

BIG BLUE DUMPSTER-

You may put the following into this dumpster:

- Cardboard Broken down
- Mixed Paper (Newspaper, Junk Mail, etc.)
- Recyclable plastic containers # 1 7 or anything with the recycling symbol on it

- Aluminum, Tin, or Steel Cans
- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Paper, Milk, or Juice Cartons

You cannot put Styrofoam or Plastic Bags in this dumpster.

If you take your recyclables to the dumpster in a plastic bag, <u>please</u> remove them from the bag and put the bag into the regular green trash dumpster. Plastic bags jam up the sorting machines at the recycling center.

CAN CRUSHER

The can crusher can be found in the main dumpster area behind the Blue Recycling Bin. You must clean/rinse your cans before crushing them, so we do not get a swarm of Bees. We would like you to crush your own cans but if you cannot, just leave them by the crusher and someone will take care of them. Aluminum is selling for fifty to fifty-five cents per pound, so this is a great source of revenue for the Association. Thank you in advance for your support.



EASY CRESCENT TACO BAKE

Ingredients

- 1 can (8 oz) refrigerated Crescent Rolls (8 Count)
- 1 lb. lean (at least 80%) ground beef
- ³/₄ cup Thick 'n Chunky salsa
- 2 tablespoons taco seasoning mix (from 1-oz package)
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese (4 oz)

Heat oven to 375°F. Unroll dough; separate it into 8 triangles. Place in ungreased 9-inch square pan or 10-inch pie plate; press over bottom and up sides to form crust.

In a 10-inch skillet, cook beef over medium heat 8 to 10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until thoroughly cooked; drain. Stir in salsa and taco seasoning mix; simmer 5 minutes. Spoon meat mixture in crust-lined pan; sprinkle with cheese.

Bake 14 to 17 minutes or until the crust is deep golden brown and cheese is melted. Served topped with lettuce and tomato, if desired.



MEATBALL STROGANOFF PASTA CASSEROLE

Ingredients

- 1 bag (12 oz) uncooked extra-wide egg noodles (about 7 cups)
- ¹/₄ cup butter
- 2 packages (8 oz each) white mushrooms, sliced
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped onion
- ¹/₄ cup all-purpose flour
- 1 carton (32 oz) beef flavored broth
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt
- ¹/₄ teaspoon pepper
- 4 oz cream cheese, softened and cut into small cubes
- ¹/₄ cup heavy whipping cream
- 1 package (22 oz) frozen cooked beef meatballs, thawed
- Chopped Italian (flat-leaf) parsley, if desired

Heat oven to 375°F. Spray 13x9-inch (3-quart) baking dish with cooking spray; set aside. Cook and drain noodles as directed on package, using minimum cooking time. Drain; set aside.

Meanwhile, in a 12-inch skillet, melt butter over medium-high heat. Add mushrooms and onion; cook 3 to 5 minutes, stirring occasionally, until onions are tender. Sprinkle flour on top of mushrooms and onions; stir well. Gradually stir in beef broth; add Worcestershire sauce, salt, and pepper.

Heat to simmering, stirring occasionally; cook 3 to 5 minutes or until mixture is slightly thickened. Stir cream cheese into hot broth mixture, stirring constantly with whisk until cream cheese is mostly incorporated (small pieces of cream cheese may remain but will incorporate in baking). Remove from heat; stir in whipping cream.

In baking dish, add noodles, sauce, and meatballs, carefully mixing to coat. Cover: bake 30 to 35 minutes or until sauce is bubbling and casserole is heated through. Stir; cool 10 minutes. Stir before serving, garnish with parsley.

CHOCOLATE-PEANUT BUTTER COOKIE PIE

Ingredients

- 1 roll (16.5 oz) refrigerated Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough
- 3 cups powdered sugar
- 1 cup peanut butter
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, softened
- ¹/₄ cup water
- 1 cup milk chocolate chips, melted
- 16 pecan halves, if desired

Heat oven to 350°F. In bottom of ungreased 10- or 9-inch springform pan, break up cookie dough. With floured fingers, press dough evenly in bottom of pan. (DO NOT EAT RAW COOKIE DOUGH AFTER PRESSING DOUGH IN PAN WITH FLOURED FINGERS.) Bake 14 to 18 minutes or until golden brown. Cool for 15 minutes.

In medium bowl, mix powdered sugar, peanut butter, butter and water until well blended. (If necessary, add additional water 1 teaspoon at a time until mixture is smooth.) Drop spoonful's of mixture over baked cookie crust; press evenly to cover crust.

Spread melted chocolate chips over peanut butter mixture. If desired, carefully swirl chocolate with a fork. Garnish with pecan halves. Refrigerate for 1 hour or until chocolate is set.

INQUIRING MINDS WANT TO KNOW...maybe FUN FACTS ABOUT THANKSGIVING

ere are nine fun facts about Thanksgiving to share around the dinner table.

- The first Thanksgiving was celebrated in 1621 over a three-day harvest festival. It included 50 Pilgrims, 90 Wampanoag Indians, and lasted three days. It is believed by historians that only five women were present.
- Turkey wasn't on the menu at the first Thanksgiving. Venison, duck, goose, oysters, lobster, eel, and fish were likely served, alongside pumpkins and cranberries (but not pumpkin pie or cranberry sauce!).
- Abraham Lincoln proclaimed Thanksgiving a national holiday on October 3, 1863. Sarah Josepha Hale, the woman who wrote "Mary Had a Little Lamb," convinced Lincoln to make Thanksgiving a national holiday after writing letters for 17 years.
- The history of U.S. presidents pardoning turkeys is patchy. Harry Truman is often credited with being the first president to pardon a turkey, but that's not quite true. He was the first to receive a ceremonial turkey from the National Turkey Federation and he had it for dinner. John F. Kennedy was the first to let a Thanksgiving turkey go, followed by Richard Nixon *continued on page 28*







who sent his turkey to a petting zoo. George H.W. Bush is the president who formalized the turkey pardoning tradition in 1989.

- There are four towns in the United States named "Turkey." They can be found in Arizona, Texas, Louisiana, and North Carolina.
- The average number of calories consumed on Thanksgiving is 4,500.
- Butterball answers more than 100,000 turkey-cooking questions via their Butterball Turkey Hotline each November and December.
- The tradition of football on Thanksgiving began in 1876 with a game between Yale and Princeton. The first NFL games were played on Thanksgiving in 1920. *adapted from World Strides Educational Travel & Experiences*


