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
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

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

In the event that we need to quickly communicate emergencies or incidents to the entire community (i.e., water shut off; power disruption; etc.), we would like for you to enroll in our free Robo Call Program. Below are the instructions to opt-in to the program:

Have each interested party send a text from their cell phone to (727) 304-4552 with the following message (as indicated) in the body of the text: **Join EBO Res**

Resident will then get a reply asking them to respond with their name and lot number, and once done, the registration is complete.

Parking Rules

The Following rules apply to parking at ALL times

All Residents Must Register their Vehicles

- Do not park on the grass ever
- Do not park on the sidewalk
- No overnight street parking
- Parking update: NEW PARKING STICKER POLICY AND TOWING TO BEGIN JULY 1st. For residents who do not have parking decals for their vehicles (maximum of two vehicles per home), you will need to come into the office to get the appropriate parking decal. Please bring in your vehicle registration. It's important to reiterate that clubhouse parking is for residents and their guests during the hours of 9am-10pm. We are implementing a new process for anyone requesting permission to park their car at the clubhouse overnight. Resident will need to come into the office to register their vehicle, sign an agreement stating that their vehicle will be parked at the clubhouse during the hours of 10pm to 9am only, and obtain a specialty parking sticker before July 1st or be subject

to towing. As previously mentioned, the clubhouse parking area is not designed for all-day overflow parking. Lastly, you can stop into the office to pick up a yellow temporary visitor parking pass for your guest(s). All yellow hang tags must have an expiration date. The old "permanent" guest/visitor passes are invalid and the towing company has been made aware of this.

Reminder on Trash Policies

oing forward, the dump will be open 8-3 on Tues and Friday, and 8-11 on Saturday. We are going to try this to see if we can keep the illegal dumping under control but still giving you all access. A reminder/the rule, if it wont fit in a large size trash can, it does not belong in the dump area. No



furniture, chemicals of any kind, propane tanks, paint, electronics, construction debris, grills, etc...ever. The compactor is for your regular bagged up household trash, the big dumpster is for yard waste and the blue container is for recyclables. ANYTHING ELSE IS THE RESIDENTS RESPONSIBILITY TO HAVE HAULED OFF THE PROPERTY because Valet Living won't pick it up either. If you are caught dumping anything else, that is actually a crime, you will be fined by the county, get a violation letter from us, and we will close the area back up. (we don't want that)

Beginning 8/22, the maintenance staff will no longer be going around to pick up trash or yard waste. Valet Living will still pick up your trash, but all of the same policies above apply pertaining to what is allowed in the dump area and what they will and won't pick up. Everything bagged in trash bags and boxes broken down should be it. It doesn't make sense to have them go back and do the same thing we already pay a vendor for and use up man hours when there are so many other things that need attention on the property. This does include yard waste, you will have to take that to the dumpster because Valet Living does not pick that up. I have faith that this will be a smooth transition, if you have any questions, please call us at (727) 531-9105. Thank you.

ent is due ON OR BEFORE the 1st of the month. A late fee will apply after the 5th day of the month regardless of the day of the week. Rent is <u>date specific</u>, not "day of the week specific." We just wanted to clarify that.



As you are aware, electronic payments for rent will be required effective October 1st. We will no longer be accepting rent payments in the office. Residents' utilizing their banks' bill pay option will need to terminate that service as the bank is simply mailing paper checks directly to the office. There are several options

available to you so be sure to contact the office if you need further information.



Please do not park in front of the mailboxes for any length of time other than to get your mail. (*Note that the curbing is painted yellow to indicate that it is not for long-term parking*.) The parking area around the clubhouse is reserved for residents and their guests to park while using the amenities during the hours of 9:00 am to

10:00 pm. Overflow parking is allowed after the clubhouse closes with vehicles parked in the clubhouse parking area, not the mailbox area. We will be conducting an in-depth parking pass audit in the near future to ensure compliance. Again, no all-day overflow parking at the clubhouse or mailbox areas. Vehicles can be parked in front of your unit all day if necessary, as long as it does not obstruct the flow of traffic nor hinder any residents' access to their driveway. Cars in violation will be towed at owners' expense and without warning.



The Maintenance Team has a full schedule that is at the direction of Management. They are often interrupted during the day by residents requesting help or to discuss issues that need to be addressed. This is not only disruptive, but is highly ineffective as it does not follow established procedures.

Therefore, the team has been instructed to not take direction from residents. All requests for services from the Maintenance Team must come through the office so we can follow the processes that are in place. Please refrain from stopping at the Maintenance Office unless it has been coordinated through the office. We appreciate your understanding.



Since the Maintenance Team will no longer be picking up yard waste or excess trash, the dumpster area will be open from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm on Tuesday and Friday, and 8:00 am to 11:00 am on Saturday for your convenience. No furniture, appliances, chemicals, paint, propane tanks, grills, construction debris, etc. can go

in the dumpsters and must be hauled off property. A reminder that if it won't fit in a large size trash can, it most likely does not belong in the dumpster area. There's an interesting article in Florida



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


