I thought I'd reflect on the past year to take



note of what has happened here at Clearwater Cascade. In addition to the many social events that we shared, there has been a good amount of work both by the Board and by the many volunteers that contribute to our successes.

Here are some of the major things that were accomplished in 2023.

- Made an additional mortgage payment of \$121,425 in March. This continued process will result in paying off our mortgage in 2027.
- Combined/consolidated some small bank accounts, reducing the number of extraneous accounts.
- Continued to update/revise our Park's Rules and Regulations and along with our Procedures too.
- Replaced the roof on the office/library/workout room.
- Purchased new tables for the library cards area and blinds for the windows,
- Major Pool repairs: leaks; cooling & heating compressor units. Also hired Pool Works for spring 2024 major pool repair (collector tank replacement).
- Spa refresh/update.
- Cleared Tabacco Road and areas along the chain link fence behind Esplanade.
- Replaced air conditioning units in the library workout area & file room/kitchen.
- Hired an engineering firm for initial consultation on the Cross Bayou.
- Replaced fire alarm system & electronics connected to that system.
- Replaced the maintenance shed roof.
- Repaired the Shuffleboard Courts.
- Replaced all parking wheel stops and restriped the common parking areas including the mailrooms/laundries.
- Replacing Alexander's Lawn Service in 2024.

There are always challenges that we face and 2023 was no different. We rely on all of our residents in many different ways to contribute to making our community such a wonderful place to live and enjoy life. I want to personally thank all our Board Members, Committee Chairs, Committees and anyone who volunteered to help make 2023 a great year.

#### Additional Proxy Item to vote on...

he standard two proxy items voted upon at the annual meeting are in regard to the use of Reserve Funds in the event of catastrophic disaster and the adoption of the 2024/2025 budget.

In addition to our two standard proxy items, you will also receive and be voting on a third item. In our governing documents and rules & regulations, new residents buying into the park (either new or existing home) must meet age and financial requirements. The age is 55 for at least one of a couple. The financial requirements state that the individual(s) must show income of \$2,500/ month and a credit score of 700.

However, currently if an individual(s) (son, daughter, niece, cousin, etc.) is on the share but doesn't live in the park and they inherit the share & house they do not have to meet any of our qualifications to live here. This amendment fixes this so that they do have to qualify.

Additionally, this amendment states that:

no person may occupy or otherwise be present within a Unit if such person has been convicted of, pled no contest to or has been released from incarceration, probation or community control for:

- \* A capital, first or second-degree felony involving violence to another person within the past 10 years, or;
- \* A first- or second-degree felony involving illegal drugs within the past 10 years, or;
- \* Any drug offence involving the making and/or distribution of illegal drugs, or;
- \* A felony conviction for sexual battery, sexual abuse or lewd & lascivious behavior, or;
- \* Has been labeled as a sexual offender or predator, or;
- \* Is currently on probation or community control for a felony involving violence to another person or damage to or theft of property.

This amendment is to further provide protection for us and our park.

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
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
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everyone informed as we transition to this new platform.

- 6. <u>Emergency Contract</u> Remember to complete and return your Emergency Information Sheet to the office so we will know who to contact in an emergency.

<u>Feeding Wildlife</u> – It is a violation of the Rules and Regulations to feed wildlife, even ducks. This can be cause for a fine from the Park or in some cases (alligators), an arrest.

#### **New Water Restrictions.**

AMPA, FL — Residents of Pinellas County will be limited to watering their lawns once per week under new water regulations that went into effect Friday.

The restrictions, will remain in effect through July 1, 2024, except where stricter measures have been imposed by local governments, according to the agency.

Under the new once-per-week guidelines, residents of Pinellas County should only water their lawns at the following times.

If an address (house/lot number) ends in:

- 0 or 1: Water only on Monday.
- 2 or 3: Water only on Tuesday.
- 4 or 5: Water only on Wednesday.
- 6 or 7: Water only on Thursday.
- 8 or 9, or other locations without a discernible address: Water only on Friday.

Park. Following are some facts and figures to help keep things in order.

We have four types of social events, Social Club, Summer Socials, Community Activity Fundraising and Independent events.

#### Social Club

Our Social Club is an independent organization with their own tax rules and regulations and their own set of by-laws. This Social Club has been in existence for many, many years. When they began and up until very recently the Park consisted of primarily residents who were only here for the winter months. Consequently, the Social Activity was planned around those months only. The Social Club subsidizes their events by selling tickets and holding a "Share the Wealth" draw at each event. They are not responsible to the Board of Directors but they do present a financial statement to the members (and that's all Park residents) on a regular basis.

#### Summer Social

This is a group of volunteers who live in our Park all year round and found the lack of organized summer events disappointing. Rather than complain, they banded together and started presenting summer fun for all to attend. This group started with a small, donated kitty and they fund their events by hosting "Pot Luck" events and using the donation jar method. The money they earn is pumped right back into the events presented. They do present a financial statement to the CCHOA Board Treasurer at summer's end and any monies left over is deposited to our general fund until summer rolls around again and the money is used to fund the first events of the summer. This is NOT the Community Activities Committee.

#### **Community Activities Committee**

This committee has a huge job here at CCHOA. They are the volunteer support as well as the financial support for most of our sport leagues. They raise money for these activities and supplies by fundraising four times a year. The famous Fla-Ming Cha-Ching, the Carport Sale, and the Craft Fair and Bake Sale are all organized to raise funds. They do NOT financially support events offered by either the Social Club or the Summer Social ladies. All monies raised by this group is given to the Treasurer and any request for spending funds must be Board approved.

#### **Independent Events**

Sometimes an individual person or group like to offer an event. It could be the events offered by the Veterans' Group, or the Thanksgiving dinner or the Art Exhibit. We also have


memorial gatherings, anniversary parties, baby shower etc. While any volunteer from any of the above three groups may assist, these events are financially supported by the individual(s) hosting...NOT Social Club, or Summer Social or Community Activities.

These same volunteers help out where they are needed acting solely as residents not part of a committee. So sometimes you'll see Community Activities volunteers helping out the Summer Social events. Or the regular Summer Social gals or Social Club directors helping out at an individual event. In any case, we are grateful for any volunteers that come out to help.

#### CLEARWATER CASCADE HISTORY

had the pleasure of visiting with Janet and Billy Swengros just before they celebrated their anniversary.

They came to CWC in 2004 with a brand-new unit and they chose our park because it was resident owned. The following year, Bill was appointed to the board, along with four others, to replace board members that had resigned. There were disagreements about the running of the park and the recent election.

Illegal meetings had taken place and the ballot box was locked and under police surveillance.

Bill was out of town when he received a call that they needed to have an emergency meeting to replace the elected members. Two months later, the president resigned, moving the vice president up to president and Bill was made vice president. "It was a real mess," Billy told me continued on page 16

sadly. Residents were angry and it involved "pushing and shoving," in a physical sense.

As vice president, Bill looked into the park finances and realized that the people in the office were not handling the money efficiently. Improper records of HOA fees were kept and to top it off, the treasurer was charged with embezzlement!

It became evident that they needed an outside company to manage the park. He began to research management companies but could only find two in the area that would manage mobile home parks. One was Resource Management, so he and two others went to the Resource office and made a deal. No contract was signed, it was sealed with a handshake. Resource agreed to a 30-day trial basis. Either side could back out after 30 days with notice.

Resource brought in extra people to straighten out the "mess". They didn't fire any of the existing people such as park patrol and maintenance.

They installed Natalie Poland as CAM.

At one point, Resource almost backed out, but things were resolved and Resource is still our management company today.

Janet and Bill are an interesting couple with lots of stories to tell. If you get a chance, ask them about their experiences. You will be highly entertained.

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

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
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
