s inflation and interest rates continue to rise, consumers will struggle to keep their bank accounts full. Consumers are spending more at the pump and at the grocery store. Borrowing money to pay for cars and homes is getting more expensive thanks to soaring interest rates. These are difficult times for many.



Scammers know this. They also know that consumers are at their most vulnerable when they are worried about their financial health.

Expect a rise in several financial-based scams:

1. Assistance scams: Cybercriminals will reach out to consumers by text, phone, or email to inform them of fake government assistance programs. These messages might claim that consumers can qualify for reduced electric or heating bills or that they are eligible for low-cost government meals and utility subsidies. All the recipients of these messages must do is click on a link, send a small payment, or make a phone call. This is all a scam, though. Consumers might click on a link that takes them to an online form. To qualify for government assistance, victims must provide personal information such as their name, birthdate, and address on the form. When they click "Submit," though, their personal information is sent to a criminal.

That criminal can then use this information to take out loans or credit cards in the victim's names. They might use it to access their online bank and credit card accounts. They might sell the information on the Dark Web to the highest bidder. Unemployment insurance CA

- 2. Shopping deals: Scammers will send victims messages promoting low-cost clothing, electronics or groceries. They'll set up fake e-shops promoting brand-name items at bargain prices. Again, though, these deals are a scam. The fraudsters behind them will try to steal victims' personal information or convince them to send online payments for bargain products that aren't real. Once consumers send their payments? The entrepreneurs behind these deals and e-shops disappear. Shopify lure
- **3.** A bit of romance? When the economy suffers, people may also be impacted emotionally. Whether they are struggling from recently losing their job or overall despair from financial instability, some might also be suffering from a bout of low self-esteem. This makes them especially vulnerable to online romance scams. In these scams, criminals strike up a relationship with victims online, sending emails, communicating in chat rooms and buzzing their victims' phones with amorous texts. After building up trust, the scammers, after promising to soon meet their victims in person, ask for money or ask for you to help move money around.

As scammers and consumers get more desperate to pay their bills, we expect to see an increase in scams, and an increase in people falling victim to those scams. So stay alert as you navigate online.



HISTORY OF SHUFFLEBOARD IN ST PETERSBURG

Popular in England as a tabletop game, shuffleboard has been around since the 15th century. In more modern times, a deck (ground or floor) version of the old indoor game became popular among guests on ocean liners and cruise ships.

By 1913, shuffleboard was being played at Daytona Beach as a land-based game, likely introduced by travelers on those ocean-going ships sailing between England and the United States. The game proved so popular that it spread throughout the United States, particularly in tourist and retirement communities, with each group devising its own rules of play and court sizes.

This haphazard setup led to the creation of shuffleboard regulations and rules in St. Petersburg in 1924. The rules adopted then, and later by the National Shuffleboard Association (founded 1931 in St. Petersburg), defined the size and shape of courts, equipment used, and methods of scoring and playing.

St. Pete's historic Shuffleboard Club was founded in 1924 on the northeastern shores of Mirror Lake on property given by the city. The club started out with only two courts and a green bench serving as their "clubhouse."

The sport began spreading around the city. Soon, hotels, apartments, and homes had their own private courts onsite. By the end of World War Two, the St. Petersburg Shuffleboard Club boasted more than 100 clay courts, several clubhouse buildings, and over 8,000 club members.

For nearly a century, the St. Petersburg Shuffleboard Club has hosted thousands of members and served the recreational needs of the Sunshine City's wintering tourists and residents. Well received by enthusiasts, the first state tournament was held on the grounds in 1928. In addition, the members organized a Festival of States Tournament and participated in the Festival of States Parade.

Considered the World's Largest Shuffleboard Club, the club has sixty-five masonry courts,

four masonry buildings, a steel and concrete grandstand, freestanding frame and metal porches, and hexagon block patios and walkways. Over the years the building complex was enlarged to include the bridge club/dance hall, the grandstands, as well as ma¬jor additions to the original buildings.

Designated as a historic landmark in 1994, the club today still offers memberships and the ever-popular Friday Night Shuffle, but it also has become a popular venue to rent for weddings, birthdays, corporate gatherings – and of course the St. Petersburg Museum of History's annual gathering and fundraiser.




