The Clubhouse and Pool area by those residents who have requested a FOB. The FOB's are issued to all registered residents in Phase I of the Briar Creek Community. This system is designed to provide secure access and limit access for our residents. There are crash bars installed on each of the doors of the clubhouse. The main entrance bars, facing Briar Creek Boulevard can be placed in an open position when major entertainment or social events are planned. This allows entry while the event is taking place and can be monitored by the event coordinators. After the event the doors should be returned to the locked position. Should someone forget to perform that action and you see the door is not secured, please use the "Hex Wrench" hanging in the door jam to release and secure the door. Small gatherings of residents, please for your safety do not leave the doors opened. Any stranger can access the clubhouse for less than proper use of the clubhouse and unfortunately your security cannot be safeguarded. It is not unusual for non-residents to enter looking for a "Sales Office" which is common in many mobile home communities.

The three gates to the Pool & Spa area also have the FOB system installed. For emergency and secure exit there are silver aluminum plates that are active 24/7 to provide an exit from the area. The FOB entry is active only during Pool & Spa hours to this area. We are aware that these emergency exits may be triggered from outside the fenced area. There is currently efforts in motion to provide a secure cover to prevent access from outside the fenced area, yet provide someone inside the Pool & Spa area to exit without the use of a FOB.

The clubhouse, kitchen and storage areas should be considered an extension of your home. For that reason, we need to remind you if you use the facility, please return it to the condition when you arrived. The kitchen if used should be cleaned up after your use. The supplies and equipment in the storage room should be returned to its original location. The shelves are clearly marked in the storage closet with tags to identify what is stored on the shelves. If you purchase paper product or supplies for an event, please keep them or dispose of them. Do not add them to the supplies we store in the storage closet. Equipment if used should be returned to where they were located initially. If you use the trash cans please empty them, especially if they contain perishable material. Please ensure the lids are securely placed on the cans to prevent animal intrusion. Replace the trash can liners, these are located in the janitorial closet

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by the water fountain in the hallway. The fenced area behind the shuffleboard shed is where all the trash cans are located. The refrigerator has some perishable condiments. Please wipe them off and return to their original place. Some supplies are in the refrigerator and stored for use by various groups. Please do not use those supplies. Paper goods and supplies are maintained in the storage room and janitorial closet. If you use those supplies and see they are getting low please contact Gene Arend so they can be replaced. There is also a supply request form hanging on the cabinet above the kitchen sink. This is available for you to make note of supplies needed, which include cleaning supplies or other items. Please allow at least 5 business days for replacement.

POOL AND SPA

In a 55+ community, it may seem strange to be mentioning the industry standards regarding children in the spa/hot tub. Here is the deal. The temperature in the spa is regulated for adults at 104 degrees. The American Academy of Pediatrics, and other organizations, are very firm about kids under 12 in hot tubs. Our temperature is too hot for children. Children are unable to immerse their young bodies and not become overheated, in the same temperature as adults. It is unsafe, unless we lower the temperature to under 100 degrees, for kids. Not going to do that. Briar Creek Residents rely on the therapeutic aspects of the spa. By the time this is published, the jets should be working. The temperature is 104.

Please understand, I am not attempting to tell anyone "how to raise their kids or grand kids." Adult supervision of children is required at the pool and spa. In addition to the Pediatric experts, Florida law also prohibits anyone under the age of 12 in 104 degrees spa water. If the Department of Health inspector made a random visit and saw a kid in the spa – we could be shut down. No one wants that to happen.

The pool area is an oasis in the paradise of Briar Creek. We are vigilant about maintaining the cleanliness, water temperature and atmosphere of the pool so everyone can enjoy swimming or sunning. All residents have access to the pool and clubhouse with their FOB. Guests, who gain entry with a resident's FOB, are expected to comply with all Pool and Spa Rules which are posted.

Do not assume that someone will be there and open the door or gate – this defeats the purpose of issuing FOBS for security.

- Relock any doors you dogged in the open position
- · Turn off lights
- Turn off any fans you used also fans on back deck by the pool
- Return any items you used from the kitchen and, if needed, empty the trash

Tt's hard to believe that 2023 is in the past and we are already into February. Where is the time going and what's in store for 2024?

January was a busy month with planning and going forth with important clubhouse initiatives. First, after receiving valuable resident feedback on our possible bathroom designs, the overwhelming majority believe we should move forward with separate Mens' and Womens' bathrooms designed for handicap access. We will also work to include a family access component via locking doors and signage. We hope to begin renovation work later this spring.

Second, our main entry front doors and pool exit double doors as well as the entry door to the exercise room have deteriorated to the point where they can no longer be repaired. The existing doors are original to the construction of the buildings and have far surpassed their life expectancy. They have become a structural liability that needs to be addressed. Contractors have been contacted and we are in the process of getting replacement costs.

Our exercise room now has excellent equipment including a new treadmill and recumbent stationary bicycle for resident use. There now is an excellent selection of exercise equipment available for use and we are also hoping someone will donate a flat screen, smart tv to be installed to make your exercise experience more enjoyable. After the bazaar, we hope to refresh and brighten the room with paint and replace the worn out carpet.

Monies to cover these costs will come from our reserve budget and will not impact our monthly maintenance fee. We will keep you updated as we move forward.

s of this bugle, the RV Parking Area has been reconfigured and I truly appreciate those that moved spot to help make the reconfiguration a success. Also as of this Bugle, the RV Parking Area is full and cannot accommodate any more units. If you have a unit in the RV Parking Area, please make sure that it is registered and that I have a copy of a valid registration. This needs to be completed every time that you register your unit. To date 95% of those parked in the parking area have complied and submitted a copy of their registration. Remember, both boats and trailers must be registered, and I must have a valid copy for each unit. As always, we highly recommend that you have insurance on your unit as we are not responsible for anything that may occur while parked in the RV Lot. Your cooperation continues to be greatly appreciated.

This is a reminder for all those who have a space in the RV Parking Area. You are responsible for maintaining the area of your space where the lawn company does not maintain. Please keep it trimmed and free of trash and foreign objects. Again, your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Lastly, all of you who have a space in the RV Parking Area will be receiving a copy of the new, updated Application Agreement for you to review and sign. This will be attached to the original Application Agreement that you filled out when you originally got your space in the RV Parking Area. The updated Application Agreement will be delivered to your "ROCK BOX" in the next few weeks. I asked that you return the original Application Agreement to my "ROCK BOX" located at 48 Birch Creek Drive or to the main office in the clubhouse. If you require a copy of the signed Application Agreement, please let me know and a copy will be delivered to your "ROCK BOX".

If you have any questions concerning the RV Parking Area or your responsibility for its use, you can refer to "RESTRICTION #7" or I would be more than happy to answer your question(s).

As the days get a little longer and the weather gets a little warmer you might be ready to start that project you've been thinking about. If you are considering a "Do It Yourself" project please make safety your first priority. Know your limitations. If you've just had a knee replacement please don't climb a ladder and for goodness sake stay off of the roof if you suffer from vertigo. Use caution when lifting and be especially careful when using power tools. Don't forget to protect your eyes and ears when necessary and call (811) before you dig.

Keep in mind that all outside alterations require board approval before work begins. Alteration request forms can be found just outside of the office door in the library area of the clubhouse. Completed forms can be left in the office door mail slot or in my "rock box" at 193 Clubview Drive.

ome Inspections As you know, our Condominium Articles of Incorporation as well as our Bylaws Land Restrictions require that we all maintain the exterior of our home and land in "good, clean, healthy and attractive condition at all time" In mid-January, we will begin the annual home inspection process to review each home for needed outside maintenance. After those inspections are completed, homeowners will receive an evaluation of the condition of their home and if there are problem areas, given time to take corrective action.

Recently, in anticipation of this annual inspection, every home was quickly evaluated from the road to determine what trends we are seeing that will need to be addressed. Many homeowners have worked hard to ensure their homes are meeting their maintenance requirements. For those that are not, below is a list of the primary areas we saw that you can start to work on now. Check the list and if you find it pertains to you, why not start to tidy up now before the formal inspections begin. Wouldn't it be great to get a nice home evaluation?

- 1. Homes, including carports, mailbox and planter bricks that are dirty and moldy need pressure washing - schedule a cleaning soon. (Note: Be mindful of recently issued Water Use Restrictions.)
- 2. Gutter gardens are not good remove weeds and other growth

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WATER/SEWER CONSERVATION PROGRAM

Bill Russo

FOR BRIAR CREEK II

The Phase II voluntary water pressure testing program overseen by Bill Russo that we previously announced to help control costs by detecting water leakage is now up and running. Locating home water leakage is a very important issue to consider and we should be actively working towards monitoring to help lower our monthly expenditures.

We have set up four teams of partners each with one female and male. Each team has been assigned an area of Phase II that will will be reaching out to residents offering a free water leakage test. The test is totally optional and there is no requirement for residents to participate in this program if they chose not to. The program works like this The testing will be performed outside your home only.

We will need to turn off your outside main "water shut off valve" for 10-15 minutes to perform the test.

A written Inspection Sheet will be left in your rock box informing you of the results of the test. Because this test detects leaks within the home, it is the homeowner's responsibility to take corrective action to repair the leak.

This water/sewer conservation program, again, while voluntary, should benefit us all and, hopefully, cut down on our water/sewer costs. If one person's leak can cost everyone in our community money, think what ten home leaks could cost.

Help us to help you save your money. Thank you for your help and cooperation with this conservation program.

Hard Bounced Email Definition

A hard bounced email is an email message that gets rejected by a mail server. When an email bounces, it has for some reason did not reach the intended destination. A hard bounce means that the email address is permanently unavailable.

One thing that can cause a hard bounce is a full mailbox. If you have hard bounced, your email address will not work for us. To send emails to you we can do 1 of 2 things.

- 1. We would need a new email address to get you back on thebc2connections.
- 2. you can open a Gmail account (other systems may do the same thing I'm just more familiar with Gmail) and set up a forwarding system. We would have the Gmail address and you would have set it up to forward to your present email address. We have done this with a few of our residents and it seems to be working fine.

But I like to think everyday is a holiday and greet each day with Happy New Day. Let's face it, as we are in our senior years the time clock is ticking faster. As a friend of mine use to say to me, If not now then when?
