erry December! Did everyone get their letter from Teakwood? It has very important info, so be sure to read it. If you did not receive the letter let the main office know and we will get one out to you.

Now I don't want to do the finger shaking thing, but I don't see any other choice. This is about water. More specifically, lake water. Lake water is also known as non-potable water for outside use. This water is to be used for lawn watering, home cleaning, automobile cleaning and driveway cleaning. It is against the rules for Teakwood Village residents to use city water for anything outside the home (see page 6 of the Prospectus, item B: Irrigation water). It states: *"Irrigation*"











water is supplied from lake water via pumps installed in the lake. The irrigation water is not intended for human consumption. The Park Owner does not guarantee that irrigation water will be available upon any schedule or upon demand. The cost of providing irrigation water is included in the lot rental amount. <u>City water is not to be used for watering lawns, washing cars, or for anything other than use within the mobile home</u>. Make sure that you are not using the city water (aka fresh water or potable water) for outside the home uses.

I'm going to wish you all a wonderful December and remind you to use the water correctly. We will see you in the new year.


HOLIDAY DINNER DANCE – CHANGE OF DATE

Pineapple Glazed Ham

1 8-lb smoked half bone- in spiral- cut ham 1 1/2 cups pineapple juice 3/4 cups packed light brown sugar 1/2 cup apple cider vinegar 1 tbs Dijon mustard 1 tbs hot sauce 1/4 tsp ground allspice 1(20-oz) can pineapple slices drained Maraschino cherries

Preheat oven 325. Wrap ham in aluminum

foil, fat side up. Set ham on a rack in a large roasting pan with about 1/4 cup of water. Bake ham until internal temperature reaches 120 about 1 hr 20 minutes.

Make the glaze in a small saucepan. Bring pineapple juice, brown sugar, vinegar, mustard, hot sauce, and allspice to a boil. Reduce heat to medium high and simmer until thick enough to coat a spoon about 15 minutes. Remove from direct heat and set aside on top of the stove to keep warm.
