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

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

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

Tax Testwind II ROC community was very fortunate to have been spared the wrath of Hurricane Idalia.

Special thanks to all who secured their homes and assisted securing their neighbors. On a serious note, when a community is put on mandatory evacuation, the office is on notice to have an accurate list of who remained in the community. Whether the Hurricane was coming directly towards us or the aftermath of tornados, winds, rains and storm surges that result on the back side of a hurricane, that can create serious life-threatening weather issues. Residents are not to return until an all clear is given. In my pre-storm inspection, it was noted which homes had been secured, and who had people still at the unit. Most people stated they were going but waiting till late afternoon to leave. If you choose to ignore a Mandatory Evacuation- please inform the office by email. Should a weather event hit Westwind II, I am required to provide a list of units occupied to the local authorities. It would be a devastating situation if you were missed by search and rescue if this community had been hit by a weather incident. I was very surprised of several who chose to stay without notifying the office.

My email is monitored on my laptop or phone throughout the storm. I have electrical backup should there be a power failure. Please be respectful to the emergency procedures that are mandated. Notices were posted and updates on Town Square worked well. I have a large list of residents who do not have an emergency contact on file with the office.

So good to see all who are participating in the social events being carried out throughout the summer. Great job to Karen Hanafin, AKA "OPG" (Organized Party Gal) for all of her efforts to plan these summer events! Please see Karen's article for names of all the people who helped."

A temporary solution to the heat:- We have moved two additional tables with umbrellas to help with the high heat this area has been experiencing. Please put down the umbrellas when you leave the area.

Please remember the speed limit in the Westwind Communities is 15mph and that all vehicles-cars, trucks, vans, golf carts and bicycles must stop at the stop signs. When using the back gate entrance/exit- if you happen to push the wrong button- we ask that you just push the other one so the correct gate will open – PLEASE, PLEASE DO NOT DRIVE IN THE WRONG LANE-several people have almost gotten hit.

Looking forward to the fall as we may see temperatures get back to normal Florida weather.


omeone in WW ll asked if we could try to bring back our old "Help Out Your Neighbor" that used to be in the "Hi Lites."


