VETERAN'S CORNER

This Friday's renaming of FT Gordon to Fort Eisenhower marks the final such installation-level move for the Army, culminating a nearly three-year process that began when Congress' fiscal 2021 defense policy bill established the bipartisan



Naming Commission to rename the military's places and objects that honored Confederates. Four members of the commission attended the final redesignation at Eisenhower.

I personally never agreed with making these changes and felt it was a waste of money and erasing history just to please a very divided country! Confederate army during the Civil War, former slaveowner John Brown Gordon survived to become the **head of the Klu Klux Klan** in Georgia. As a member of the U.S. Senate, Gordon helped negotiate the end of Reconstruction in 1877, which rehabilitated the white Southern elite and allowed a new era of racial oppression to emerge. A two-term governor of Georgia, Gordon was also the first commander of the United Confederate Veterans.

But as I stated above in a Friday morning ceremony just outside of Augusta, the Army eschewed Gordon's legacy in favor of that of Dwight D. Eisenhower, the post's new namesake. Eisenhower helped lead the destruction of Nazi Germany as a five-star general in World War II, and oversaw key racial integration milestones later as president. In 1957, Eisenhower deployed the 101st Airborne Division to Arkansas and federalized the state's National Guard when the governor attempted to block nine Black students from attending Little Rock Central High School.

Army Secretary Christine Wormuth spoke of Eisenhower's achievements in a speech accompanying the ceremony, which members of the former president's family attended. The vice chair of the commission, retired Army Brig. Gen. Ty Seidule, voiced a similar sentiment in a Wednesday phone interview. "It's never too late to recognize true American heroes...that represent the values of this great country," he said.

The following Army installations received new names this year:

- <u>Fort Barfoot, Virginia</u>, once Fort Pickett, was renamed after Col. Van T. Barfoot on March 24. He received the Medal of Honor during World War II for his actions as a noncommissioned officer in Italy in 1944.
- <u>Fort Novosel, Alabama</u>, once Fort Rucker, was renamed on April 10 for Chief Warrant Officer Michael Novosel, who fought in three wars and received the Medal of Honor for a Vietnam War medical evacuation mission.
- <u>Fort Gregg-Adams, Virginia</u>, once Fort Lee, was rechristened April 27 for Lt. Gen. Arthur Gregg, the Army's first Black lieutenant general, and Lt. Col. Charity Adams, who commanded the all-Black female 6888th Postal Battalion during World War II
- <u>Fort Cavazos, Texas</u>, once Fort Hood, was redesignated for infantry Gen. Richard Cavazos, the service's first Latino four-star, on May 9. Cavazos, who led soldiers in both Korea and Vietnam, twice received the Distinguished Service Cross.
- Fort Bragg, North Carolina, became **Fort Liberty** on June 2.
- Fort Polk, Louisiana, transitioned to <u>Fort Johnson</u> on June 13. Nearly a century after his exploits, Sgt. William Henry Johnson of the World War I "Harlem Hell fighters," received the Medal of Honor in 2015.
- Fort A.P. Hill, Virginia, transitioned to <u>Fort Walker</u>, named for Civil War surgeon and Medal of Honor recipient Mary Edwards Walker, August 25.
- Camp Beauregard, Louisiana, <u>was renamed</u> Louisiana National Guard Training Center-Pineville on Oct. 20.

- LHOA is a Florida registered corporation, files taxes and maintains that status each year. One of the few rental HOA's in the county that have kept their incorporation for almost 30 years.
- > LHOA is a member of the FMO (Federation of Manufactured Homeowners of Florida.)
 - ✓ The FMO is our only lobbying group looking out for resident/owners of all types of rental manufactured homes in the Florida Legislature.

es, it is time for decision-making concerning Medicare coverage if you are in Medicare or becoming eligible in 2024. We know that by the amount of TV ads on Medicare Advantage Plans or Medi Gap plans, mailings, and presentation invitations. Plus, representatives from a national Medicare Advantage company information are available during Wednesday Coffee Meetings in the Rec. Center once a month.

This month is part on whether you need or want to decide on what type of Medicare coverage you want, either a change or a continuation. Part 2 in January will include tips on how to navigate in making a successful change. Still have time if you have prepared. I did say "prepared." Sharing what I learned from 25 years as a nurse in a National Medicare Advantage plan.

Decisions can be easy like:

-Continuing to use original Medicare as either your sole medical coverage or in conjunction with a purchased Medi-Gap plan you wish to continue,

-Or a Medicare plan we received when we retired as part of a pension and no desire to change.

-And continuing our present Medicare Advantage plan each year as we are satisfied with the benefits provided. Especially if we like our primary physician. May have to find a new one plus specialty care changes including how the pharmacy benefit works.

- However, deciding to convert our regular Medicare medical and pharmacy Part D plan to a Medicare Advantage Plan takes preparation and thought. Including changing from one Medicare Advantage Plan to a different Medicare Advantage company. Changing to a different plan within the same insurance company may just take a calling the plan's member services (still be prepared and given the change thought.)
- Not all Medicare Advantage Plans work the same way, or have the same medical, dental, pharmacy and vision benefits.
 - ✓ Basic medical care is standard and mandatory in all plans. Benefit levels are available for adjustments in accordance with any chronic health conditions or if you are Medicaid eligible (income is a major factor for being eligible for Medicaid either in Florida or your home state.) It is the additional benefits that can be quite different.
 - ✓ Significant variations also result from our long-going health issues, which if properly documented can offer deeper benefits and even a reduction in our Medicare Part B monthly payments (not guaranteed until accepted by Medicare and Social Security.) Makes sense that the more health issues we have, the greater reimbursement the Medicare Advantage plan receives thus providing an ability to provide greater depth in benefit support.

> Here are important tips and the associated pitfalls in preparing.

 \checkmark If you are satisfied with your current Primary Care Physician, Specialists and Hospitals

where where

then it is more a question of seeking better benefits for you. Ask them which Medicare Adv. plans they also accept, prefer for YOU and why. Will give you a concise list of what over plans you may want. **Pitfall**: you may not be able to see them if you change. Or often specialists too. Without paying out of pocket.

- ✓ My neighbor or friend likes this insurance plan. Pitfall: your medical needs and wants may be quite different.
- ✓ Obtain a printout of all your medications from the pharmacy or others if used. Essential to compare with the proposed plan's Part D. formulary (list of what they cover and the co-pay if any.) And if not, will the switch or ability to still obtain the same medication require an authorization to continue with your present medication, especially if it is a top tier Brand medication.

Next month more hints and pitfalls of changing plans. Enjoy the Holidays!
