A GENTLE REMINDER

f you are having an event or participating in an activity in the Rec Hall or the Card Room, please clean up when you are through. All trash and recycling should be taken to their proper place and the room tidied. In other words – leave the room as you found it.

fast. If mail is not picked up for awhile, we will assume you are not here, and the mail will be sent back.

RECYCLING

Please be mindful of what and where you are putting your recycling items. It only takes a minute to break down a box and put bottles and cans in the proper place. All items must be clean and dry.

BIG BLUE DUMPSTER-

You may put the following into this dumpster:

- Cardboard Broken down
- Mixed Paper (Newspaper, Junk Mail, etc.)
- Recyclable plastic containers # 1 7 or anything with the recycling symbol on it
- Aluminum, Tin, or Steel Cans
- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Paper, Milk, or Juice Cartons You cannot put Styrofoam or Plastic Bags in this dumpster.

If you take your recyclables to the dumpster in a plastic bag, please remove them from the bag and put the bag into the regular green trash dumpster. Plastic bags jam up the sorting machines at the recycling center.

CAN CRUSHER

Where now have a new can crusher. You can find it in the main dumpster area behind the Blue Recycling Bin. You must clean/rinse your cans before crushing them, so we do not get a swarm of Bees. We would like you to crush your own cans but if you cannot, just leave them by the crusher and someone will take care of them. Aluminum is selling for fifty to fifty-five cents per pound, so this is a great source of revenue for the Association. Thank you in advance for your support.





AIR FRYER CINNAMON ROLL BITES Ingredients

- 1 can (12.4 oz) refrigerated Cinnamon Rolls with Original Icing (8 count)
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

Dipping Icing

- 4 oz (half of 8 oz package) cream cheese, softened
- 1 tablespoon butter, softened
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 2 to 3 teaspoons milk
 - Cut 8-inch round of cooking parchment paper. Place in bottom of air fryer basket.

Separate dough into 8 rolls. Cut each roll into 4 equal pieces, place 16 pieces in bottom of air fryer basket. Set icing aside.

Set air fryer to 325 F; cook 3 minutes. With tongs, turn over each piece; cook 2 to 3 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from air fryer. Repeat with remaining 16 pieces.

Meanwhile, in large resealable food-storage plastic bag, mix cinnamon and granulated sugar. In small bowl, beat cream cheese and softened butter with electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Beat in powdered sugar, reserved icing and enough milk for dipping consistency.

Shake warm bites in cinnamon-sugar. Serve warm with dipping icing.

SHEET-PAN APPLE CRUMBLE Ingredients

- 7 medium baking apples, such as Gala or Fuji (about 3 pounds)
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 1 ¹/₂ cups packed light brown sugar
- 2 sticks unsalted butter, melted
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- Kosher salt
- 2 cups old-fashioned rolled oats
- 1 ¹/₂ cups all-purpose flour
- Vanilla ice cream, for serving

Position a rack in the center of the oven and preheat to 425 F. Peal and core the apples, then cut into $\frac{1}{4}$ inch-thick slices. Place apple slices on an 18 x 13-inch sheet pan and toss the lemon juice, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of the brown sugar, 2 tablespoons of melted butter, 1 teaspoon cinnamon and 1/8 teaspoon salt.

Spread the apples evenly on the pan, cover with foil and bake until the apples have softened and released some liquid, about 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, combine the oats, flour, remaining 1 ¹/₄ cups brown sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, and 1 teaspoon salt together in a large bowl, breaking up any lumps with a fork. Add the remaining melted butter to the oat mixture, stirring with a fork until it is moistened and crumbly.

Carefully uncover the sheet pan and scatter the oat crumble evenly over the top. Bake uncovered until the top is crisp and golden brown and juices are bubbly, about 15 minutes. Serve with ice cream.



BROCCOLI SALAD Ingredients

- 8 ounces bacon
- Salt
- 5 cups small broccoli florets
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon cider vinegar
- 1/3 cup chopped onion
- ¹/₄ cup sugar
- ³/₄ cup raisins
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sunflower kernels

Cut the bacon into small pieces and cook over medium heat just until crisp; drain on paper towels.



Bring a large saucepan

of salted water to a boil. Add the broccoli and blanch until bright green and slightly softened, about 3 minutes. Drain well, run under sold water to stop the cooking, and drain again.

In a mixing bowl, combine the mayonnaise, vinegar, onion, sugar and raisins. Add the broccoli and toss to coat with the dressing. Refrigerate for 1 hour.

Just before serving, fold in the sunflower kernels and the bacon pieces. Serve immediately.

PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE CATS

It has been estimated that between 60 and 100 million homeless cats live in the United States. Many of these cats are feral or "wild" cats, the descendants of unaltered tame cats who were abandoned and gave birth to kittens who never had contact with humans. Although ferals are

fearful of humans, they are still domesticated and ill-equipped to survive on their own. Feral cats do not die of "old age." They are poisoned, shot, tortured by cruel people, attacked by other animals, or hit by cars, or they die of exposure, starvation, or highly contagious fatal diseases, such as rabies, feline AIDS, feline leukemia, and feline infectious peritonitis.

Even easily treatable conditions can be deadly for cats who cannot be handled and regularly taken to a veterinarian. Minor cuts or puncture wounds can turn into raging infections and abscesses. Untreated upper respiratory infections lead to eyes and noses so caked with mucus that animals can barely see or breathe. Ferals often scratch their ears bloody, driven crazy by the pain and itching of ear mites and accompanying infections. Others die of blood loss or anemia from worms and fleas. Urinary tract infections, which frequently lead to blockage in male cats, cause extremely painful, lingering deaths if not treated.

Feral cats themselves are also a threat to wildlife. The American Bird Conservancy estimates that free-roaming cats kill millions of birds and small mammals in the U.S. every year.

Many people who encounter feral cats start feeding them, but feeding alone can actually make the situation worse. Feeding ferals increases their ability to give birth to even more kittens who are destined to suffer and die premature deaths. It is essential to get these cats off the streets in order to prevent not only their own suffering, but that of their offspring.

Please do your part, and do not feed the cats.

HOW TO OVERCOME INSOMNIA

If you suffer from insomnia, you know how miserable it can be. About half of all Americans report chronic problems sleeping. Here are a few things you can try to get yourself on the way to a perfect night's sleep:

- Set your body clock. It will take about two weeks to do this. Set a time for bed and awakening that work with your lifestyle. You'll also want to make sure that you're allowing yourself enough time for sleep. Then stick to your routine. Don't take naps during the day.
- Prepare yourself, so that you can sleep deeply. That means stay away from caffeine and nicotine for at least six hours before you plan to sleep. You will also want to avoid alcohol and marijuana, or other recreational drugs, at least six hours before you sleep. They can predispose you to anxiety or depression— and that can turn into a sleep problem. You might also want to try a snack of bananas and warm milk. Both are high in tryptophan, *continued on page 28*



which can help you get to sleep. Avoid fluid intake, so you won't be awakened by the need to go to the bathroom. Exercise regularly (five times a week), and you'll be surprised at how much your sleep will improve.

- Stretch and meditate. Doing this just before bedtime will relax you.
- Avoid the television and computer for one hour before you sleep. These light sources can encourage your body to stay alert. And they can also keep you thinking, which can interfere with sleep.
- Make your bedroom perfect for sleeping. Make it dark and make it quiet. And make your bed comfortable and cozy. Keep the temperature setting at whatever works for you.






