MONTHLY MAINTENANCE FEE

A

s an owner in Briar Creek Phase#1 you pay a Monthly Maintenance Fee. Have you ever asked yourself any of the following questions:

Why do I pay a Maintenance Fee?

What is the money used for?

Why does it seem that it goes up each Year?

Each year, as mandated by the By-Laws for Briar Creek, the Board of Directors prepares a Budget for the next fiscal year's common expenses. The Budget is a zero-based budget meaning that Expenses must equal Revenue. The Monthly Maintenance Fee is used to pay for the common expenses of the Association. Listed below I have broken down the FY2024 Monthly Maintenance Fee of \$211.00 by category.

Breakdown of expense categories by specific type of expense:

<u>ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES</u> – These consist of Management and Office Expense.

<u>UTILITY EXPENSES</u> – Included in this category are: Electric, Water, Sewer, Storm Water and Trash. These expenses account for 58% of our Total Expenses.

<u>REPAIR & MAINTENANCE</u> – Expenses for Repair of: Water & Sewer Lines, Roads & Grounds, Buildings, Pool, and Trees.

<u>LEGAL & INSURANCE</u> – Legal Expenses and Insurance for Buildings and our Truck.

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<u>LAWN SERVICE</u> – Expenses for lawn mowing, pesticide control and sprinkler maintenance. This expense accounts for 12.3% of our Total Expenses.

<u>FACILITIES MAINTENANCE</u> – Included in this category are: Clubhouse Expenses—Cleaning, Pest Control, Air Conditioner Maintenance and Fire Extinguisher & Emergency Lights Maintenance. Also included in this category are: Buildings Roof Inspection and Maintenance and Pool Cleaning and Maintenance.

<u>RESERVE/DEFERRED MAINTENANCE</u> – Funds set aside for future replacement of facilities such as Roads, Building Air Conditioners, Pool Equipment, Major Water & Sewer Lines repair or replacement, etc.

As you can see, Utility Expenses and Lawn Service account for 70% of our Total Expenses and these expenses are managed by either the City or County or private companies and we are subject to rate increases set by them. We do have control of the amount of water and electricity we use, so remember that when you decide to water your lawn or plants to turn off your sprinklers in a timely manner. If water from your sprinklers is running down the road then you have over watered your lawn or plants!

This year's Monthly Maintenance Fee increased by \$11.00 due to the following: Sewer – usage increased by 3% and rate is forecasted to increase 5% starting in October 2024

Insurance – Rate forecasted to increase by 30% in FY2024

Lawn Service – Cost increased 7%

Facilities Maintenance – Increases in Pool Cleaning and Clubhouse Cleaning

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

The 've all seen utility trucks come in to BC and workers insert different color flags in the ground indicating specific utility locations. All too often, it seems those flags stay in the ground for months on end and we wonder what work is being done and when will those flags ever be gone. So where do we start.

For digging projects large and small, Florida law states that property owners and excavators MUST call 811 or go to "sunshine811.com" at least two full business days prior to digging to ensure underground utility lines are marked at the dig site.

Sometimes the owner makes the 811 call but more frequently, it's the specific vendor that's doing the work that completes this requirement. Once the permit for the digging is issued, there is a 30 day expiration date after which, if the work is not completed, the permit must be renewed.

Prior to the work beginning, it is necessary to mark underground utility lines using color codes before construction or digging. The required color codes are:

Blue: Water Yellow: Gas/Oil

Green: Sewer Orange: Communication/Telephone/Cable TV

Lavender: Reclaimed Water Pink: Temporary Survey Markings Red: Electric White: Proposed Excavation

When we work with a contractor directly, we normally know what is going on and why. The problem we most frequently encounter is when a utility simply shows up without notice and starts placing flags in our yard(s). In Florida, each homeowner is subject to a designated parcel of land that gives utility companies the right to access private property for the good of the community. For example, a utility company has the right to dig and bury updated power lines or telephone/internet cables.

Because much of the digging work is completed by companies contracted by companies such as Duke, Spectrum, WOW, etc., homeowners are not always informed when the digging is complete. That's when we find flags still in yards for, sometimes, up to several months. This is frustrating for us as flagged lawns are not mowed or maintained.

Here is the recommendation for owners going forward. Take note of when flags are planted in your yard and note when work begins. After 30 days, if the flags still are in the ground, call 811 to check on the dig status. If the permitted work has been done, remove the flags. If the permit for the work has been renewed, note the date and repeat this process. While you may be asked for and don't have a permit number, providing your address should be sufficient.



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

WATER/SEWER CONSERVATION PROGRAM FOR BRIAR CREEK II

The Board

ur Phase II water/sewer estimated costs for 2023 are \$163,260. The budgeted 2024 water/sewer costs are \$174,684 due to forecasted rate increases. One water saving initiative to help control costs is to offer a voluntary service of detecting water leakage

by testing water pressure. Locating water leakage is a very important issue to consider and we should be actively working towards monitoring to help lower our monthly expenditures.

This project initiative is the idea of Bill Russo who has generously agreed to Chair this program and work with volunteers and residents who would like to participate. He has worked hard to formalize this program which was discussed at our October, Phase II Board Meeting. Bill and his team will be reaching out to residents or you can feel free to contact him by calling him at (406) 980-0838.

Bill and his team plan to begin offering a free water leakage test for our residents beginning in mid-December 2023. The test is totally optional and there is no requirement for residents to participate in this program if they chose not to. Our resident team of testers will be contacting homeowners to offer this leakage test. It will work like this: The testing will be performed outside your home only.

We will need to turn off your outside main "water shut off valve" for 10-15 minutes to perform the test. A written Inspection Sheet will be left in your rock box informing you of the results of the test. Because this test detects leaks within the home, it is the homeowner's responsibility to take corrective action to repair the leak.

This water/sewer conservation program, again, while voluntary, should benefit us all and, hopefully, cut down our water/sewer costs. Thank you for your help and cooperation with this conservation program.
