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





Let's Get to Know Florida Statute 723

by David MacAskill



: Our Board of Directors of our HOA are aware that we must permit Members to attend all meetings and must allow Members to speak with reference to all agenda items. We have placed the Member comment section at the end of the agenda just before adjournment, and we permit

Members to comment on all agenda items. Are we doing this right?

A: Based upon the information you provided, your HOA appears to be in full compliance with Section 723.078(2)(c)4., FS. The statute does not dictate when Member comment must occur. Most HOA Boards place the Member Comment agenda item at either the beginning or end of the meeting. There are pros and cons to each. When placed at the beginning of the meeting, Members often complain that they do not know what to comment on because items have yet to have been discussed by the Board. Members also tend to complain that they feel left out of the decision-making when Members Comment agenda item is placed at the end of the meeting and all of the decisions have already been made. Allowing Member Comment throughout the meetings on all agenda items is disruptive, as you already experienced, and tends to unreasonably extend the meeting. Best practice tends to be the placement of Member Comment at the end of the meeting just before adjournment, with the Board determining on a case by-case basis when it is appropriate to allow Member Comment earlier in the meeting on a specific agenda item

Have each interested party send a text from their cell phone to (727) 304-4552 with the following message (as indicated) in the body of the text: **Join EBO Res**

Resident will then get a reply asking them to respond with their name and lot number, and once done, the registration is complete.

Parking Rules

Parking at the clubhouses and mailboxes continues to be an issue. All day parking in front of the mailboxes and at the clubhouses is prohibited and you may be subject to towing without warning. Reminder on Trash Policies


oing forward, the dump will be open 8-3 on Tues and Friday, and 8-11 on Saturday. We are going to try this to see if we can keep the illegal dumping under control but still giving you all access. A reminder/the rule, if it wont fit in a large size trash can, it does not belong



in the dump area. No furniture, chemicals of any kind, propane tanks, paint, electronics, construction debris, grills, etc...ever. The compactor is for your regular bagged up household trash, the big dumpster is for yard waste and the blue container is for recyclables. ANYTHING ELSE IS THE RESIDENTS RESPONSIBILITY TO HAVE HAULED OFF THE PROPERTY

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
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because Valet Living won't pick it up either. If you are caught dumping anything else, that is actually a crime, you will be fined by the county, get a violation letter from us, and we will close the area back up. (we don't want that)

Beginning 8/22, the maintenance staff will no longer be going around to pick up trash or yard waste. Valet Living will still pick up your trash, but all of the same policies above apply pertaining to what is allowed in the dump area and what they will and won't pick up. Everything bagged in trash bags and boxes broken down should be it. It doesn't make sense to have them go back and do the same thing we already pay a vendor for and use up man hours when there are so many other things that need attention on the property. This does include yard waste, you will have to take that to the dumpster because Valet Living does not pick that up. I have faith that this will be a smooth transition, if you have any questions, please call us at (727) 531-9105. Thank you.

Boxes MUST be broken down and put into the Recycling container. • No bags whatsoever should be placed in the roll off container. This container is for unbagged yard waste, and other household trash. If you have bagged yard waste, you can put it into the compactor or open the bag and dump the contents into the roll off. • The roll off container is not for bulky furniture or construction material...if it doesn't fit into an outside type of garbage can, it does not belong in the dump area. Just as the park is not responsible for you getting to work on time, paying your cell phone bill, or getting your oil changed, we must follow Pinellas County Solid Waste Ordinances and are not responsible for taking your old mattresses, tires, appliances, TVs, large bulky furniture, paint, batteries, solvents, construction debris, etc. Again, the roll off and compactor is for "household" trash only. Therefore, you will need to arrange to have prohibited items hauled away or you can take it to the landfill which we believe costs approximately \$11 for a load. The Pinellas County Solid Waste landfill is located at 3095 114th Ave. N., St. Petersburg, FL 33716, about 10 miles away. Their phone number is 727-464-7500. There are several junk removal companies, and we know of one junk hauler, Tampa Bay Junk Pros, who may be offering \$50 off for junk/furniture/appliance removal. Their number is 727-404-5100. • Do not fill the roll off container past the fill line, otherwise it will not be emptied resulting in having to lockdown the dumpster area which is inconvenient for all. If it is full, you may place your items to the side of the container so maintenance can put it in for you once the container is emptied.

MANAGER'S CORNER – December 2023



The Environmental Inspector with the City of Largo would like to ensure that all residents are made aware that just a small amount of household waste flushed down the toilet (or dumped down the drain or garbage disposal) can clog pipes and cause expensive and messy sewer backups in your home and community. You can avoid sewer backups by keeping the following

items out of your toilet: Wipes (even if they say they are flushable) dental floss, kitty litter, condoms & condom wrappers, hair, food & scraps, paper towels, cleaning wipes, bandages, tampons, maxi pads and their wrappers, cotton swabs & makeup pads. Improper disposal of Fats, Oils & Grease (FOG) is also a major cause of sewer backups in our community. Pouring FOG down your drain may cause costly backups in the sewer system and your home. Dry wipe dishes and cookware with a paper towel before washing them and dispose of FOG in the trash. Remember, a toilet is not a trash can!



We want to ensure that all residents are aware that guests may not bring their pets on property. Only pets registered with the office, showing that shots are current, are allowed in the park. Again, no visiting of pets or pet sitting of unregistered pets is permitted. Additionally, we are requesting that doggie bags of waste be placed in the receptacles at the doggie stations

rather than at the mailboxes or entry to clubhouse/pool areas as the odor can be overwhelming at times. We will be installing additional doggie stations for your convenience.

Welcome Back Snowbirds! Just a friendly reminder that as you celebrate the warm

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Florida weather, it's important to keep in mind that your park is home to year-round residents as well...many of whom still work. Please be considerate of your neighbors as you go into the evening hours. As the community becomes more active with the return of some residents, it's tempting to socialize into the wee hours of the morning. Further, it's important to adhere to the rules posted at the pool regarding food and alcoholic beverages. This comes from the FL Department

of Health and any resident who sees abuses can call to have the pool shut down. You do not want to be the person responsible for that happening, so please keep yourself in check.



As discussed in last month's newsletter, all day parking in front of the mailboxes and at the clubhouse is prohibited and you may be subject to towing without warning. Clubhouse parking is for residents and guests during the hours of 9AM-10PM. Overflow parking at the clubhouse is between the

hours of 10PM-9AM. Special resident passes, red in color, are available in the office and this new parking scheme will become effective December 1st. This is a reminder that the towing company will be increasing their presence on the property and will be towing all cars at the clubhouse if they do not display either a red or yellow temporary parking pass. If you need to register one of your vehicles for evening overflow parking at the clubhouse, please stop in the office.


