

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From the Manager's Desk:

Board has passed a resolution to start charging late fees as outlined by the governing documents. Please make sure that your account is in good standing and contact the Office if you need assistance.

I would like to go into more detail on what late fee and collections policy is as outlined by the Governing Documents. You can find all this information in the Mobel Americana RO Association, Inc.'s By-Laws: ARTICLE X, Assessment and Collection, Section 10.5

The Board establishes the Association's fiscal year, April 1st to March 31st, as the regular assessment period. Monthly payments are due on the 1st of Month and are considered delinquent after 10 days.

Notice of Late Assessment: On the 10th day, after the initial missed assessment payment, a Notice of Late Assessment notice will be sent from the Management Company*(it is important to note that Florida Statute outlines the guidelines for the management company to follow and management company sends out late fee notices as directed by the Association's Board). Homeowner will be charged \$15.00 for the Notice of Late Assessment notice administrative costs. Please note that Notice of Late Assessment notice will only be sent to Homeowner's who are delinquent one month's assessments or greater.

Late Fees & Interest: On the 10th day after each monthly payment is late or remains unpaid, the Association will charge the Homeowner a \$25.00 late fee. In addition, the Homeowner shall bear interest at the lawful rate (18% annum). Interest of 1.5% shall be applied on the 10th of each month. Late fees and interest will only apply if the monetary threshold of unpaid assessments is equal to or greater than one month's assessments.

TownSquare is a great platform to stay connected and get information. It can be used to look up your monthly fees and pay them, reach out to the Customer care to get assistance with the most common questions and get Association's information such as Governing Documents, Financial Statements and Forms. We will be adding one more feature to the TownSquare work order portal. You will be able to log in a work order for any matters that need maintenance attention in the common areas. These could be landscaping, amenity or any other *common property related matters*. Work orders will go to our team to complete and you will get email notifications with the status updates.

Committees. Board has appointed three committees in July sessions: *Fine Appeals, Planning and Marketing Committees*. All three committees will start their meetings and work in August. Committee meetings are open to all the owners to attend – please be on a lookout for the Committee Meeting notices and participate! We want everyone to be involved in making sure Americana Cove is well run and organized community. Best results are achieved if everyone contributes.

Financials. Board Treasurer, Finance Committee and I are working on streamlining the financial reporting. Financial packets will be published every month and I am happy to answer any questions you may have about the numbers. We are going to be closing first quarter of the Budget (April -July) at the end of August as we have to wait for the bank statement reconciliation. First Quarter numbers will give us a better idea on how are we tracking the

budget. Please tune into the Board meetings – Board Treasurer and I spend significant amount of time going over the financial information and it is a great way for owners to learn more about the financials.

Reserve Study is an essential tool in making sure Association budgets and spends reserve funds as intended by the statute. It is recommended to get Reserve Study completed every 3 years and revisions are necessary to ensure it tracks reserve expenses and contributions accurately. Next reserve Study revision is scheduled for October and the copy of revised study will be published for everyone to review.

Thank you to all the owners who have been reaching out to discuss different topics, bring matters to my attention or to share their feedback. I am grateful to have a chance to work for you and be a part of this vibrant Community.

Enjoy the rest of the Summer and be Hurricane-ready.


Bridge


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

astrological reading and more.


Till next time try and keep a positive outlook, while being kind to all sentient beings as we continue to fully support and pray for our friends in Ukraine.

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Real estate transactions: Your questions answered!

Recently, we've had several buyers ask the question: "How does a real estate transaction occur in Florida?" The following describes a real estate transaction and answers questions about representation and commissions.

Can a Realtor® only represent a seller or a buyer? No. There are two sides to every real estate transaction—the seller's side or the buyer's side. A Realtor® can represent only one side in a single agent representation or she can give limited representation to both sides, as Florida real estate law allows a real estate salesperson to be a transactional broker, which gives specific limited duties to an agent for both parties they represent. This type of limited representation allows a licensee to facilitate a real estate transaction by assisting both the buyer and the seller providing that the agent does not represent one party to the detriment of the other party when acting as a transaction broker to both parties.

Can a buyer request an agent that is not the listing agent to ensure that they are represented in a transaction? Yes. A buyer can request that another agent represent them if they are not comfortable with a transactional agent.

Can a Realtor® show homes that he has not listed? Yes. Since there are two sides to a transaction, the agent would work for the buyer and can show any listing that his client would like to view. This is how a single agent real estate transaction occurs. We have been surprised that we are asked this question frequently as if buyers believe that only listing agents can sell their own properties. That is definitely not the case.

When should I notify a Realtor® that I am already working with another agent? When you begin a discussion with an agent that is not your Realtor®, you should immediately note that you are already represented. It's important to note that all real estate agents work on commission only. Real estate agents are not paid a salary.

If I'm already represented but I would like to see a home that another agent has listed, can I ask that agent to show it to me? Yes. Again, let the agent know that you are already represented, but because the agent has the listing, she will be compensated if you purchase the home. Note that when you view homes and are already represented, your Realtor® should be with you when you view homes. If your agent is not with you, then you are relying on the listing agent to answer your questions regarding a home and your agent would not have the benefit of hearing the information. What's important is to be considerate of an agent on either side of a transaction.

Who pays the commission? The seller pays the commission for both the listing agent and the buyer's agent since the seller is the person listing the home. The commission is paid at closing.

What other closing fees does a seller have? In Florida, a seller normally pays the documentary stamp tax, which goes to the state and is charged on most real estate transactions, and the title insurance as the seller must give clear title to the buyer. The title company closing fee is normally divided between the buyer and seller.

What other closing fees does a buyer pay? Buyers will pay document recording fees and in a community like Americana Cove will pay prorated maintenance fee and share transfer fee. If a buyer is obtaining a mortgage, then all fees relating to the mortgage and the lender will be paid by the buyer.

Why is the title Realtor® capitalized and has a registered trademark? The term Realtor® is a registered trademark of the National Association of Realtors®. Not all real estate agents are Realtors® if they are not members of the national association. Barefoot Realty real estate agents are members of the local real estate board and also the national association so they all have the designation of Realtor®.
