RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

BANANA BREAD

INGREDIENTS:

1/2 c very soft margarine

1 c sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp vanilla

1 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp salt

2 c flour

3 bananas (must be very ripe)

1/2 c nuts (walnuts or pecans are best) optional

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Cream butter and sugar together. Add eggs, vanilla, baking soda and salt; mix well.
- 2. Slowly add flour (mixture will get very thick).
- 3. Add in bananas; mixture will have consistency of pancake batter.
- 4. Fold in nuts, if desired.
- 5. Bake in 350-degree oven according to chart below.



the library and in the laundry rooms. Please pay attention to when tickets are being sold for each event, as most activities do not sell tickets at the door so they can have an accurate head count.

Embassy will be doing a toy drive this year; it will not be toys for tots, but the toys will be staying in Pinellas County. There will be a box in the office and one in the Clubhouse. We will be doing a raffle at the end during bingo on Dec.13th. You will receive one entry ticket per toy, suggested retail value of toys is \$10 - \$20. (Raffle tickets will be available if you bring toys to the office, as well as at Bingo.)

Included with your rent letter was a prospectus change that very few people understood. Basically, what it means is that if the power on the pole needs to be replaced (Embassy's responsibility), most likely the power to your mobile will need to be updated to a 100-amp service (which is your responsibility). This must be done by a licensed electrician, with a city or county permit. The main purpose of this change was so that the park would pay for it during installation, but you are responsible for paying the park back. This new lease allows you to set up a payment plan with the Park, with \$100 a month being your minimum payment. The cost varies from mobile to mobile, depending on how far the pole is from your mobile, how much space is available to get under your mobile, tree roots that need to be cut through, etc. If you already have 100-amp service installed, it will just be the cost to get it from the pole to your electrical box. The other part is that you cannot have any sub boxes on the power poles, such as someone adding an a/c unit, dryer, etc. These must all be removed by March 31, 2024. The Park owns 80% of the power poles in the park and many of the power boxes, wires, etc. are still original: there are usually 2 or 4 homes affected by each meter box issue, so we upgrade all of them on that pole when the need arises.

Recycling improperly will result in a rule violation notice: two (2) in a twelve (12) month period can result in eviction. No one can force you to recycle, but if you choose not to recycle, make sure you are NOT putting your garbage in the blue recycle bins. Unfortunately, FL Statute 723 would not allow me to assess fines for the offenders. I would like to thank everyone that is recycling (or not) but putting everything in the proper containers and keeping the lids closed. There are many more good apples than bad apples when it comes to garbage. I am doing my best to educate everyone so that Embassy does not get any more fines, as they can be used to compute future rent increases.

This rent increase was the largest ever, but look at how much groceries, gas, Duke Energy, etc. have increased. All these increases affected the Park, including insurance, water, and sewer bills. If you think you can't afford to live here, check around at other alternatives: it is still cheaper to live here than in an apartment or Senior housing. We are in the bottom 20% of rent fees for mobile homes in Pinellas County. All members of the rent committee were given a copy of the comparison, so see one of them if you have questions (Ron Russell, Little Mike, Angela Robinson and Joyce Latuga).

As the full-time residents know, we have had an unusually dry summer. Grass cutting is now on an "as needed" basis. The palm trees will be trimmed; if you have a dead palm tree in







THE PUMPKIN PATCH

t's the Great Pumpkin, Charlie Brown was a movie and a book based on the comic strip, Peanuts, by Charles M. Schulz. It originated in 1966. Growing up in MI, it was a fall local trip (or several) every fall. We picked apples, took a hayride, watched cider being "pressed", etc. Over the years, cider mills began expanding to add homemade jams, jellies, fudge, caramel apples, apple dumplings, homemade pies, etc. BUT nothing beats that first glass of fresh cider with a cinnamon sugar donut!



If we just wanted a quick trip, we went to Yates Cider Mill, powered by a water turbine. Yates is the oldest cider mill in MI, with early beginnings in 1863. Other times we went to one of the Blakes Cider Mill locations, which had everything Yates had, but offered special fall offerings, such as roasted corn on the cob, rolled in butter, kielbasa sandwiches, corn mazes, just to name

a few added attractions. The only state that has more cider mills than MI is NY (this is an official answer from Siri).

This fall trip tradition has been passed down to each generation in my family. This year I was able to take both of my Great Granddaughters to a Cider Mill. In September I took Delaney, at 5 weeks old, to White House Fruit Farm in Canfield, OH. It was on one of the most beautiful fall weekends that we, as Floridians, do not get to enjoy (low seventy



degrees, sunshine, no rain or wind). The site offered a kid's petting zoo, hayrides, pumpkin picking, food trucks, and a fruit and vegetable retail store that is open year-round. Jerome Hull purchased the acreage in 1924; during the depression, they raised turkeys to supplement the farm. They left the turkey side of the business in 1968, and their son David Hull took over the business. Today 2nd, 3rd and 4th generation family members still run the business. One of the special touches was that they offer small wheelbarrows and several different sizes of wagons free of charge to haul your goodies to your car! Several young workers were doing nothing but retrieving these items from the parking areas and returning them for the next customer.

In October, I took my oldest Great Granddaughter, Lylah, at almost 9 months, to 2 different cider mills (better pumpkin selection at the second one)! One of them was Farmhaus Farms, which originally was Moelker Orchards; the original owners sold so they could retire after over a century of it being the family business. The new owners added "Apple cake", which is an old Norwegian family recipe of one of the new owners. (Absolutely delicious)! They kept things very close to the same way the original owners ran the cider mill, fresh cold (or warm) cider, fresh donuts, apples, pumpkins, etc. The weather was windy and a balmy 60 degrees, but still a nice fall weekend.

If I am not available, I am sure my Grandsons will continue to take them for the pumpkin/cider fun fall day as an annual tradition.



PUMPKIN CRUNCH

(Submitted by Elaine Pepper)

1 lg. can of pumpkin (29 oz.)

1 lg. can evaporated milk (12 oz.)

1 cup sugar

3 eggs

1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon

1/2 tsp. ginger

1/4 tsp. cloves



- 1. Mix together and put in a 9x13 pan lined with wax paper.
- 2. Sprinkle white cake mix dry over top.
- 3. Add one cup chopped nuts on top.
- 4. Melt 1 cup oleo or butter and pour evenly over top.
- 5. Bake at 400 degrees for 15 mins. and then turn down to 350 degrees for 40 mins.
- 6. Let cake cool in pan for about 30 mins.
- 7. Turn pan upside down on cookie sheet and pull off wax paper. Let cool again.
- 8. Can be served with cool whip on top.

PEANUT BUTTER SNOWBALLS

(Submitted by Vanessa Nead)

Ingredients:

1 cup confectioners' sugar

1/2 cup creamy peanut butter

3 tablespoons butter, softened

1 pound white candy coating, coarsely chopped

Chopped peanuts, optional

Directions:

- 1. In a bowl, combine the sugar, peanut butter and butter. Chill in freezer for 30 minutes or until the mixture is easy to handle. Shape into 1-in. balls and place on a waxed paper-lined baking sheet. Freeze for 30 minutes or until firm.
- 2. Meanwhile, melt the candy coating in a microwave-safe bowl. Dip each ball and place on waxed paper to harden. If desired, sprinkle with chopped peanuts.

CHEWY PUMPKIN COOKIES

(Submitted by Gracie)

INGREDIENTS:

3/4 cup unsalted butter, softened

1 cup light brown sugar, packed

2 egg yolks at room temperature

2 tsp vanilla

1/2 cup canned pumpkin purée

1 3/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 TBS pumpkin spice

1/2 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp baking powder

1/2 tsp salt

1/4 cup granulated white sugar

1/2 tsp pumpkin spice

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Start by drying your pumpkin (this step is not optional)! Spread the canned pumpkin on a plate and lightly press with a paper towel to remove the excess liquid. Repeat this step until the pumpkin volume goes from 1/2 cup to 1/4 cup. Set aside.
- 3. In a small bowl, whisk together the flour, pumpkin spice, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Set aside.
- 4. In a separate small bowl, mix the granulated sugar and 1/2 tsp pumpkin spice (the last 2 ingredients listed). Set aside.
- 5. In a large bowl, cream the softened butter and brown sugar together with an electric mixer on high speed for 1 or 2 minutes until light and fluffy.
- 6. Add the egg yolks and vanilla; mix on medium speed until pale and fluffy (1 to 2 minutes).
- 7. Add the pumpkin and mix on medium speed to combine.
- 8. Add the dry ingredients and mix on low speed just until combined.
- 9. Scoop the dough with a 2 TBS cookie scoop and roll them into balls. Roll the dough balls into the pumpkin spice sugar mix. (If the dough is too sticky you can put it in the refrigerator for 10 minutes and then proceed.)
- 10. Place the cookie dough balls 2 inches apart on baking sheets.
- 11. Bake the cookies 12-14 minutes (12 minutes for a chewy cookie or 14 minutes for a slightly crispier cookie). When the cookies are done baking the centers should be slightly puffy. As they cool the centers will fall and the cookie will look 'wrinkly'.
- 12. Let the cookies cool on the baking sheet for 5 minutes, then transfer to a cooling rack to finish cooling. They are best when they have cooled for at least 15 minutes.



GAIN WITHOUT THE PAIN

any of us tell ourselves almost daily that we need to get out and exercise more. Perhaps we tell ourselves that we will get out and walk for a few (30) minutes each day. But



the first time it is raining, or the temperature has risen/fall to an unbearable level, we decide to skip it and our good intentions are soon forgotten. What's that you say? Yoga pants just aren't your style? You don't need them. Just make sure that whatever you wear is loose (but not falling off) and comfortable ... shorts or sweatpants with a baggy t-shirt works just fine. Footwear may be a bit trickier. I wore Crocs but most of the other attendees wore tennis shoes. Again, whatever you wear should be comfortable for YOU.

Bad knees? Sore shoulders? Arthritis in the hip? Again, not a problem. You need only do the exercises you want to do, and no one will judge you. We all have physical limitations, so we understand. And it really is true what they say, "Use it or lose it." I, myself, discovered that a few minutes a day on a stationary bike (or 3-wheeler outdoors) has improved my mobility immensely.

So, you are running out of excuses. Put on those comfy shorts and t-shirt and join us for the next class. You never know You might enjoy it!

BACKGROUND: Elaine Pepper has led exercise classes here at Embassy for the last 14 years (Minus the COVID isolation months). Upon her retirement, Elaine decided she was going to take full advantage of her gym membership and even engaged a personal trainer to develop her fitness routine. She has taken Zoomba, Jazzercise and aerobics classes gleaning which exercises would be most beneficial to seniors. Elaine also teaches classes in Ohio during the summer months so she doesn't lose her flexibility from inactivity. And she is always on the lookout for new routines or movements that she can incorporate into her classes at Embassy.

AN AMERICAN THANKSGIVING

hanksgiving is a cherished American holiday, marked by a bountiful feast and expressions of gratitude. Its origins can be traced back to the early 17th century when English Pilgrims arrived at Plymouth, Massachusetts, in 1620. These early settlers faced harsh conditions, unfamiliar terrain, and
