# PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

Board of Directors

s some of you may know we have signs posted by the bridge and near the creek. The bridge is a pedestrian only bridge and you cannot swim in the creek. These are some of the conditions within our insurance policy on common elements. While we have not received any reports of people in the creek, we have had reports on more than one occasion of the bridge being used by people not "walking" across the bridge. Our experience over the years has shown us that even though an "accident" might occur on common elements which by common sense was not the fault of the association it still occurred and our more than happy local attorneys are prepared to file suit and use that familiar statement we are at fault because "we knew or should have known" and did not prevent the accident. Our insurance carrier rather than proceed into court will settle for an amount we may not agree with, however the insurance company has a clause in the policy giving them that right. Subsequentially, when the policy is up for renewal, that same insurance carrier does not forget they paid a claim and the premium is now likely to change. For this reason, the association has now been forced to place bollards at each end of the bridge to restrict the bridge to pedestrian traffic only. This demonstrates the association has taken reasonable efforts to enforce the insurance policy that

states the bridge is a "pedestrian only" bridge. We have moved over the years from "Common Sense" to "Legal Sense" and unfortunately legal seems to win out.

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



# **Bob Raynor – President**

Ime continues to fly by and it's hard to believe that we are beginning the transition from Summer to Fall. Just as we prepare for our snowbirds to begin returning, so too must your Board begin planning for 2024. That process includes preparation of the 2024 budget which begins this month. For those new to BCII, because we are chartered as a not-for-profit condo corporation, our Operations budget is zero based. That means it is created by projecting expenses and building the budget from the ground up.

Reserves are based on projected replacement needs from our 30 year Reserve Study in compliance with Florida Condo Law. The process begins by getting input from vendors regarding regulatory rate projections for water, sewer, trash, electricity, governmental licensing and permitting, etc. Second, we receive input from vendors regarding short and long term negotiated contractual obligations such as lawn servicing, pool maintenance, AC maintenance, Clubhouse cleaning, management fees, insurances, etc. These first two area items reflect our zero based fixed expenses due to their negotiated rates. Dollar wise, that currently totals approximately \$172 of our \$190 Operations budget. Opportunities to save money or spend too much can come from limited sources such as reduced water usage and lower sewer expense. For example, for each \$1.00 spent unnecessarily watering our lawn or cleaning our driveway, \$2.24 is spent to pay for sewer expense even though not one drop of water went into the sewer. How many of us realize that the \$1.00 we may think is just one dollar spent on water is really costing us \$3.24?

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
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The third Operations Budget component is more unanticipated needs based and accounts for approximately \$19.00 out of our \$191.00 Operations monthly fee or just 9.9% of our Operations total. Typical expenditures in this area include pool/spa, water fountain or refrigeration and other equipment failures, road, sewer or building maintenance problems that don't fall into our reserve budget. Other minor items include Clubhouse supplies and truck oil changes or repairs. The difference of \$34 between our Operations Budget and our \$225 monthly Maintenance Fee goes torward covering our required Reserves Budget.

The elephant in the room for 2024 is what all Florida home owners are facing - significantly higher home insurance premiums. Condo Associations in which all property owners own a share of the common areas including clubhouse, pool, roads, ponds, land, etc. are seeing premiums go up as well. Fortunately, we are not a condo tower in which some Associations are seeing premiums jump 400% or more. But we must anticipate an increase percentage similar to at least what our homeowners experience for their personal property. As always, we will solicit bids to ensure the quote we receive is the best we can negotiate.

Our goal is to complete this budget process in September for presentation in October. To some, what may appear as a simple task that includes a rubber stamp approval is totally opposite of the reality. Every Board, past present and future spends a great deal of time with Progressive Management getting expense numbers, analyzing opportunities to save and reduce costs where possible to come up with a final budget that meets our regulatory obligations and reporting requirements while being fiscally conservative and prudent.


