
September 16th was our second round of summer karaoke. Once again a great time was had by all. Raffle tickets were sold and given out and our residents sang their hearts out.

# **COOKING IN LINCOLNSHIRE**

#### **Devil Tea Eggs** Ingredients

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> C dark soy sauce 1 TBS 5 spice powder 12 large eggs mustard

2 TS chili oil2kosher salt13 TBS miracle whip1Freshly ground peppercBlack sesame seeds for garnish

2 TBS loose black tea leaves 1 tsp sugar 1 TBS Siracha orange gel food coloring

#### Method:

Combine water, soy sauce, chili oil tea leaves spice powder, 2 tsp salt and sugar in medium pot. Bring to a boil and simmer covered for 10 minutes. Turn off heat and cool completely.

Meanwhile boil eggs in water for 7 minutes. Remove eggs and transfer to a bowl of ice water let stand until cool.


When eggs have cooled, lightly Crack the shells all over (the goal is to make enough cracks to allow flavor from the soy sauce mixture to steep into the egg – roll them on a kitchen towel will work well) Add the cracked eggs to the soy sauce mixture – be sure they are submerged – refrigerate for 24 hours Peel the eggs, cut a small piece off the wide bottom so each will sit flat, then cut off the top. Scoop out the yolks into a small bowl, mash and mix with miracle whip, mustard, siracha and pinch of salt & pepper – tint with orange food color.

Pipe the filling back into the egg whites and sprinkle with black sesame seed – refrigerate until serving.

# **VETERAN'S CORNER**

Interesting story about the 194-year-old West Point time capsule that was opened this week and originally believed to contain only silt produced a handful of historical artifacts, the academy said Wednesday. Six coins and a commemorative medal were found in the hardened silt at the bottom of the one-cubic-foot lead box that was pried open earlier this week. During a much-anticipated event at West Point's Thayer Hall on Monday, curators, archaeologists and historians appeared disappointed to find mostly hardened sediment in the capsule.

After analysis, the academy said that it found five coins of varying worth and ages from the 1800s. Another coin, a 5-cent piece, was from 1795, and a nearly two-inch Erie Canal commemorative medal from 1826 emerged from the gray, crusty box as well. "The box didn't quite meet expectations," Paul Hudson, West Point's archaeologist, said to the crowd as he removed shards of fragmented sediment from the box during the opening Monday. While disappointed, the experts on stage said they would sift through the contents to see whether there was anything of historical interest caked to the bottom. "We don't want to think that they went to all the trouble to put this box in the monument and not put anything in it," Hudson added.

The time capsule was discovered in May when engineers and public works officials were renovating the statue of Thaddeus Kosciuszko, a Polish-born general who helped fortify the academy during the American Revolution. Following its discovery, administrators and students built much hype around the box. A panel of historians was invited to speculate on its contents, but they did not get the chance to do so Monday. "This is an incredible story that involves so many of West Point's heroes, and many of them are the Army's and our nation's heroes," West Point's dean, Brig. Gen. Shane Reeves, said at the event. "We should reflect upon and be inspired by our history to pause and realize we have the immense honor and responsibility to continue the legacy that Kosciuszko started, and that West Point continues to live up to his vision from so long ago," Reeves added.

*And* the weekly clubhouse coffee meeting at the recreation hall offers another convenient source for paying the \$15 yearly assessment. Look for the LHOA representative attending. New members asked to fill out a simple form that allows LHOA to represent them in any negotiations or potential mediation with the park owner. Plus, contact information allows important email notices and mailing of valuable information whenever necessary. Especially for Members who are not yearlong residents.



#### Plus, these ...

LHOA has Board meetings monthly (posted in the LHOA bulletin board in the laundry/ post office box building) and are business related though members are always welcome. LHOA has at least two <u>stated</u> Member meetings, January, and February (Annual) each year. (*Stated* Member meetings require Members to sign in when attending). Nonmembers can certainly attend though do not have a voice or vote. November, December, March, and April Member meetings are usually town hall style (open to Members and non). Dates will be in the Monthly Voice for both Board (flexible when needed) and Member meetings plus posted on the bulletin board in the laundry/post box room as required by Florida State law.

As a reminder, LHOA has an attorney, often called our legal representative or legal agent. This addition of legal expertise is a true hallmark of LHOA. Unfortunately, there are Florida 55+ rental mobile home parks that do not have a legal agent to discuss Park issues. The LHOA attorney counsels LHOA.

Again, join and maintain your yearly support of your Lincolnshire Homeowners Association. LHOA Membership is voluntary, LHOA does not own or manage the park. LHOA membership is not included when we bought our home or in the monthly lease payments! Join and Support.

# A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox #65

have updated this article each fall in the last 8 years of writing for the Voice. I still feel a need to include this topic again. This article is part one with part two in November. Lincolnshire has experienced a definite change in coach ownership since Covid and now has more wonderful people from all over. Really does not matter where we moved from to live here full time or spend a month being warm and enjoying the Florida sunshine. I hear the word "paradise" every day in Lincolnshire. Moving to a new home and the outside surroundings does create potential for accidents like falls.

When it draws down to falls whether causing inconveniences each day for a week or so, tragic life ending, or life altering injuries always lurks. Just does not matter when simple precautions and keeping our eyes open for hazards. The results can be tough. New research shows fatal falls have continued to triple in older adults in recent years, rising to more than 45,000 fall related deaths yearly. Percentage does not seem to matter where we call or called home. Also, an increase when we are away from home for a short trip or a long vacation. Not good. Not to mention the impact on our own lives, families, and close friends.

Traumatic and life altering brain injuries often happen from hitting hard objects like sinks, tables, and concrete steps. Falling backward can result in a severe concussion too. Plus, the associated hip/leg/ankle fractures leading to a very steep health decline are among causes of *Continued on page 41*

death in older adults who fall. Older adults fall forward. That is why so many broken hips, wrists, elbows, and shoulders plus a nose or two. We no longer fall backwards as we did when toddlers. Comfortable back there so many years ago.

Reasons deaths with major injuries from falls have increased because we are living longer, independently, and living with other medical issues that can affect mobility and sensation. Our sight improves though our sensations of touch (pressure) and movement when we walk around our coach do not get the brain's attention, we had just a few years ago.

Often medications can make us prone to falls. That includes prescription drugs affecting balance. Certain psychiatric medications that can cause drowsiness and vision problems have increased in recent years.

Falling is not 100% preventable though you can get pretty dog-gone close. If you want, I certainly do. That is a great goal for all of us at Lincolnshire or at your home wherever that wonderful place is. Falls can happen anywhere! And do! We cannot fall up from the floor, but the floor can cause us to fall. More on that later (a ploy to keep you reading.)

Let us face the fact that all our senses begin to age, often accelerate as we get older. And the senses do not always age in the same manner or rate. Sight, Sound, and Touch are used constantly to assist in propelling all of us and our movement. When a person's ability to hear is taken away they are tentative. Simple example. You are walking on loose gravel, you feel it through a sense of touch, hear the crunch plus see it. Our pace gets adjusted to slower and bit more cautious. Gosh we are miraculous. Well, I think so. Always did. Next month is part 2 where we look at specific hazards in and around home. See you then.
