

n all spiritual teachings there is the consistent message of forgiveness. It is a difficult journey for anyone to learn how to forgive when sometimes our

pain digs so deep. All of us have been hurt to some degree, yet with the many atrocities that have occurred to some it is often difficult to imagine. Yet it is only in forgiveness that we ourselves become free from anger, hate, shame, judgements, and revenge. I have found it worthy to study the lives of people whose life radiates the spirit of forgiveness. If we read about Nelsin Mandala, Gandi, Desmond Tutu, Buddha, Martin Luther King, and Jesus, we discover the deep rooted spiritual understanding and importance if forgiveness. In our own lifetime we observed Nelson Mandala imprisoned for 26 years and when finally released united his Country. Even appointing many of his enemies to prominent positions. When asked why he did not seek revenge from the people who unjustly convicted him, his answer was pure and simple. That stored up anger and revenge would have only destroyed me.

As we begin to develop the heart of forgiveness, we bring that gift for others to see what is possible in their lives. With forgiveness comes deeper compassion, love, and wisdom in this journey of life. Forgiveness frees us from the dis-ease of toxic emotions that can aggravate our vitality and health.

During my own time of separation and divorce, I was filled with anger, sadness, and at times rage. In one particular moment when I felt the horror of my life spinning out of control, and becoming a person I did not want to be, I asked for guidance in a prayer-meditation. How would I live with myself, I thought if nothing changed. Within a few minutes though I heard a voice say, In your deepest rage and anger you will discover deeper love, compassion, and forgiveness. When I came out from the meditation I felt waves of peacefulness as anger and rage were gone. I saw and realized a new vision for my family where healing could be possible for us all. Though it was not instantaneous healing did occur in which that story is in my book, Divorce: An Uncommon Love Story.

The words, forgive them, they know not what they do, has always resonated within my spirit profoundly. Like a muscle we have to exercise it each moment.

Reflections:

- 1. Who in your life do you still feel resentment or anger toward?
- 2. What do you still judge yourself about?
- 3. Do you believe you have healthy relationships with each person in your family?
- 4. Imagine if you felt free from judgment, blame, and no longer felt the need to prove anything to anyone or feel defensive about anything.

5. Imagine the freedom and abundant energy when no longer holding onto toxic emotions.
