Manager's Moment:

ent is due ON OR BEFORE the 1st of the month. A late fee will apply after the 5th day of the month regardless of the day of the week. Rent is date specific, not "day of the week specific." We just wanted to MANAGER clarify that.



As you are aware, electronic payments for rent will be required effective October 1st. We will no longer be accepting rent payments in the office. Residents' utilizing their banks' bill pay option will need to terminate that service as the bank is simply mailing paper checks directly to the office. There are several options available to you so be sure to contact the office if you need further information.

Please do not park in front of the mailboxes for any length of time other than to get your mail. The parking area around the clubhouse is reserved for residents and their guests to park while using the amenities during the hours of 9:00 am to 10:00 pm. Overflow parking is allowed after the clubhouse closes with vehicles parked in the clubhouse parking area, not the mailbox area. We will be conducting an in-depth parking pass audit in the near future to ensure compliance. Again, no all-day overflow parking at the clubhouse or mailbox areas. Vehicles can be parked in front of your unit all day if necessary, as long as it does not obstruct the flow of traffic nor hinder any residents' access to their driveway. Cars in violation will be towed at owners' expense and without warning.

The Maintenance Team has a full schedule that is at the direction of Management. They are often interrupted during the day by residents requesting help or to discuss issues that need to be addressed. This is not only disruptive, but is highly ineffective as it does not follow established procedures. Therefore, the team has been instructed to not take direction from residents. All requests for services from the Maintenance Team must come through the office so we can follow the processes that are in place. Please refrain from stopping at the Maintenance Office



unless it has been coordinated through the office. We appreciate your understanding.

Since the Maintenance Team will no longer be picking up yard waste or excess trash, the dumpster area will be open from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm on Tuesday and Friday, and 8:00 am to 11:00 am on Saturday for your convenience. No furniture, appliances, chemicals, paint, propane tanks, grills, construction debris, etc. can go in the dumpsters and must be hauled off property. A reminder that if it won't fit in a large size trash can, it most likely does not belong in the dumpster area. There's an interesting article in Florida Today (article #8325765002) that states "When a business dumps their litter in your dumpster in order to save money and avoid paying the proper disposal of that litter, they are committing a third- degree felony. It does not matter how much litter, as any amount for a commercial purpose is a felony."

This is important to communicate to anyone working on your home. If you have a contract for work being done to your home, that contractor must not use the dumpsters on property. They will need to dispose of it elsewhere.

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INFORMATION ABOUT WATER:

These are the basic rules from the Pinellas County website:

Examples of wasteful water usage:



Allowing water to flow from an unattended hose.

Hand-watering a lawn on a restricted day or more than once a day.

Hosing down a driveway or solid surface or structure when a dry method could be used.

Allowing water to flow from a broken sprinkler head or outdoor faucet and having malfunctioning plumbing/-irrigation system after receiving verbal or written notice.

Violations

The Year-Round Conservation Measures and Seasonal Reclaimed Water Restrictions allow the first violation of these restrictions to be issued as a "warning" Notice of Violation. In accordance with Sixth Judicial Circuit Administrative Order No. 2018-068 PI-CTY, Local Ordinance Violations, and Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Violations Uniform Fine Schedule, Attachment A, Miscellaneous Ordinance, Marine Patrol, Fish, and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and Natural Resources Violation fines start at \$193, and may be doubled for a second offense; and for each subsequent offense thereafter. Contested citations may result in the cost of a fine plus additional court costs. For more information after receiving a citation, please contact Business & Customer Services at (727)464-4000.

Ducks/Wildlife

Please do not feed or put out feeders accessible to ducks or other wildlife. It is illegal in the state of Florida and you could be charged a \$100 fine for each infraction, and it is a violation of the park. Not only that, but if you put out food for the ducks, anything will eat it--stray cats, rats, snakes, and opossums--to name a few. So please don't do it. Thank you!

Smoking and Drinking at the Pool

There is a designated smoking area at the pool and if you smoke, you will be required to smoke there and only there. Also, cigar smoking is offensive to most people and is strictly prohibited at the pool. Violators will lose their privileges to the pool, and if that doesn't work, we will make the pool completely non-smoking. Every week, the pool company finds butts in the filters. clogging them up and leading to downtime on the pumps which means the pool is closed until repairs are made.

Also, per the health department and code enforcement, drinking alcohol at a public pool is strictly prohibited. NO GLASS OR CANS OF ALCOHOL ARE PERMITTED. The health department will shut down the pool and if we find bottles in the trash we will be forced to shut down the pool as well.

The bottom line is that this is a community which means that the amenities are for everyone. Please be considerate of your neighbors and follow these simple rules so that everyone can enjoy a day by the pool. Thank you.

Do You Want To Be In the Know?

oving forward, all bulk communications, announcements, updates, etc from the Management Office to the Residents will be made via our bulk Texting system called Text-Em-All. We already have several people sign up, but we want everyone signed so that you never miss any important information about your community. If you have not already been receiving text updates from us, please contact the office right away so we can get you signed up. This only works with a cell phone, however, but I do believe that most people have those these days but if you do not, you could ask a neighbor to be your communications buddy and let you know anytime an update text comes through. If nothing else, let us know you do not have a cell phone here at the office and we will work with you on an alternative so that you stay informed.

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Pet Policy

few things about pets I want to point out so there are no questions about your responsibility as a pet owner. Keeping a pet on the property is a privilege and not a right and as such, the following rules must be adhered to or we will have no choice but to ask you to remove the animal from the property. These rules apply whether the animal is a household pet, an Emotional Support Animal, or a Service Animal.

- 1. ALL animals must be registered with the office, and we will need all required documentation for any ESA's or Service Animals.
- 2. Dogs are to be on leashes AT ALL TIMES and the handler must maintain control of their animal at all times, not letting it run up or jump on people or other animals.
- 3. Pet cats are supposed to be indoor animals only.
- 4. You MUST pick up after your pet goes to the bathroom—we do have doggy pots at both properties that have the bags and a container just for that.
- 5. Excessive barking must be controlled so the pet is not bothering the neighbors. I seem to hear this a lot and it is against park rules.

Speeding

here are WAY too many people driving WAY TOO fast in our park. I consider this a SERIOUS NO-NO because we have a LOT of residents riding their bikes or strolling through the neighborhood and many of them

use walkers or scooters/wheelchairs and can't move quick enough to avoid an accident. We also have a LOT of beautiful wildlife roaming the park—ducks, turtles, all kinds of birds and the cute little cotton-tail rabbits we see everywhere—and we need to PROTECT them AND our ambulatory residents.. The speed limit is 10 MPH. I think most of our neighbors adhere to this and it is the visitors who are breaking the rules. If you see someone driving too fast, get their license plate number so we can report them to the office. If it is, indeed, a visitor, they can lose the privilege of coming into the park. I think this is VERY important and so should you. Let us all work together to get this problem fixed!

PS-If you think it may be any of your family members or friends (sorry, but it happens), PLEASE tell them to respect YOU by respecting the rules of the place you call home. Also, please let your company know to turn down their RADIOS when within the parameters of the park. Again, they should respect YOU enough to do this. Thank you!



Information About Water Shutoffs:

s most residents know, there are times that the water in Eldorado must be turned off to make repairs. There is nothing we can do about that, but there are some things that we can do to avoid trouble.

We have adopted a new system to notify residents in the event water is turned off. This system will generate a phone call to the residents alerting them to the fact that the water is off or will be shortly. If you are not sure if your name is on the park's robocall list, I would suggest that you check with the office to make sure you are on the list or added.

We suggest that you turn off your hot water heater if you are concerned about it. Also, when you want to check if the water has come back on, use the cold water for this purpose to not let air into your hot water heater. You can also turn off the water coming into your home which will prevent water from draining out of it and into the sewer system. Some folks keep a few gallons of water on hand just for such emergencies.

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
