The Westwind II ROC Annual meeting will be held *February 13th, 2024*. On the even years, there are four positions up for election and on the odd years there are three positions to fill on the board of directors. The position is held for two years. At the end of the two-year term, the director may choose to run again for another two-year term. Any shareholder in good standing is eligible to run for the board. The board consists of seven directors. The newly elected directors then elect the position of secretary and treasurer for a term of one year at the organizational meeting immediately following the annual meeting. Any shareholder in good standing can run for election to the board. All newly elected board members must complete the State of Florida training and be willing to dedicate the time necessary to successfully run our community. The letter of intent will be included in your initial mailing regarding the annual meeting. It must be returned to the office no later than *December 29th, 2023*.

June longs to know more about their topsecret assignment and begins an affair with Sam Cantor, the young Jewish physicist from New York who oversees the lab where she works and understands the end goal only too well, while her beautiful roommate, Cici, is on her own mission: to find a wealthy husband and escape her sharecropper roots.

Across town, African American construction worker, Joe Brewer, knows nothing of the government's plans, only that his new job pays enough to make it worth leaving his beloved family back home in Alabama, at least for now. But a breach in security will intertwine his fate with June's search for answers.

When the bombing of Hiroshima brings the truth about Oak Ridge into devastating focus, June must confront her ideals about loyalty, patriotism, and war itself.


