Per the Rules and Regulations, you are responsible for all lines inside your home, underneath your home and the line connecting to the Teakwood's main sewer line (as per this diagram).

As for blockages, we are finding that many folks us the wet wipes along with regular toilet paper. I know that the packaging says they are flushable, but the problem is that they do not break down like toilet paper and will plug up the lines. We have spoken to a couple of plumbers and they said DO NOT FLUSH WIPES. All it takes is a bit of gunk on the inside of the pipes and the wipe is snagged and blocks the whole darn thing. We ask that you do not flush the wipes as they can mess up not only



your sewer line, but everyone else on that main line. Dispose of the wipes in the trash, please. Enjoy Nat'l Chicken month and we'll talk again next month as we prepare for the ghoulies.





Bacon Cheeseburger Crock Pot Dip

11b. ground Beef 8oz. cream cheese 10 oz. can diced tomatoes with green chiles 6oz. pkg of real bacon bites

Brown ground beef and drain Over low heat stir in cheese and tomatoes along with their juices Then add bacon bites (except 2 TB) Stir until everything is heated, pour into crock pot cover and cook on low for 2-3 hours Stir in parsley (optional) and add bacon bits

Spring Rolls

- 2 lb raw ground pork
- 1 tb ginger put into garlic press to get little pieces
- 4 stands of vermicelli -put in hot water till soft then cut into small pieces
- 3 carrots shredded
- 2 tb low sodium soy sauce
- 1/2 tsp sauce
- 1 pkg of spring roll rice wrappers

Take a spring roll wrapper and put about a tablespoon of mixture in the middle, then roll. When you get to the end, wet ends with water or eggs to seal. Fry in canola oil. When lightly brown, take out and put on paper towel to drain and enjoy!
