Message from the Board of Directors

Budget 2024/25 - Utilities

or the fiscal year April 1, 2024, to March 31, 2025, we are forecasting Operating Costs for the Association at about\$ 2.8 million. Five items make up over \$ 2.2 million of that total:

To no one's surprise, inflation in our insurance costs is extreme. \$300,000 reflects an increase of 26% over last year, which was up 40% from the year before. We are reviewing our insurance policy with our broker to help reduce costs.

Reserve Fund Contribution recommended increase is about 23% based on inflation and our updated reserve study conducted in October 2023. Landscaping is unchanged from last year. However, we continue to see our aging infrastructure require needed repair. Examples include sewer and electrical systems.

That leaves us with the elephant in the room—Utilities. Our utility costs continue to rise, the bulk of our utility charges come from the City for water & sewer (\$325,000), storm water management (\$150,000) and trash & recycling pick-up (\$115,000). There is also another \$100,000 for electricity and gas.

Utility costs represent about \$90 of the monthly assessment fee (26%). Anything that we can do to reduce this cost is important. The price of water & sewer is driven by the gallons of water that we purchase (one gallon in is assumed to equal one gallon out). On the consumption side, we purchase about 19,000,000 gallons per year. Some of this is common areas including pool, clubhouse, and laundries. Everyone can contribute by helping to identify water leaks, running toilets, leaking taps and avoid using potable/drinking water for outdoor landscaping. Each of us can help by conducting a review of your water usage and verify there are no leaks.



I would like to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a very Happy/healthy New Year!



Sellers still doing well in 2023

uyers and sellers have seen a seesaw effect between 2022 when it was a hot seller's market and 2023 which has been a buyer's market.

Americana Cove is no exception, however, there's an upside. Although being in the more restrictive 55+ market versus the all-inclusive all age market, sellers have still done well. In a review of 27 non-waterfront homes that have sold in the past eight months, sellers have seen an increase in the value of their homes ranging between 13 to 55 percent, depending on the number of years the home has been held. The average annualized rate of return was 18 percent. According to Forbes, the average annual return for residential properties in the US is 10.6%.

Everyone knows that waterfront property holds its value, even in a buyer's market. Again, sellers in Americana Cove have done well this year. In reviewing 9 waterfront properties that have sold in 2023, the annualized rate of return ranges from 14 to 57 percent depending on the years the home was held. The average annualized rate was 30%.

"Sellers have done well in Americana Cove even in a soft market like 2023," explained Broker Marty Pozgay. "It's not difficult to understand why waterfront property typically sells quickly when analyzing the return rates."

Even with sellers having to wait several months to sell their properties, they are still receiving a strong rate of return.
