Dumpsters – Garbage

fust a few reminders:

Please use garbage bags when possible so that your trash does not fly out of the dumpster, grocery bags are very light and tend to fly when they dump the dumpster into the truck.



- NO Mattresses are allowed to be put in the dumpster, No furniture (recliners, couches, etc..) is to be put in the dumpster, they are your responsibility to get rid of.
- Put everything in the dumpster, not around the dumpster, no one else wants your trash.
- There are 3 dumpsters that everyone is allowed to use. You are not assigned to one dumpster, so if your usual dumpster is full, please take to one of the other two.
- Do not put trash in the blue recycle bins, also no garbage bags or grocery bags in the recycle bins.
- When it comes to recycling, we put out a pamphlet in the newsletter to remind everyone of all the do's and don'ts of recycling in Clearwater (It is different in every county and every state). Please follow the flyer and when you are in doubt, please just throw it out. It is better to throw it out than to put the wrong items into the recycling system. If you need a new one just ask the office, we will be glad to give you one.
- If you have any scrap metal or old appliances that you need to get rid of, there is a junkman that will come to your home and pick it up and take it off for free for you. Ronnie Kitchen at 727-657-4428, He will also come and pick up those items that you are not allowed to put in the dumpster, such as mattresses, furniture, or other large items but he does charge a FEE for this. You can also call a local thrift store such as St Vincent's, hospice, goodwill, or Salvation army and donate to them if the item is in good repair.

Pumpkin Bread

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, makes 3 large loaves, bake 60 minutes

- 2 cups canned pumpkin (solid pack)
- 4 eggs
- 1 cup light veg. oil
- 2/3 cups water
- 3 1/3 cups flour

- 3 cups sugar
- 2 tsp salt
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp nutmeg
- 2 tsp baking soda

Beat all liquids together in a large bowl. Sift all dry ingredients and slowly add to liquids mixing well (electric mixer works best).

Pour batter into 3 loaf pans and bake 1 hour at 350 degrees, test with toothpick and if needed bake a few minutes longer.

This dessert bread is very moist and delicious. Keep refrigerated, can be frozen also.






