

OPEN LETTER TO THE SHAREHOLDERS OF WESTWIND II

Te who have purchased a share in the Westwind II ROC Inc. have a substantial financial investment in the community. It is our responsibility to stay informed, take an interest **V** in the up-keep of the common areas and volunteer to help whenever we can. The ROC board and all officers and committee members are unpaid volunteers. Our board is elected by the shareholders and any shareholder in good standing is eligible to run for the board. My primary purpose in writing this letter is to educate the shareholders of the procedures followed concerning the agenda for ROC meetings. The agenda is typed up by our property manager at the direction of the president of the ROC. The agenda lists items that will come before the board for discussion and sometimes require a vote. If any shareholder wishes the board to put an item on the agenda, it should be written in detail and submitted to the office. The office manager will forward the written request to the board. The board will then either address the concern with the shareholder directly or place the request on the agenda of the next board meeting. Any such request should be submitted to the office at least two weeks prior to the next ROC meeting. Once the agenda is complete, it is posted on the ROC portion of the white board in the clubhouse at least 48 hours prior to the meeting. We as shareholders have a responsibility to be aware of the list of ROC meeting dates as they are published every month in the "Hi-Lites." If you are out of town, you can call the office and request a copy of the agenda be sent to your email address. If you have a question concerning one of the agenda items, you can email any board member whose email addresses are listed on the inside of the cover of the "Hi-Lites." Now that the new audio equipment is installed and running, there will be a protocol for speaking at the meetings. A sheet will be available at the sign in table to put your name and the item number you wish to speak about. When the item is raised and the President asks for comments all who have signed the paper will be recognized. It is the board's intent that the shareholders have every opportunity to have their voice heard. Finally, I would like to restate that we as shareholders have to assume responsibility for staying informed as to what is going on in our community whether you live here year-round or are a snowbird. With the availability of email and zoom, no one has an excuse for not being informed. This is your investment. I hope you will treat it as such.

Jeopardy Question:

On Jeopardy the other night, the final question was, "How many steps does the guard take during his walk across the tomb of the Unknowns?" All three contestants missed it!

This is really an awesome sight to watch if you've never had the chance.

Fascinating. Tomb of the Unknown Soldier

1. How many steps does the guard take during his walk across the tomb of the Unknowns and why?

21steps: It alludes to the twenty-one gun salute which is the highest honor given any military or foreign dignitary.

2. How long does he hesitate after his about face to begin his return walk and why?

21 seconds for the same reason as answer number 1.

3. Why are his gloves wet?

His gloves are moistened to prevent his losing his grip on the rifle.

4. Does he carry his rifle on the same shoulder all the time and if not, why not?

He carries the rifle on the shoulder away from the tomb. After his march across the path, he executes an about face and moves the rifle to the outside shoulder.

5. How often are the guards changed?

Guards are changed every thirty minutes, twenty-four hours a day, 365 days a year.

6. What are the physical traits of the guard limited to?

For a person to apply for guard duty at the tomb, he must be between 5' 10' and 6' 2' tall and his waist size cannot exceed 30.

They must commit 2 years of life to guard the tomb, live in a barracks under the tomb, and cannot drink any alcohol on or off duty for the rest of their lives. They cannot swear in public for the rest of their lives and cannot disgrace the uniform or the tomb in any way.

After two years, the guard is given a wreath pin that is worn on their lapel signifying they served as guard of the tomb. There are only 400 presently worn. The guard must obey these rules for the rest of their lives or give up the wreath pin.

The shoes are specially made with very thick soles to keep the heat and cold from their feet. There are metal heel plates that extend to the top of the shoe in order to make the loud click as they come to a halt. There are no wrinkles, folds or lint on the uniform. Guards dress for duty in front of a full-length mirror. The first six months of duty a guard cannot talk to anyone nor watch TV. All off duty time is spent studying the 175 notable people laid to rest in Arlington National Cemetery. A guard must memorize who they are and where they are interred. Among the notables are President Taft, Joe Lewis {the boxer} Medal of Honor winner Audie L. Murphy, the most decorated soldier of WWII and of Hollywood fame.

Every guard spends five hours a day getting his uniforms ready for guard duty.

In 2003 as Hurricane Isabelle was approaching Washington, DC, our US Senate/House

On the ABC evening news, it was reported that because of the dangers from the hurricane, the military members assigned the duty of guarding the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier were given permission to suspend the assignment. They respectfully declined the offer, "No way, Sir!" Soaked to the skin, marching in the pelting rain of a tropical storm, they said that guarding the Tomb was not just an assignment, it was the highest honor that can be afforded to a service person. The tomb has been patrolled continuously, 24/7, since 1930.

After we finished eating, I went again to the back of the plane, heading for the rest room. A man stopped me. 'I saw what you did. I want to be part of it. Here, take this.' He handed me twenty-five dollars.

Soon after I returned to my seat, I saw the Flight Captain coming down the aisle, looking at the aisle numbers as he walked. Ten young men left that flight feeling the love and respect of their fellow travelers.

As I walked briskly to my car, I whispered a prayer for their safe return. These soldiers were giving their all for our country. I could only give them a couple of meals. It seemed so little...

A veteran is someone who, at one point in his life, wrote a blank check made payable to 'citizens of United States' for an amount of 'up to and including my life.' That is Honor, and there are way too many people in this country who no longer understand it.'
