If you are going to a shelter or a hotel and have pets, make sure they are pet friendly. There is information in the clubhouse about the new routes and other resources to help you prepare. Please stop in and pick these up. Hope this Helps.

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

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

Resident will then get a reply asking them to respond with their name and lot number, and once done, the registration is complete.

Parking Rules

The Following rules apply to parking at ALL times

All Residents Must Register their Vehicles

- Do not park on the grass ever
- Do not park on the sidewalk
- No overnight street parking
- Parking update: NEW PARKING STICKER POLICY AND TOWING TO BEGIN JULY 1st. For residents who do not have parking decals for their vehicles (maximum of two vehicles per home), you will need to come into the office to get the appropriate parking decal. Please bring in your vehicle registration. It's important to reiterate that clubhouse parking is for residents and their guests during the hours of 9am-10pm. We are implementing a new process for anyone requesting permission to park their car at the clubhouse overnight. Resident will need to come into the office to register their vehicle, sign an agreement stating that their vehicle will be parked at the clubhouse during the hours of 10pm to 9am only, and obtain a specialty parking sticker before July 1st or be subject to towing. As previously mentioned, the clubhouse parking area is not designed for all-day overflow parking. Lastly, you can stop into the office to pick up a yellow temporary visitor parking pass for your guest(s). All yellow hang tags must have an expiration date. The old "permanent" guest/visitor passes are invalid and the towing company has been made aware of this.





Reminder on Trash Policies

- 1. Trash must be out by 830 AM. Bag (in trash bags) and tie all waste, loose items will not be picked up.
- 2. Double bag pet waste and other messy items.
- 3. Try to keep bags at 25 lbs or less. No sharp objects.
- 4. Break down all boxes.
- 5. Bundle all newspapers and magazines.
- 6. Bundle yard waste in 25 lb bundles either tied or in lawn bags.
- 7. They will not pick up furniture, chemicals, old TVs/computers, etc.
- 8. We are still working on a solution for recycling.

Let's Get to Know Florida Statute 723

Q: Some HOA bylaws have provisions allowing the board to remove and replace a director for things like failure to attend a certain number of meetings or posting critical comments on social media. Are such provisions legal? If not, what can a Director, removed under such clauses, do to be "reinstated"?



A: You asked whether the Board can replace or remove a director:

ANSWER: No, the board alone cannot remove a director. Removal of a director requires a majority vote of all members. Removal of directors may be accomplished by a majority vote at a meeting of the members, or by written agreement by a majority of the members. The procedure for removal of a director is addressed in Sections 723.078(2)(i) and 617.0808, F.S., and overrides any provisions in the HOA's By-laws that conflict with the statutory provisions. All HOAs should review their By-laws to ensure that this very important subject is treated thoroughly and correctly. However, officers are elected by the board, serve at the pleasure of the board, and may be removed at any time, with or without cause, by a majority vote of the board without a vote of the membership.

Don't Leave Them Behind

urricane season is officially here, but natural disasters can strike at anytime. Here are some tips for protecting your furry loved ones in an emergency:

In the event that our area is evacuated, never leave companion animals behind to fend for themselves. They aren't any better equipped to survive disasters than humans are. Know your destination ahead of time.

Shelters for human victims don't often allow animals, but Pinellas County has a program you can sign up for. And hotels in our area may allow pets in an emergency. Call destinations in advance and find out which ones will accommodate you and your animals.

Never leave animals unsupervised in a car—they can panic and try to escape or suffer from heatstroke once ambient temperatures rise above 70 degrees, even if water is provided and the windows are slightly open.

Place small animals in secure carriers. Dogs should be leashed because frightening sounds and unfamiliar surroundings may make them bolt. Take water and food bowls, your animal's favorite toy or blanket, a towel, and enough food for at least one week.

Make sure that dogs and cats are microchipped and put legible ID tags with your phone number on them so that your companions can be found in case they get separated from you.

It's too hot for spot

Talking with our dogs is one of life's simple pleasures - and the highlight of a dog's day - but please keep a few tips in mind.

On an 87-degree day, asphalt temperatures can reach a scorching 140 degrees.

Even just a few minutes' contact with hot pavement can cause dogs' sensitive paws to burn. Hot sidewalks also reflect heat onto dogs' bodies, increasing their risk of suffering from deadly heatstroke.

A long hot summer is in front of us. Walk your doggies very early or very late, carry water and take frequent breaks in shady spots.

And please never leave an animal inside a vehicle in hot weather! Temperatures can quickly soar in parked cars, and a dog trapped inside can die from heatstroke within minutes—even if the vehicle is in the shade with the windows slightly open, which has little to no effect on lowering the temperature inside.

If you see an animal inside a hot car, please take immediate action - a life depends on it.

If there's time, go into the nearest building and find a manager. Remember: It only takes minutes for a dog to suffer brain damage when the weather is hot. Time is of the essence!

Politely ask the manager to page the owner of the car.

BE PERSISTENT!

If the owner doesn't show up or doesn't do anything, call animal control (Pinellas County: (727) 582-2600 - put it in your contacts). If animal control can't come immediately, call 911. And remember, if all else fails, do what's necessary to save the animal's life.

According to Florida law (768.139 Rescue of vulnerable person or domestic animal from a motor vehicle; immunity from civil liability), someone who enters a car, including by force like breaking a window, can be immune from penalty for saving a person or animal.
