# What is Card Bingo and How Do You Play It?

ard Bingo is a game played with a deck of cards in groups of four players. The cards are distributed to the four players so that each player ends up with 13 cards. The player organizes his/her cards



according to suit and placed face up on the table in front of him. The "Caller" also has a deck of cards and reads the top card of his deck. Each foursome looks for the matching card and places it in the center of the group. As the "Caller" goes through his deck, the corresponding card is placed in the pile in the center of the table. When a player is down to one card he stands and if the next card called is the one in front of him he yells out BINGO. The winner of the hand is the first one to call Bingo. If several have that same card the pot is split. What is the pot? At the beginning of each round each player drops a quarter in the pot, all the pots are collected and that total is given to the "Winner". We usually play 12 rounds so bring 12 quarters and a dollar or two for the 50/50 raffle that is held. An ice cream snack is given to all during the break.

This is a fun evening out. Join us and try your luck. Signup sheets will be on the bulletin board in the Clubhouse.

It is important to sign up so that the organizers will have adequate dessert for the break.





any folks disconnect their FL telephone numbers when they leave the park for their winter residences. Many residents have not provided the Office with their up-to-date home residence contact information. It is a Park Rule that you must abide by. This is especially important for the office to contact you in emergencies.

RULES. 3. Under Shareholder Membership and/or Residency Requirement. L. All Residents must supply the Board with at least two (2) emergency addresses and phone numbers of next of kin or friends to enable the Board to alert the appropriate party upon the occurrence of an emergency. It is the responsibility of the Resident to keep those current at all times.

### **Swimming Pool Rules Reminders**

ith the holiday seasons ahead and the anticipation of many guests in November and December, let's remember to explain the pool rules to our guests. It is the responsibility of Residents to tell inform their guests, even if they themselves do not use the pool. Not all rules are posted in the pool area

- Open 8 am to dusk.
- Water Aerobics is every Tuesday and Thursday, 11-12.
- A shower must be taken before entering the pool.
- A Shirt or cover-up must be worn to and from the pool.
- No diving, No jumping, No splashing, No using oversized flotations such as inner tubes and rafts. Wearable safety flotation devices and noodles are allowed.
- No Food, No glass or breakable items. No running. No drinks other than water. No alcoholic beverages. No smoking.
- Children must be accompanied by an adult.
- Children who are not toilet-trained are not permitted in the pool area unless they are wearing special leak-proof diapers designed for swimming.

A copy of the Park Rules and Regulations, a 16-page publication, is available in the office. Residents are responsibility to inform guests of the rules, including the recycling, trash, speed limits rules. Help us maintain a clean, orderly and safe environment for all to enjoy.



# The concept of toasting comes from putting a piece of toast in one's drink.

oday, cultures around the world have **specific rules and phrases** for the common toast. In South Korea, one accepts a drink with two hands, and in Italy, locking eyes is absolutely essential. But how exactly does the word "toast," as in dry bread, figure into all of this? Well, it turns out dupling literal pieces of toest into a drink during calchartions in



it turns out dunking literal pieces of toast into a drink during celebrations in someone's honor was commonplace centuries ago. Historians believe the practice came from the idea that the bread soaked up unwanted bitter or acidic sediments found in wine, thus making the drink more enjoyable. By the 18th century, the term "toast" somehow became more entwined with the person receiving the honor than the bread itself, which is also where the phrase "toast of the town" originates.

Although dipping crusty bread into your beverage isn't a common custom today, you don't have to look hard to find remnants of the practice in literature. In William Shakespeare's *The Merry Wives of Windsor*, the **hard-drinking Falstaff quips**, "Go, fetch me a quart of sack [wine]; put a toast in 't," a reference to the bread-dipping ritual. Lodowick Lloyd's *The Pilgrimage of Princes*, written in 1573, also contains the passage "Alphonsus ... tooke a toaste out of his cuppe, and cast it to the Dogge," confirming that the alcohol-infused bread didn't always go to waste after being dunked. Because general toasting in 16th- and 17th-century Europe was often an excuse to drink heavily, many temperance movements, including **one in Puritan Massachusetts**, banned the practice in the name of health. Of course, these bans didn't stick, and today toasts — sans actual bread — are central to some of the biggest celebrations in our lives.

### **Daylight Savings Time (DST) vs Standard Time (ST)**

#### Sunday, November 5, Set Your Clocks Back

That is daylight saving time? Daylight Saving Time (DST) is a practice of setting the clock forward by one hour in the summer to extend the amount of daylight hours in the evening, and then setting the clock back by one hour fall.



Daylight Saving Time was first proposed by Benjamin Franklin in 1784. However, it wasn't until World War I that DST was officially adopted by several European countries as a way to conserve energy. The idea was that by extending daylight hours in the evening, people would use less electricity for lighting and thus conserve resources.

In the United States, Daylight Saving Time was first implemented during World War I, it was not widely adopted until the 1960s. Today, Daylight Saving Time is observed in most states from the second Sunday in March until the first Sunday in November. The first nationwide implementation of DST occurred during World War II, but it was not widely adopted until the Uniform Time Act of 1966. This law established a uniform system of Daylight Saving Time across the country, but allowed states opt out. Today, most states observe Daylight Saving Time, with the exception of Hawaii and most of Arizona. However, there have been recent efforts to abolish DST altogether, with some arguing that the practice is outdated and unnecessary. Most recently in 2022 a bill died on the House floor after being passed nearly unanimously in the Senate...because the House couldn't agree on keeping Standard or Saving time. Maybe this year's version of the bill will finally pass.

One of the main benefits of daylight saving time is that it provides more daylight hours in the evening. This allows people to enjoy outdoor activities and reduces the need for lighting, which can save energy and reduces costs. Another benefit of DST is that it can help align the schedules of businesses and institutions across different regions. This can be especially beneficial for international businesses and organizations that operate across multiple time zones. There are mental, physical, and emotional health benefits of more hours of sunlight: relief from **Seasonal Attitude Disorder**, more Vitamin D production and a more active social life.

What are 3 reasons why daylight savings time is bad?

In addition to sleep loss, people are at greater risk of mood disturbance, suicide, and being involved in traffic accidents during both bi-annual transition periods. However, experts suggest that long term, there is a reduction of accidents as more people drive home from work in daylight. Making the shift can increase your health risks. "The scientific evidence points to acute increases in adverse health consequences from changing the clocks, including in heart attack and stroke," says sleep expert Adam Spira, PhD, MA, a professor in Mental Health

Surveys from the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) have found that about



63% of Americans would prefer to eliminate DST, and 55% experience tiredness following the switch. But the time transition does more than just inspire mixed opinions, grogginess, and foul moods. Researchers say that the change has long-term negative consequences for our bodies and minds. One poll taken – Pick One for Permanancy, 54% wanted DST and 46% wanted ST.

Here are 7 things we've learned about how changing to daylight saving time affects our lives. MAKING THE SHIFT CAN INCREASE YOUR HEALTH RISKS.

"The scientific evidence points to acute increases in adverse health consequences from changing the clocks, including in heart attack and stroke," says sleep expert Adam Spira, PhD, MA, a professor in Mental Health.

The change is also associated with a heightened risk of mood disturbances and hospital admissions, as well as elevated production of inflammatory markers in response to stress. The potential for car crashes also spikes just after the spring forward, Spira says; a 2020 study found that the switch raises the risk of fatal traffic accidents by 6%.

DST WAS ENACTED TO CONSERVE ENERGY—BUT TODAY IT MAY DO THE OPPOSITE.

Benjamin Franklin invented the concept in 1784, believing that rising earlier would economize candle usage and save people money. Pushing clocks forward to make greater use of daylight during the warmer months was formally adopted during World War I as part of a global attempt to conserve energy.

That rationale is part of what keeps DST in practice, but the theory is wobbly, according to research like this 2017 paper published in the International Association for Energy Economics Journal. As society has evolved, lighting accounts for less overall energy consumption. Rather, extending the use of daylight hours encourages people to use more air conditioning and heating.

Other proponents say the additional daylight in the evening hours during spring and summer are beneficial to the mental health of those who work during the day. That, too, has been refuted—data from a 2020 study published in PLOS suggests that the change exacerbates mood disorders, depression, anxiety, and substance abuse.

MORE AFTER-WORK SUNSHINE DOESN'T NECESSARILY MEAN A HEALTHIER YOU.

Sunlight is the most powerful synchronizer of our circadian rhythms—the internally generated clocks our bodies follow. Spira says while it's advantageous to have more time for outdoor activities in the evening, "exposure to more light closer to bedtime makes it harder to fall asleep at our usual bedtime, and can reduce the amount of sleep we're able to get each night."

We also lose light in the morning, leaving many of us waking up in the dark. That's bad, Spira says, because exposure to light in the morning has an alerting effect and helps us maintain a strong circadian rhythm.

"We function best when our sleep-wake cycle follows the sun. We get sleepy, due in part to melatonin release, when it gets dark. In the spring, when we switch to daylight saving time,

we increase the amount of light we're exposed to in the evening hours."

LESS SLEEP MEANS MORE HEALTH RISKS.

Moving the clocks forward in the spring results in going to sleep and waking up before our internal clocks are ready for us to. This misalignment lasts for the duration of DST, Spira says, and can reduce the amount of sleep we're able to get, to the detriment of our health.

"The consequences of insufficient sleep include decreases in cardiovascular health, increases in diabetes and obesity, poorer mental health, lower cognitive performance, and an increase in the risk of motor vehicle accidents," he says.

FOR CERTAIN GROUPS, THESE TIME CHANGES HAVE A GREATER NEGATIVE HEALTH IMPACT.

Populations living on the western edges of time zones—who get light later in the morning and evening—and people with little control over their schedules, such as shift workers who drive to work very early, are more at risk for misalignment.

Adolescents who get less sleep often have behavioral, learning, and attention issues, as well as an increased risk of accidents, injuries, high blood pressure, obesity, diabetes, and mental health problems. A 2015 study published in the Journal of Clinical Sleep Medicine found that during school days after the time change, students were sleepier, had slower reaction times, and were less attentive.

#### DST COULD BECOME PERMANENT.

There has been some buzz in recent years about transitioning to permanent DST through the Sunshine Protection Act, but Spira is in favor of permanent standard time.

"The Sunshine Protection Act would result in permanent misalignment of our internal clocks with the time on our social clocks—the clocks on our walls, wrists, and phones. That would be bad for the health of the U.S. population."

The evidence of health and accident risks following the change is so great that the AASM has said it favors abolishing DST entirely in favor of permanent standard time.


THERE ARE WAYS TO MANAGE THE CHANGE.

Fortunately, most people can acclimate to the time change within a week or so, Spira says. To make it easier, the AASM offers a list of suggestions to help people prepare, like gradually adjusting your sleeping and waking times, setting your clocks ahead one hour on Saturday evening and going to bed at your normal bedtime, and getting outside for some exposure to early morning sunlight on Sunday.
