. Place one Salmon fillet in the middle of each pastry sheet spinach dip side down, pull pastry carefully over salmon then place seam side down on baking sheet. Brush melted butter evenly over pastries. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until pastries are golden and salmon is 145°. Let stand five minutes to cool before serving.

Crab Cakes

1 pound of crab meat 1/4 teaspoon of Ole Bay Seafood seasonings 1 teaspoon of salt 1 tablespoon of mayonnaise 1 tablespoon of Worcestershire sauce 1 tablespoon of parsley, chopped 1 tablespoon of baking powder One egg, beaten Two slices of bread with crust removed and moistened with milk Mix all ingredients and shape into cakes. I usually go through meat first to remove any shells not taken out. Fry in deep oil or you can deep fry them if you want to about five minutes on each side, or if very brown, take out before that time. Enjoy!
